

## Monthly Achievements

Shelter/NFI Cluster members are actively responding to the needs of both newly internally displaced persons and protracted IDPs in north-west Syria.

In August 2024 alone, NFI assistance was provided to over 391 individuals in the form of core NFI kits.

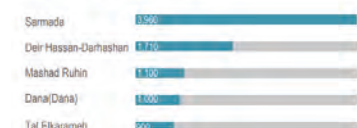
Additionally, the shelter needs of over 69, 810 individuals were met in August including infrastructure improvements in IDP sites, dignified shelters, emergency shelter provision, and rehabilitation of damaged or unfinished shelters.

## Second Quarter Displacement Movements Report

In the second quarter over 21,000 people were displaced in Idleb and Aleppo, particularly from Dana, Maaret Tamsrin, Afrin, Idleb and Sarmin due to mainly reduced access to humanitarian assistance, increase in rental cost, loss of income.

Most of the affected population arrived to Dana, Atareb, and Idleb sub-districts. Over 8,000 displaced people returned to mainly Ariha, Sarmin, Idleb, Jisr-Ash-Shugur and Badama.

### Top Returnee Destinations (Communities)



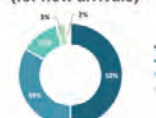
### The pull factors for new arrivals

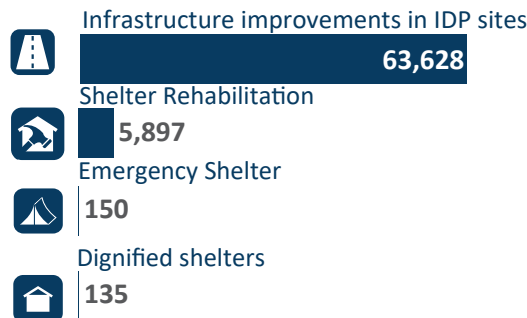
People reached in August

Approximately 393K individuals have been reached with Shelter assistance since January 2024.

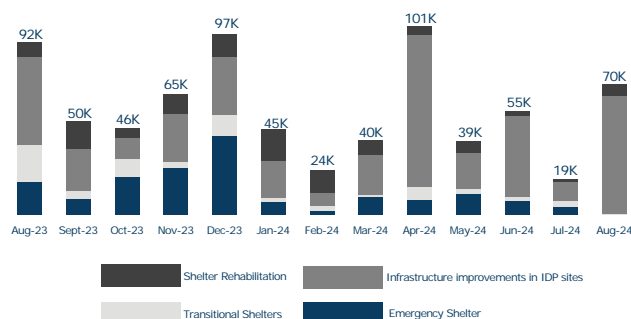

Approximately 300K individuals have been reached with NFI assistance (including both core and seasonal NFIs) since January 2024.

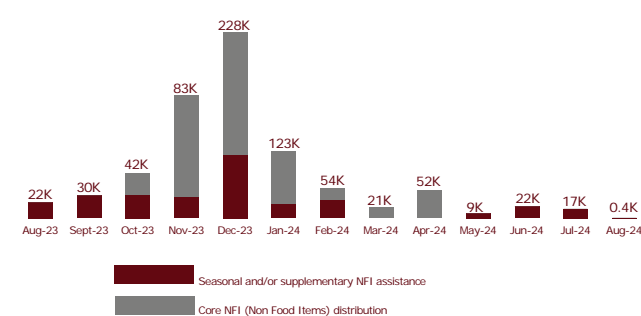

## Dignified Shelter Training - 27<sup>th</sup> August

Supported by UNHCR this training targeted technical staff from cluster members involved in implementing or planning dignified shelter in IDP sites in Northwest Syria (NWS).

The session aimed to enhance participants' knowledge and capacity regarding updated dignified shelter options for NWS, build empathy and understanding towards the dignified shelter approach, foster an understanding of integrated approaches to improve living conditions, and develop better awareness of the centrality of protection in the dignified shelter approach.

The training was attended by 30 participants from 27 organizations.



## IM Quarterly Training Workshop - 28<sup>th</sup> August

This full day quarterly workshop was held in CARE Turkiye, offices in Gaziantep with the support of CARE. The workshop was attended by 44 participants (28 physically and 16 online).

### Objectives:-

- Identifying and Rectifying Common Mistakes:** Highlight common pitfalls such as mishandling data, poor quality data.
- Best Practices:** Discuss effective strategies to mitigate these mistakes, including improving data governance and implementing better management systems.
- Showcase improvements to IM tools and processes:** Demonstrate changes made to the tools to improve data quality
- Hands-On Exercises:** Provide practical exercises to apply learned strategies to avoid common mistakes.
- Improving Collaboration:** Strengthen the collaboration between teams by ensuring everyone understands their role in effective information management

## Guidance Note on Rationalized Priorities Joint Release

S/NFI Cluster and CCCM Clusters jointly developed a guidance note on rationalized priorities for the two clusters which provides clear guidance on the key areas of focus and responsibilities for the CCCM and Shelter/NFI clusters in the humanitarian response in IDP camps across Northwest Syria. This document aims to inform NGO partners, donors, and communities about the specific responsibilities of the CCCM and Shelter/NFI clusters.

It highlights the importance of coordinated efforts in delivering services in IDP camps, aligning with the updated CCCM and SNFI (2024/5) Cluster strategies for IDPs and affected populations. The purpose of this document is to strengthen collaboration between the CCCM/Shelter/NFI clusters, optimize resource use, and promote community involvement in humanitarian assistance delivery, particularly given funding constraints.

The document discusses priority areas of focus under each cluster and provides recommended approaches for adoption and implementation during the mentioned period.
