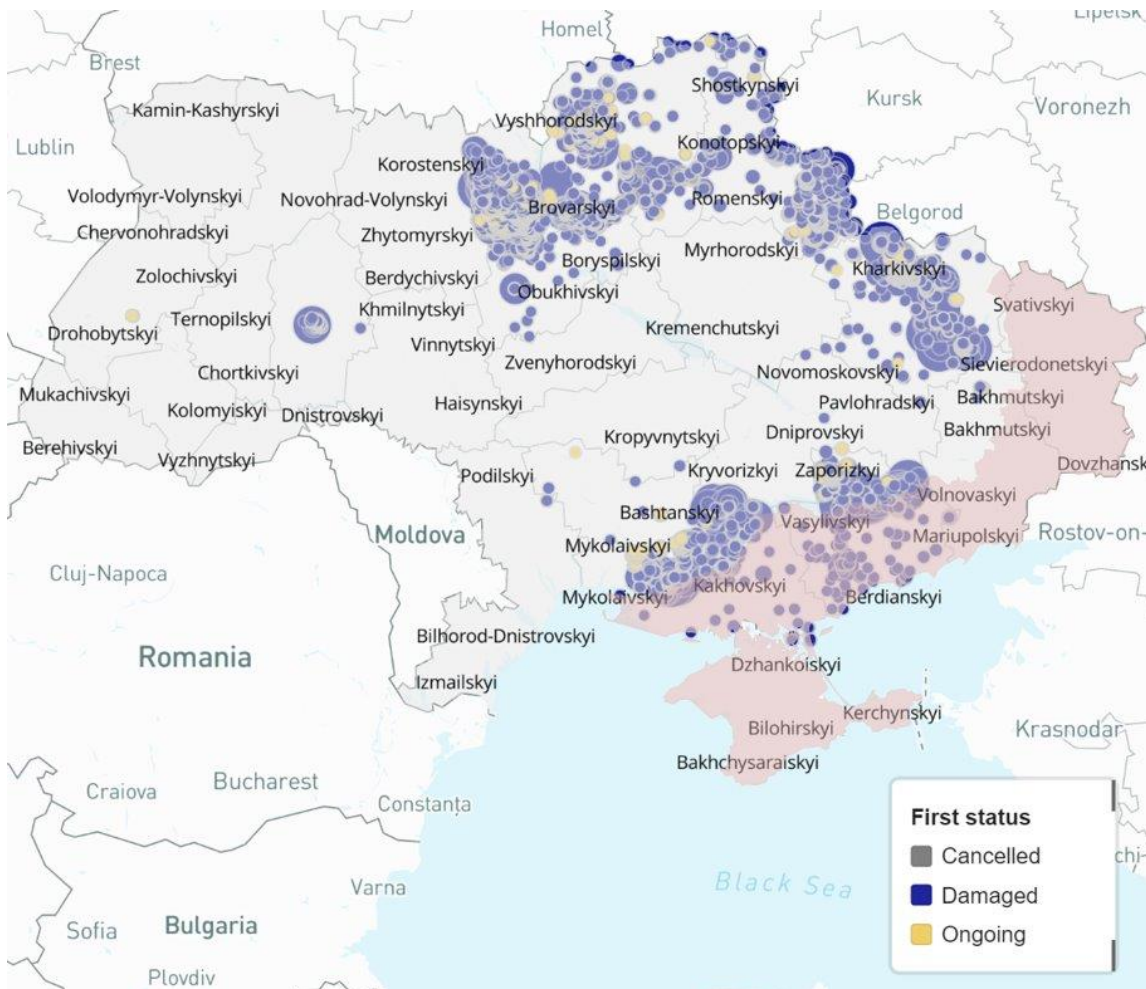
2024 Response monitoring status

4. Technical coordination updates

ACTIVITY SN205: Refurbishment of Collective Sites

Activity Description

This activity is intended to accommodate works requiring substantial technical supervision aimed at enabling IDPs to live in the Collective Sites in dignity, safety, and protection and to bring the facilities up to the minimum technical standards required by existing legislation [Resolution #930, emphasizing inclusivity](#), access to services, and security. The work must be carried out in buildings listed on the official government list (compiled by oblast authorities and published by the Ministry of Reintegration) and which are included in the [CCCM Cluster CSs master list](#). The targeting of buildings should take into account technical aspects (structurally sound, cost-effectiveness ratio,...) but also, in line with CCCM Cluster prioritization criteria for humanitarian interventions in collective sites, targeting should consider legal status; ownership type; building type; technical capacities of the building; number of residents; accommodation capacity; and access to services, markets, livelihoods and local integration. This year SC will only accept activities that aim to bring conditions of existing sites up to minimum standard, and not the creation of new places for IDPs. Interventions are not recommended in buildings where there is no clear separation between the part used as CS and other uses, such as student dormitories where IDPs and students live in mixed conditions. Only activities that directly impact on the welfare of IDPs can be considered, excluding works in administrative or auxiliary buildings.

Indicators and units

Indicator # individuals supported through refurbishment of collective sites

Unit and count of beneficiaries: General: # individuals (IDPs) living in CSs and benefiting from the improvements made.

Individuals refers to the potential # of IDPs that the CS can accommodate. The number of residents may not necessarily correspond to the capacity of the CSs because it depends on the compositions of the families occupying it at any given time and may change over time.

Reference Cost: 650 \$ per sleeping space

Reporting instructions: Only activities carried out in CS with CS-Code can be reported. The **lower** of the following values must be reported: the maximum capacity of the collective site (from CCCM master list) OR the ratio between the value invested in Shelter Cluster concerned activities and the Reference Cost. All regular maintenance and minor repairs of collective sites should be reported to CCCM. Refurbishment work relating to WASH repairs should be reported under WASH cluster.

Deduplication mechanisms: To avoid overlaps in assistance, it is mandatory to register the individual assistance in the deduplication platforms existing within the cluster and share the assistance plans with the Shelter Cluster coordination hubs.

Modality of assistance: The recommended mode of assistance is in kind

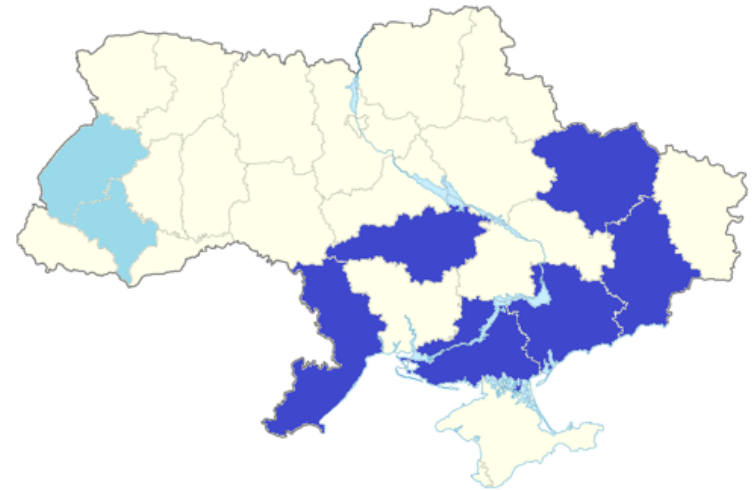

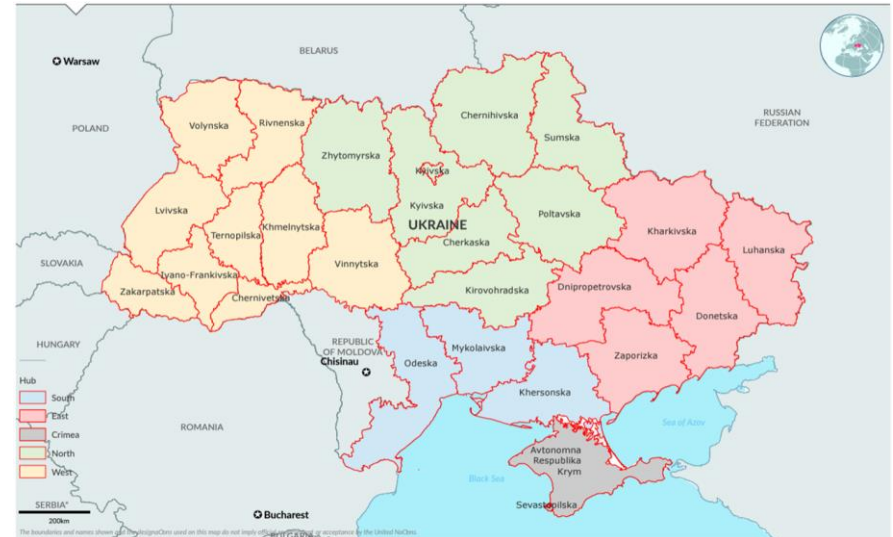
