Red Cross Red Crescent Societies *in Haiti...*

- **14 National Societies** supporting Haitian Red Cross in Recovery Operation through direct implementation
- **5 NS** supporting Haitian Red Cross prior to the Earthquake
- **124 NS contributed** cash, in-kind, or people to the earthquake relief and recovery operation.
- The reported total **income** of the Red Cross Red Crescent is **\$1.14 billion CHF** as of 31 March 2011.
- Total combined **expenditure** reported as of 31 March 2011 is **CHF 448.9 million**, or 39% of the total income.
- **Majority of remaining funds are allocated** following strategic plans to specific programme areas in the coming years.



Haiti by the numbers: The Red Cross Red Crescent Societies response

**All figures, except shelter solutions, are drawn from the 'Federation-wide' report for Haiti as of May 31, 2011*

- **179,645 households** provided with a **Emergency Shelter solution**
- **59 509 households** provided with a **Emergency Shelter Replacement**
- **18,968 households** provided with a **Safe and Improved Shelter solution**
- **55,939 households** that have received **livelihood support grants, loans or other forms of financial support**
- **538,555 people** reached by **community-based health services**
- **189,587 households** provided with a **hygiene kit, at least 1 time**
- **28,704 households** covered by **pre-positioned non-food relief stock for Haiti**

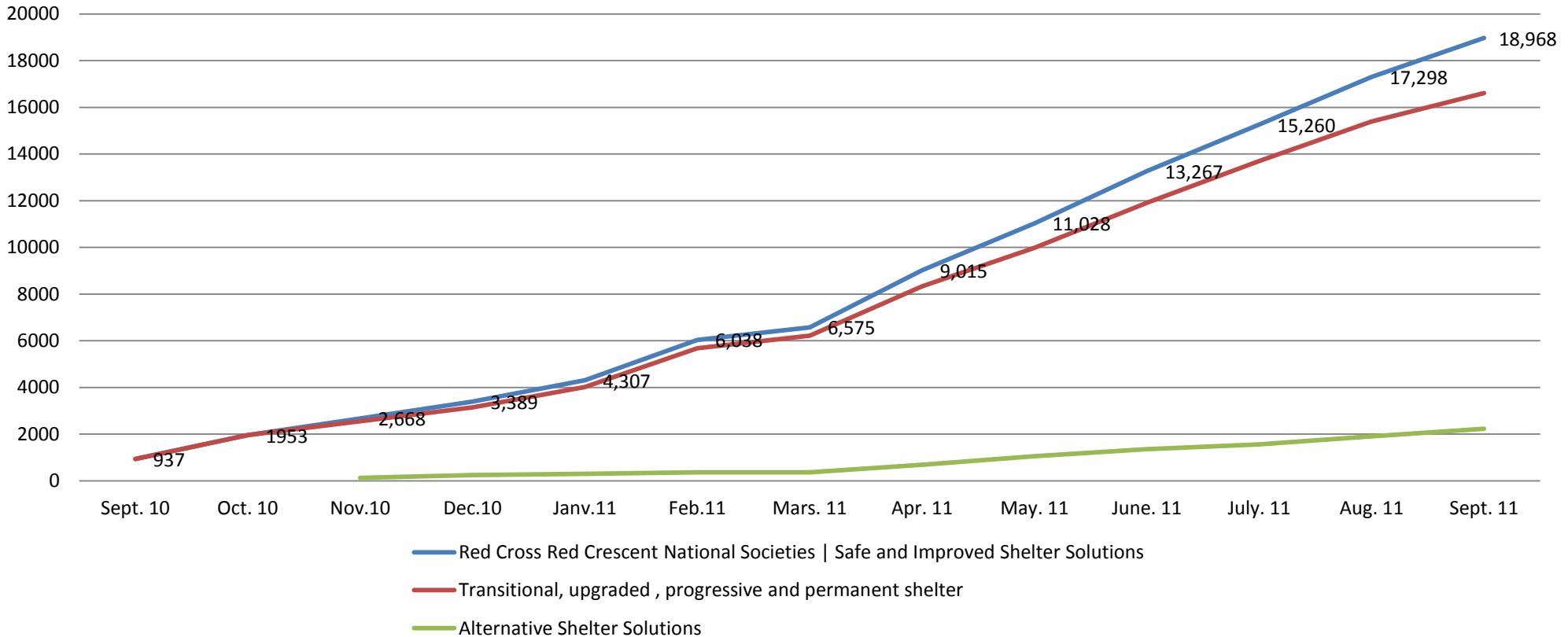

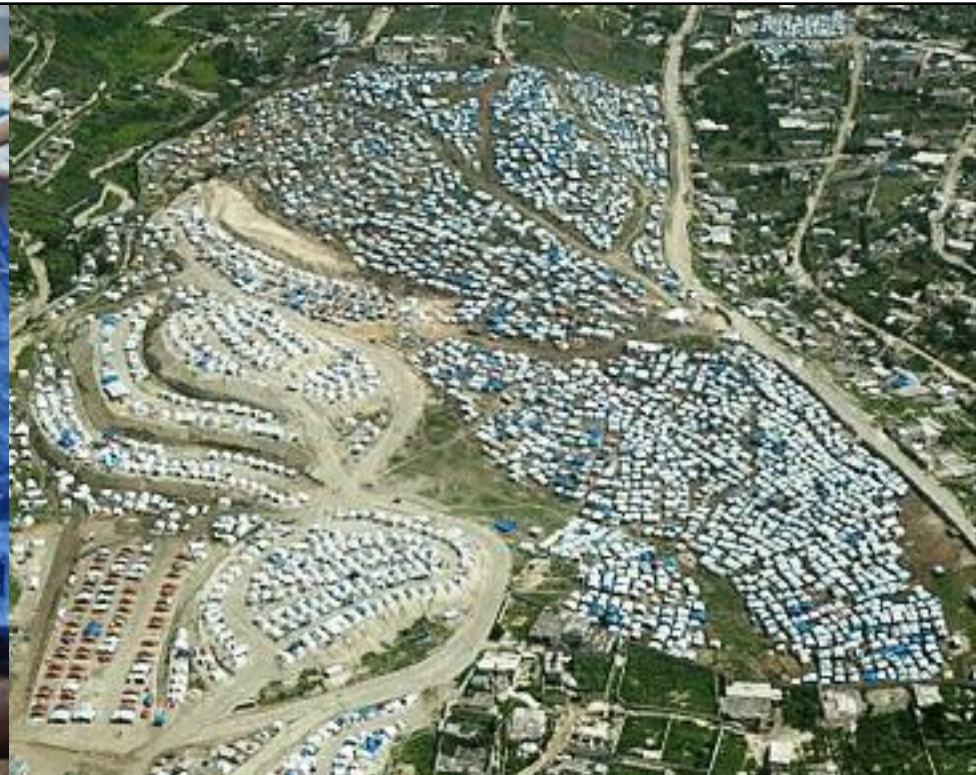

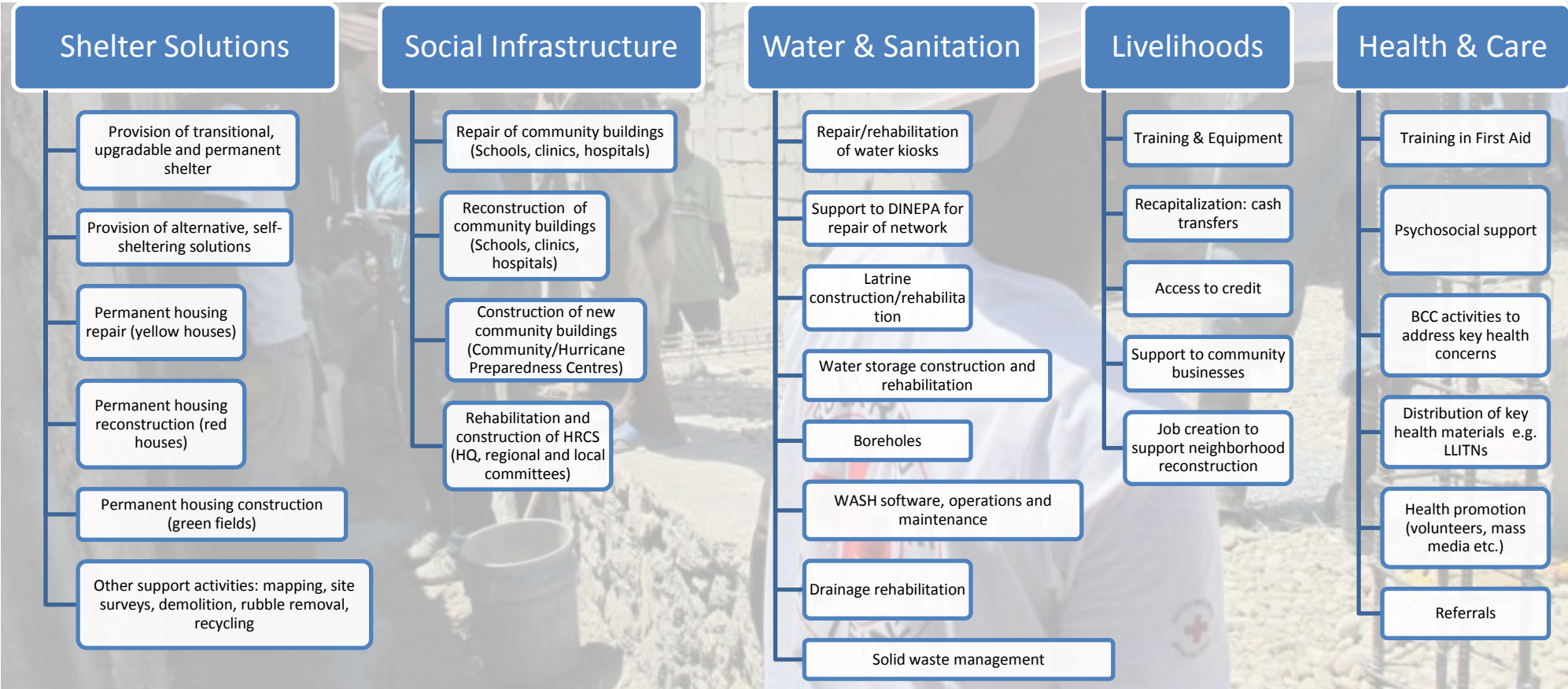
Facilitating Urban Renewal through an Integrated Neighbourhood Approach

Theory of change assumes that providing families with a **shelter solution and increasing access to key inputs and services** (i.e. livelihoods, sanitation, cross-sectoral risk reduction, and where possible, water, health and education) in part, through an integrated community mobilization approach, **will lead to stronger, safer and more resilient communities.**

The provision of vertical inputs (e.g. only shelter) risks the sustainability of all Red Cross inputs

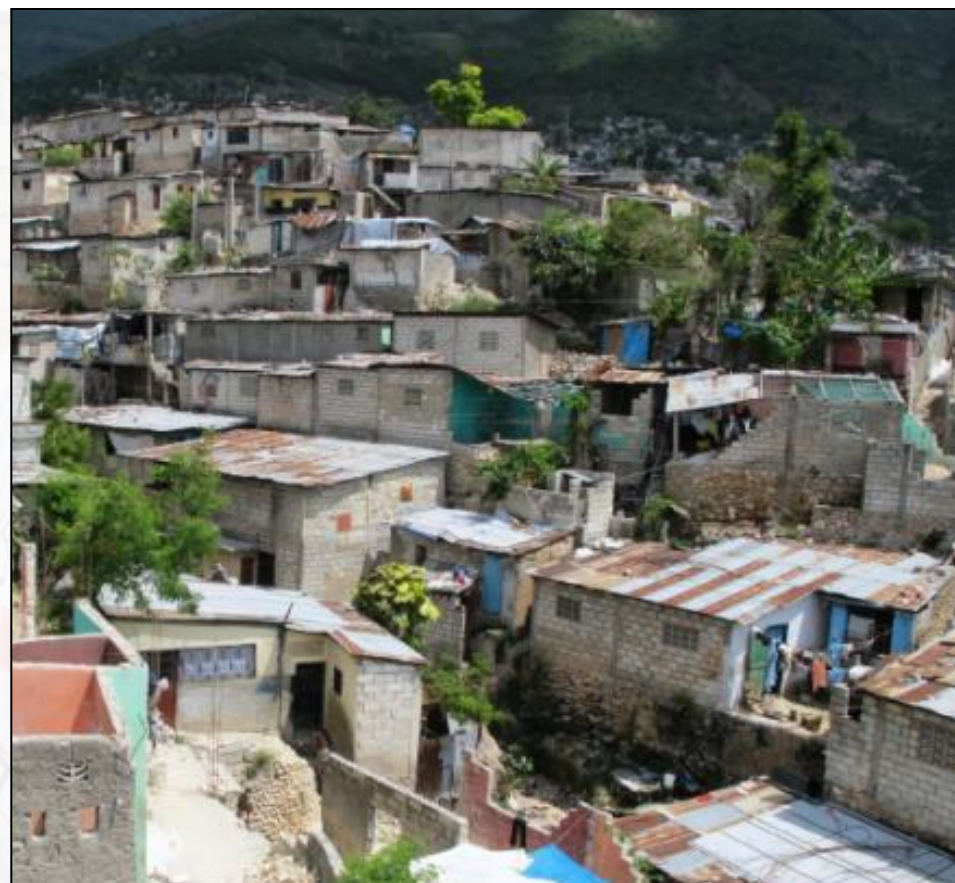

Snapshots of some Shelter related programming Prospects for months to come and 2012...

- Maintaining **Emergency Response capacity** through **Haitian Red Cross strengthening** (contingency planning / **stocks prepositioned** for more than **25,000 households**) / Haitian Red Cross **Volunteers training** for Shelter Kit distribution and use...
- **Emergency Shelters reinforcement in few camps...**
- **Self Sheltering Solutions** implementation and monitoring to **support camp decongestion**
- **Fulfillment of actual commitments** for **safe and improved shelter solutions** (to reach at least 35,000 households in total) – Upgrading of some already implemented solution ...
- **Supporting communities** in their own path to neighborhood recovery within **Integrated Neighborhood Approach (INA) ...**
- **Housing repair**, and **road to permanent housing** to be defined...
