Shelter/NFI Cluster members are actively responding to the needs of both newly internally displaced persons and protracted IDPs in north-west Syria.

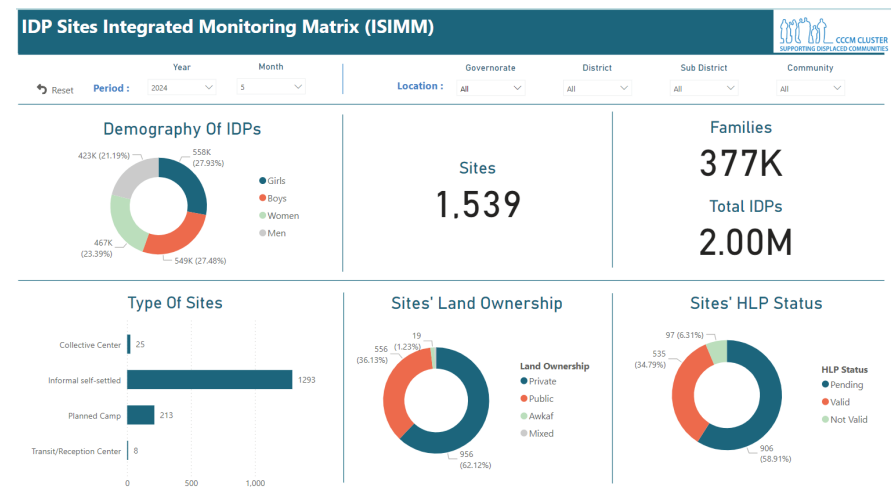
In June 2024 alone, NFI assistance was provided to over 21,936 individuals in the form of core NFI kits.

Additionally, the shelter needs of over 55,338 individuals were met in May including infrastructure improvements in IDP sites, dignified shelters, emergency shelter provision, and rehabilitation of damaged or unfinished shelters.

Displacement Update - ISIMM

As of May 2024, the CCCM database includes 1,539 IDP sites that host 1,996,624 IDPs or 376,928 families. Of these, 79% are women and children, and 85,652 IDPs are reported to be persons with disabilities. Furthermore, two sites were inactivated in the database due to various reasons.

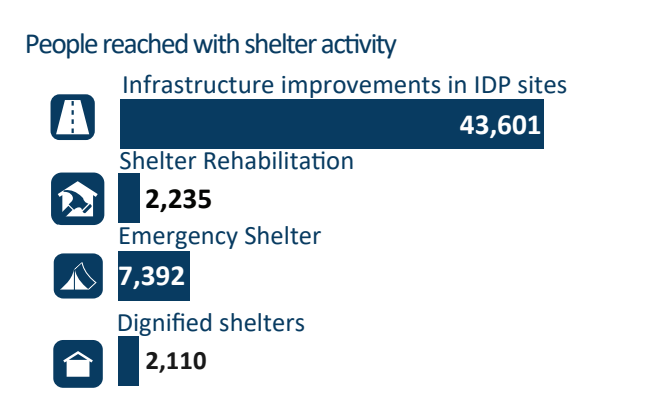

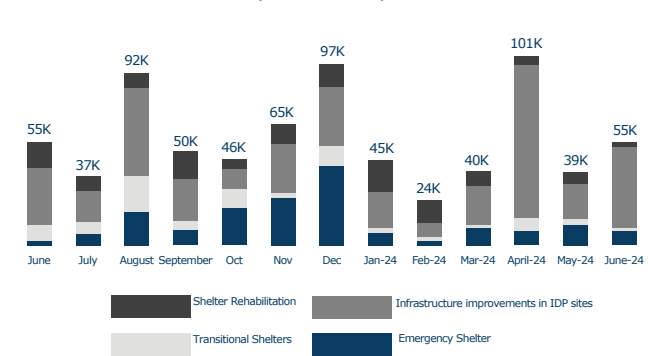
Approximately 304K individuals have been reached with Shelter assistance since January 2024.

Trend analysis of people reached by shelter activity per month (2023-2024)



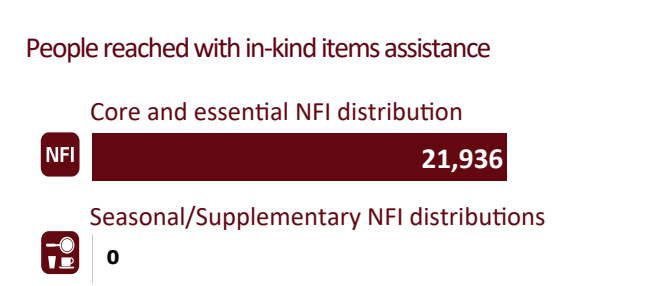

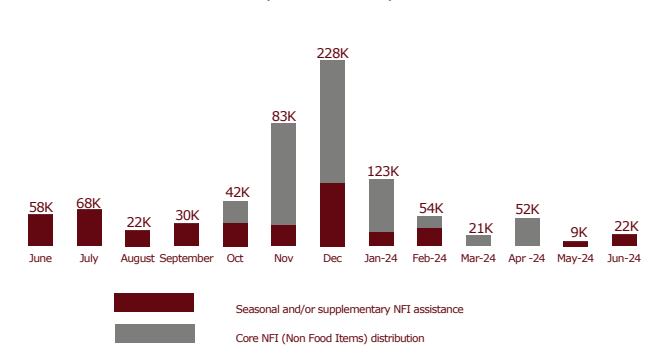
Approximately 282K individuals have been reached with NFI assistance (including both core and seasonal NFIs) since January 2024.

People reached with in-kind items assistance



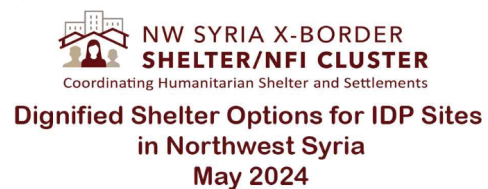
Trend analysis of people reached by NFI activity per month (2023-2024)
