District Prioritization	The Information Management officer for the Cluster briefed the participants about the mapping of needs which has been finalized as requested based on individuals. For example, those areas that have more than 2000 individuals in need for shelter support, this can be considered as a critical situation and those areas of conflict are highly prioritized. <b>Presentation on Shelter</b>	<p>NRC and the Engineer Faiz Harmal briefed the participants about the shelter intervention in Haradh, Mazraq Camp 3 and here is a summary of the assessment results:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- 579 households have been interviewed.</li><li>- 98% live in tents provided by UNHCR</li><li>- 45% of tents are damaged, mostly the canvas</li><li>- 97% of shelters occupied</li><li>- 73% of shelters are not partitioned</li><li>- 78% have no space for cooking</li><li>- 58% say that current shelter space does not meet their needs at all</li><li>- 99% of shelters are not lockable</li></ul>	Faiz to make sure of the UNHCR standard per person regarding shelter	Faiz Harmal	<b>3 days</b>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 92% of shelters have leakage when it rains (43% seepage)</li> <li>- 55% feel neither secure nor insecure</li> <li>- 49% feel that they will be evicted</li> <li>- 78% lived in permanent shelter back home, 66% of them severely damaged.</li> </ul>
