- Shelter Cluster Ukraine, in collaboration with representatives from the National level, East Hub, and South Hub teams, conducted a monitoring mission on solid fuel distribution in Khersonska Oblast on the 9th and 10th of April.
- Handover the oversight of Kherson oblast to the Shelter South Hub

Cherkaska oblast – with CCCM Cluster 5 CSs were prioritized

Chernihiv oblast –

Evacuation: 0-5 km – 1247 people, needs are related to NFI for CS (transit points)

L*M repairs – 411 multistorey and 2 972 private houses needs to be repaired

Kyivska oblast

Collection of the NFI needs as a priority for the next month

L*M repairs - 3100 multistorey and 12567 private houses (eRestoration data uploaded)

Poltava oblast –

collected the needs for 7000 IDPs out of 26000 at hromada level

Sumska oblast:

Evacuation tendency + NFI support

L*M repairs – 904 multistorey and 204 private houses needs to be repaired

Western region general update

Maksym Vakhovskyi

- Many organizations closed or significantly scaled down their NFI programs in West Hub, those which did not mostly report Winter Clothes distributions and focus their NFI assistance on new arrivals and/or cooperate with IDP led organizations.
- Throughout March West Hub suffered a high number of attacks. SNFI Cluster partners were in close contact with hromadas and were ready to provide ESKs and other materials when it was required.
- West Hub partners continue implementation of planned Winter Energy, Cash for Utilities and Rental Support activities.
- SNFI Cluster Coordination Meetings took place on March 30 in Lviv and on April 16 in Ivano-Frankivsk.
- OCHA GCMs in Rivne is planned for April 24 and in Lutsk for April 25. SNFI Cluster team will present updates.

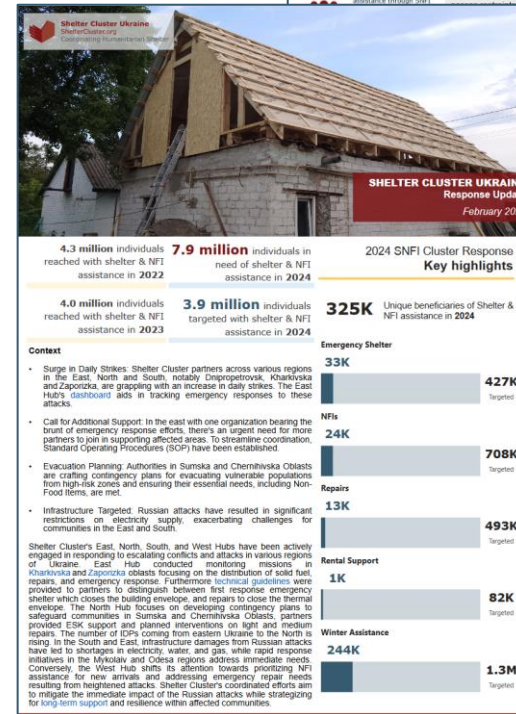


Year End Achievement Report – Shelter Cluster Ukraine (January 2023 to December 2023)

The Ukraine Shelter and NFI cluster is delighted to present our 2023 year end achievement report. Two years after the full-scale invasion of Ukraine, over 2 million¹ homes are categorised as damaged or destroyed reflecting the massive task faced by the shelter sector going forward. Despite significant challenges such as Ukraine's geographical size, on-going airstrikes, shifting frontlines, coordination complexities, insufficient links to development, shelter / NFI cluster partners intensified efforts and have exceeded our planned individuals almost a quarter. In total during 2023, 4.06 million unique reached with SNFI assistance, against an annual target of 3.34 million.

The cluster strengthened our cohort of participating partners in 2023, by wide support enhancing our 4 sub-hubs: i) Lviv for West Hub, Hub, ii) Kyiv/Chemiv for North hub, and iii) Dnipro for East hub. Our focal point is being identified for Kharkiv as we focus our winter responses along the Eastern crescent aligning with high priorities and HINSP objectives. National and sub-national meetings were facilitated (approx. 130 meetings across all hubs), the cluster led in ICWG, ICWG and GCM meetings as well as facilitating meetings with National and local Authorities. Two SNFI cluster NOOs issued in 2023. PIN is co-char in the East hub and ORG is supported at national level. In addition, a national technical review stand-by-partner mechanisms (CANADEM). The cluster's Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) and productive technical working group priority recommendations and guidance as required. Inter-agency working groups on 'strength to strength', we developed very close CCM, Protection (HLP), WASH, Education and Health clusters working as members of the Cash and HLP working groups. Our environmentally sensitive and sustainable solutions continue, our disposal of Asbestos and guidance promotion is particularly important.

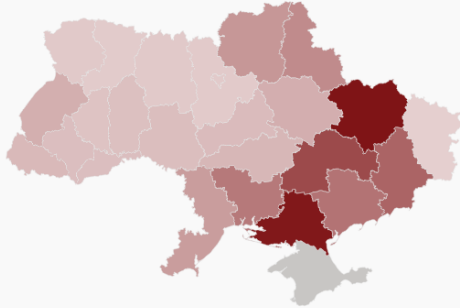

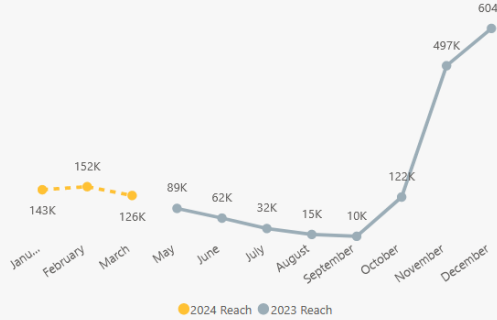

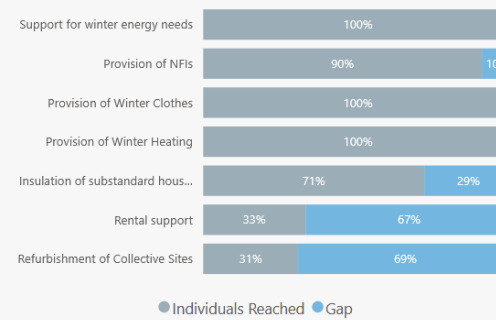

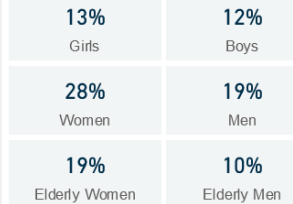


Partner Targets against Individuals Reached

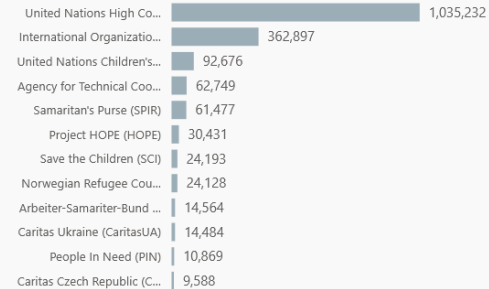

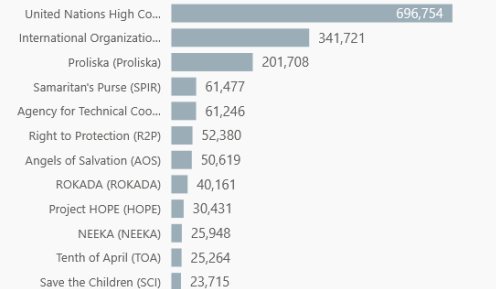
Profile of beneficiaries



Individuals Reached by Reporting Partner

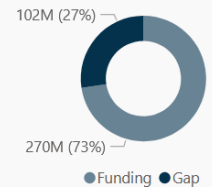


Individuals Reached by Implementing Partner

FINDINGS:

- **LEVEL OF REPRESENTATION ON SUBNATIONAL MEETINGS.** SOMETIMES MANAGERS/COORDINATORS DON'T ALWAYS/NOT AT ALL ATTEND SUB MEETINGS AND DON'T CONTACT HUB COORDINATORS/
- **COORDINATION:** PARTNERS IN THE REGIONS DO NOT KNOW ABOUT COORDINATION IN THE WHATSAPP GROUPS
- **ACTIVITY INFO:** PROJECT CODES ARE NOT ENTERED IN THE **ARM** TAB, BUT REPORTED IN **RMM/** INCORRECT ACTIVITIES ARE INDICATED WHEN REPORTING.
- **SIDAR:** THE NUMBER OF L&M REPAIRS BY REGION DOESN'T MATCH THE NUMBER REPORTED IN ACTIVITY INFO.
- **SIDAR:** FOR L&M REPAIRS, THE PROJECT DEADLINE HAS PASSED, BUT THE STATUS HASN'T CHANGED TO "COMPLETE".

CHALLENGES FOR PARTNERS :

- **LISTS OF BENEFICIARIES** :OUTDATED DATA FROM LOCAL AUTHORITIES / HOUSING NOT DAMAGED AS A RESULT OF HOSTILITIES / BENEFICIARIES NOT IN NEED OF ASSISTANCE / DEGREE OF DAMAGE GREATER THAN INDICATED IN THE LISTS.
- **NON-STANDARD SIZES OF WINDOWS AND DOORS:** THE TENDER SPECIFICATIONS TAKE INTO ACCOUNT STANDARD SIZES, BUT IN REALITY THERE ARE NON-STANDARD CASES IN PRIVATE HOUSEHOLDS.
- **DELAYING THE PROJECT DEADLINE:** CONTRACTORS WITH L&M REPAIRS SOMETIMES PERFORM POORLY, WHICH DELAYS THE COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT ON TIME.
