Central West	<p>broke out in Abyan extending to some districts. The Cluster is providing package of emergency assistance for new IDPs till they get registered. In Abyan, there is some kind of arrangement of delivering assistance to some families to avoid duplication. The Cluster is in Aden to support along with some IPs the ExU. UNHCR received fund from CERF to support 2500 IDPs in the South. DRC along with CSSW are going to cover some gaps in Abyan.</p> <p>CSSW signed an agreement to help 2000 IDPs; of which 1500 in Aden 300 in Hajjah and 200 in Sa'ada.</p> <p>IDPs in Aden are rejecting to go to camps in which there is no enough resources. The government formed a committee to work beside NGOs to find shelter solutions for IDPs in schools. There are about 60-70 schools still occupied with IDPs.</p> <p>CSSW: Mustaba is still controlled by Al-Houthis and IDPs are dwelling in Khayran Al-Muhrraq, Al Khamiseen. CSSW distributed NFIs and some Hygiene kits for IDPs in Hajjah as well as to plastic sheets. CSSW is going also to distribute nutrition items. In Nihm and Bani Garmouz in which about 200 IDPs are living as well as to Hatarish.
