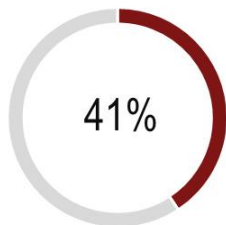

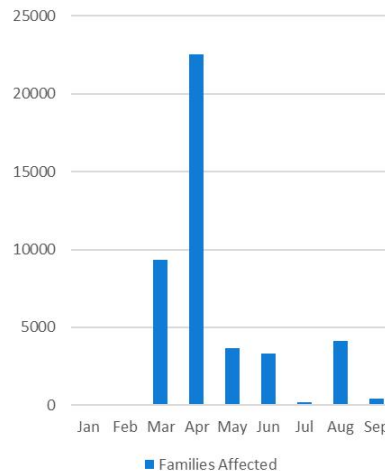

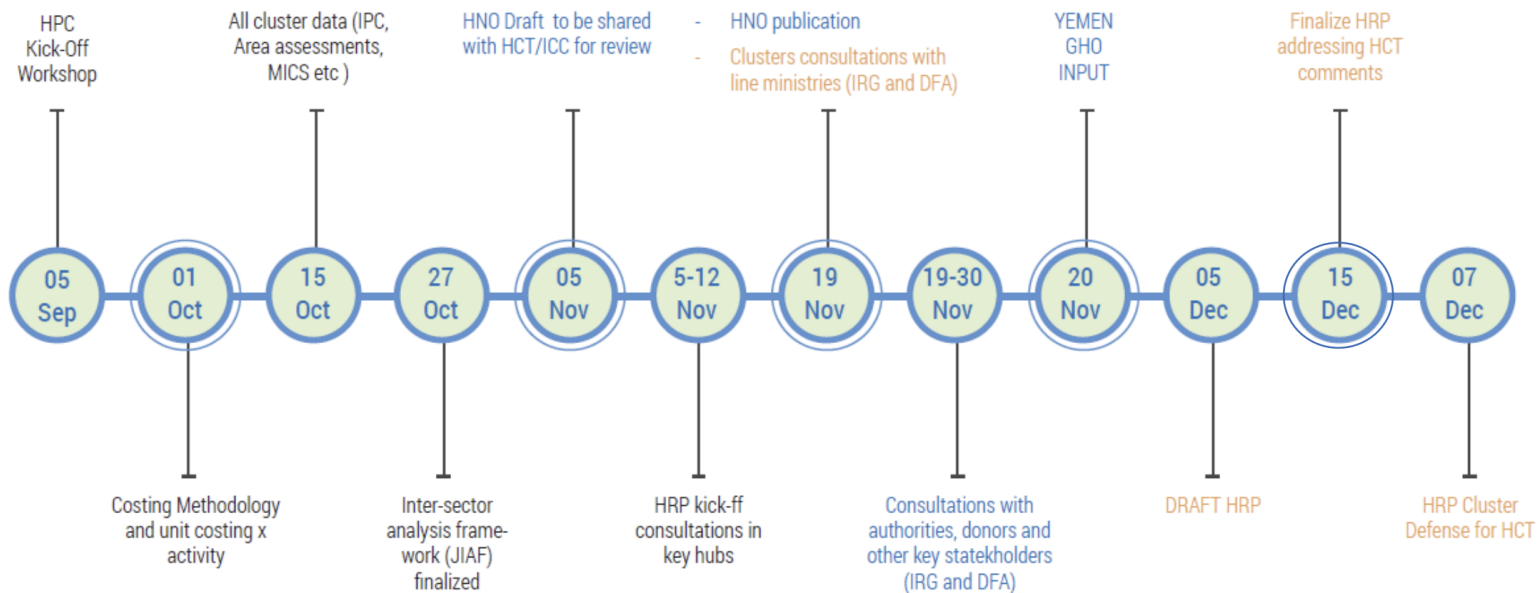

Type of Assistance

- 1. Immediate shelter assistance before winter season:** a) replacement of damaged shelters where necessary, b) provision of materials, tools, and support to repair or upgrade existing shelters in dire condition to assure minimum insulation standards c) provision of emergency shelter kits to those living in the open.
- 2. Winterization assistance package (Equiv. of \$100 in Yemeni Riyal):** The modality of implementation should be informed by an assessment of local markets (in-kind vs. cash).
 - a) A high thermal blanket per individual in the family. If the assistance is in cash, the transfer value is \$50 for an average of 7 blankets. The cost of one blanket is about \$7.
 - b) Assorted winter clothing per family. If the assistance is in cash, the transfer value is \$50 for an average family of 7 members.

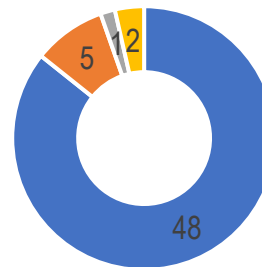

- **Shelter TWiG:**
 - Currently working on Transitional shelter.

 - **Cash for rent guideline is in the shelter cluster website (Arabic & English).**
- **Piloting flood prevention assessment in 8 sites:**
 - 2 sites in Sana'a
 - 2 sites in Hajjah
 - 1 site in Ibb
 - 1 site in Taiz
 - 2 Sites in Aljouf (Visit is planned)

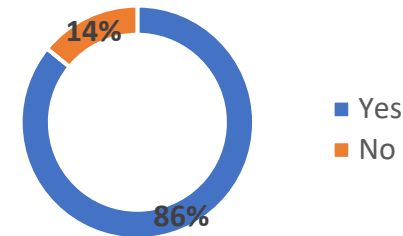

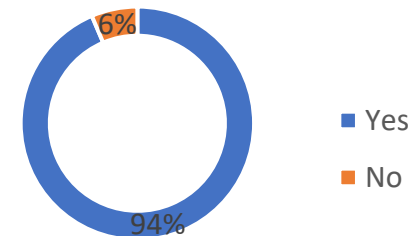
Does your organization have a policy for Accountability to Affected Populations?

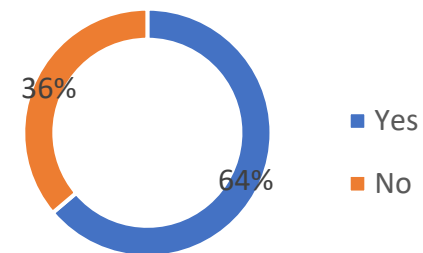
Is the policy been implemented?

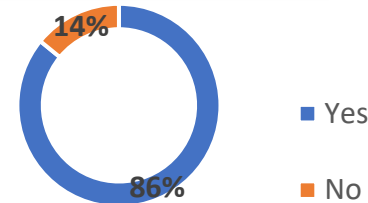
Are all the staff in your organization trained in this policy?

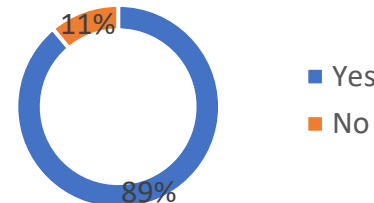
Does your organization have a policy for Accountability to Affected Populations?

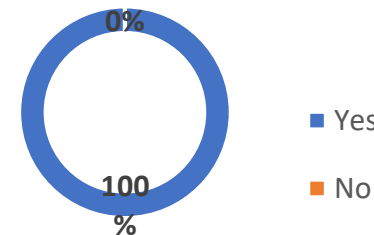
Are you planning to develop a policy?

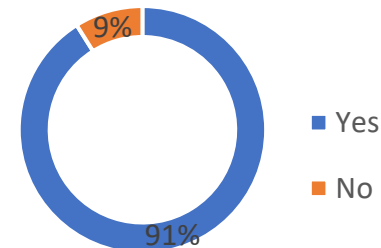
Do you need help from the Shelter Cluster in developing a policy?

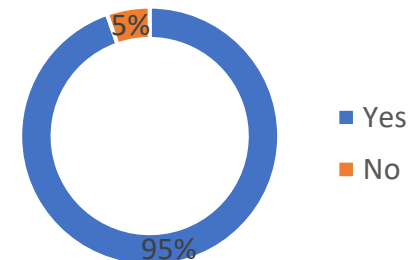
Does your organization have a Compliant and Feedback Mechanism (CFM)?
