## Summary Shelter and NFI Response

### Tartous & Lattakia:

- UNDP, along with UNHCR, are working closely with local authorities on Shelter Damage Assessment with an aim to map the severity of damages and prepare short, medium and long term rehabilitation plans for the damaged buildings
- UNRWA's Engineering team completed inspection of damages to buildings/infrastructure and the rehabilitation works are expected to begin soon.
- SARC [supported by UNHCR] distributed 269 NFI kits in four collective shelters in Al-Ramel Al-Junoubi.

### Aleppo:

- To date, the rapid structural assessment was undertaken in 4,159 buildings and classified 169 buildings as 'high risk of collapse' and 644 as 'medium risk of collapse'.
- UNMAS is marking the buildings which are categorized as high risk of collapse with aim to dissuade people from returning to them.
- Sub-national coordinators are coordinating with shelter partners to assign collective centres [identified by local authorities] for adaptation for displaced families. So far - GOPA, PUI, SIF, AAH and DRC have undertaken structural assessment and are at various stages of mobilising resources intended for adaptation works.
- Partners are waiting a comprehensive list from local authorities on official designation of collective centres, so that structural integrity assessment of these centres can be done.
- UNRWA is providing emergency NFI assistance to 286 Palestine refugee families displaced in Aleppo staying in either in collective shelters or hosting arrangements.

### Homs/ Hama:

- Al-Amal Association in Hama rented 35 apartments for a period of one year aimed at hosting families from Arbaeen neighbourhood in Hama city. Rental agreements were signed in the presence of municipality and the families began moving into these apartments. SARC [supported by UNHCR] has provided emergency NFIs to these families.
- To date, NRC has provided 104 children clothing kits in three collective centres – two in Hama (Saed Haddad, and Deaf and Dumb centre) and one in Homs (Mahmoud Othman).

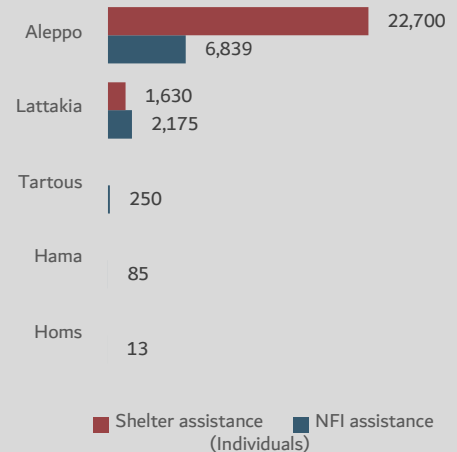

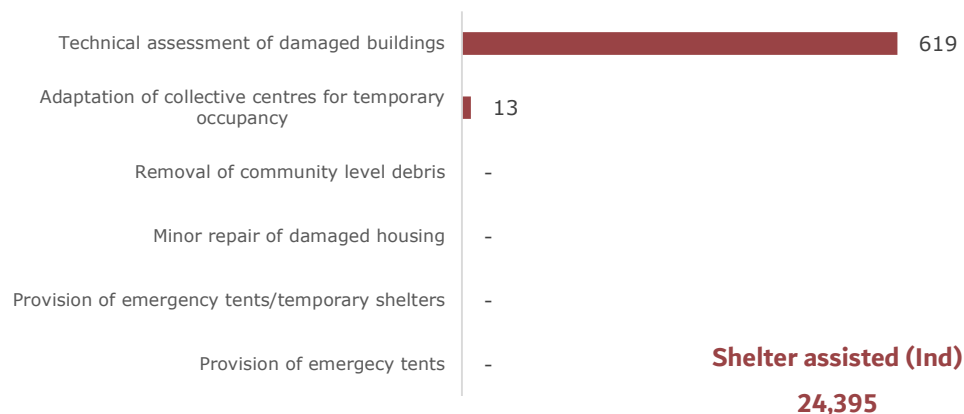

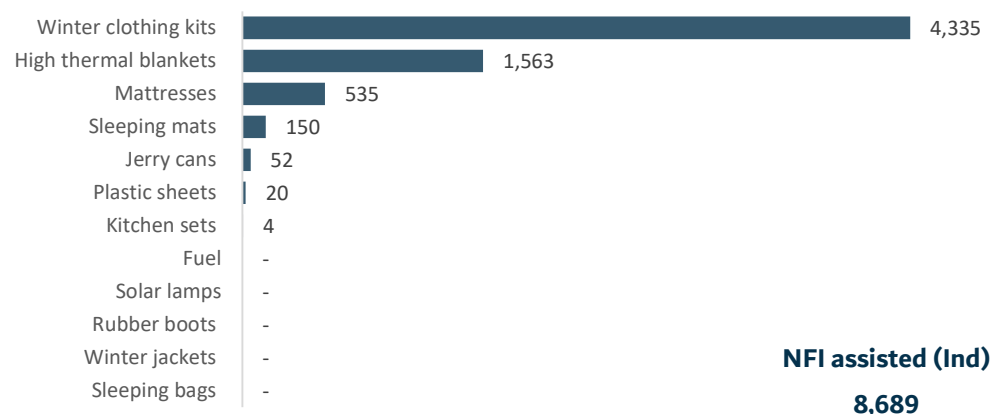
