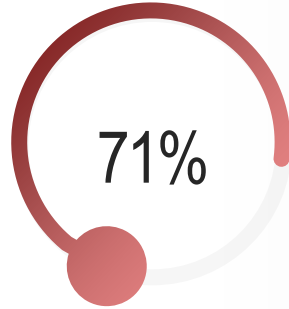

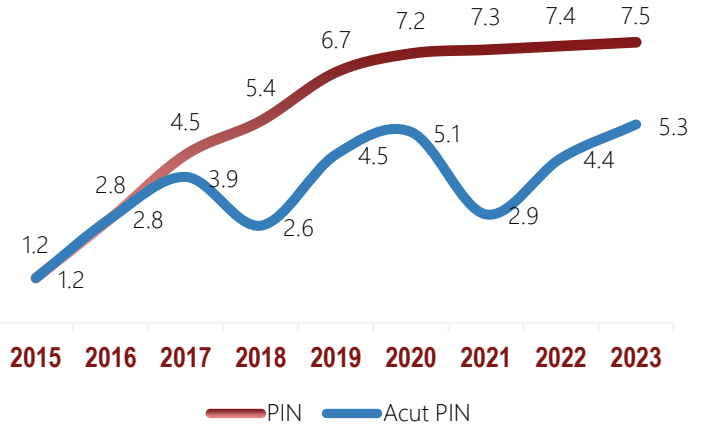

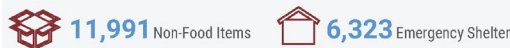

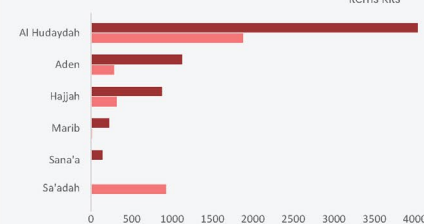
KEY FIGURES (JANUARY - September 2022)



In-pipeline Stocks

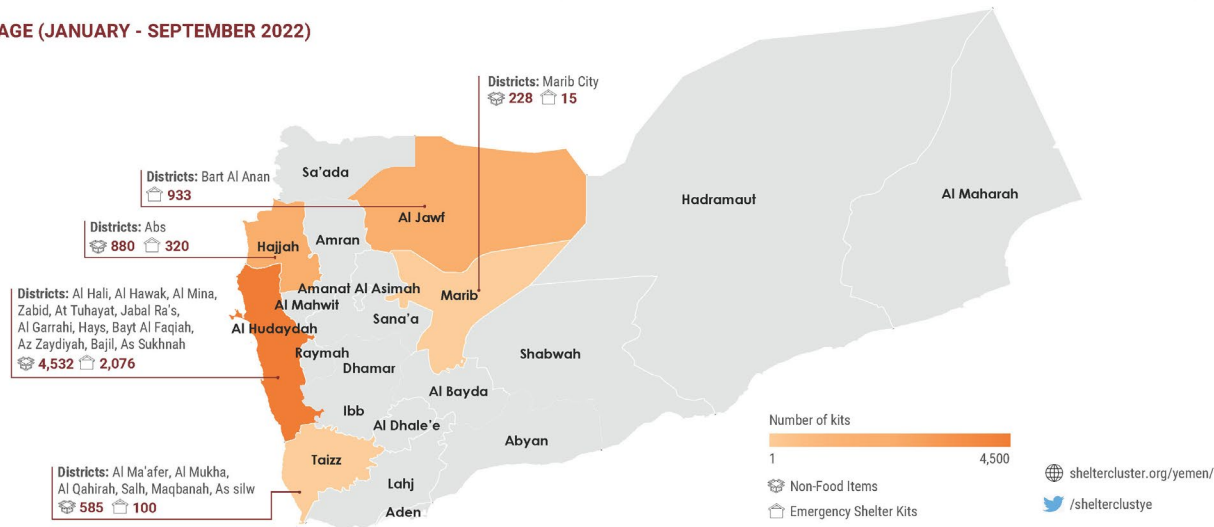


STOCKS DISPATCHED PER HUB

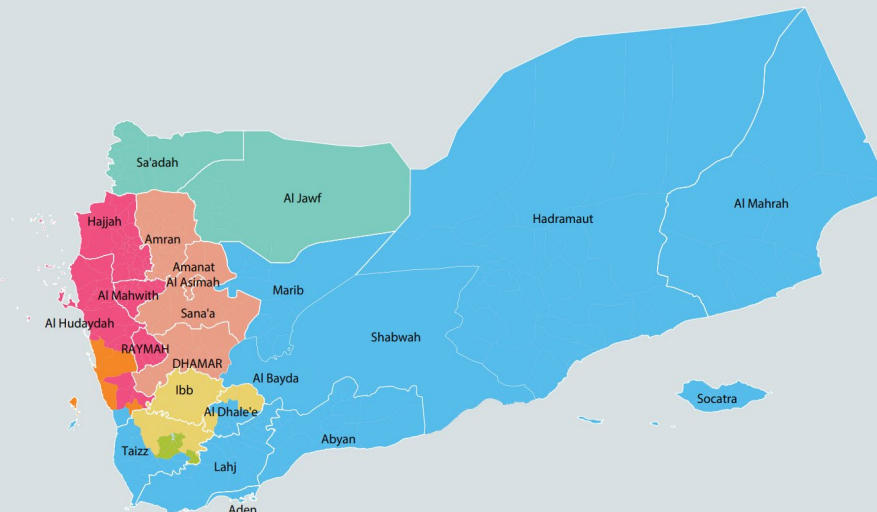
