

## Highlights

- The cluster is strengthening its engagement on creating conditions for achieving durable solutions for IDPs in prolonged displacement.
- Four Information Management training programs were conducted in Sana'a, Amran, Hajjah, and Aden. The programs aimed to improve the quality of the data, data collection and reporting at the level of the age and gender groups.
- CCCM Training conducted in Haradh, Hajjah on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2014.

## Cluster strategy and objectives

- A. Most vulnerable IDPs receive NFIs and emergency shelter support in a timely and coordinated manner.
- B. Management and coordination of activities and assistance in two camps in Hajjah is maintained at the current level, while, in collaboration with local authorities, the camp population is gradually assisted to achieve a more durable shelter and livelihood solution.
- C. The target vulnerable displaced population is assisted to progressively achieve durable solutions in terms of shelter, and in coordination with other clusters to attain self-reliance.
- D. The knowledge and capacity of national actors and implementing partners in CCCM, Shelter and emergency response to displacement is strengthened.

## Context and Response

- a. Up to May, the following NFIs assistance were distributed: Blankets (6,328), Clothes (11,720), NFI Kits (35,750), Cooking Sets (1,414), Dignity Kits (420), Hygiene Kits (520), Jerry Cans (195), Kitchen Sets (496), Mattresses (4,935), Plastic Mats (2,984), Plastic Sheets (3,290), Sleeping Matts (2,176), Water Buckets (969), and Winter Blankets (45,603).
- b. 678 families are receiving Rental Subsidies, 835 Emergency Latrines were distributed, and 361 tents were distributed in-which some of the tents are used as temporary classes.
- c. 1,021 Transitional Shelters were constructed and 330 Houses were rehabilitated.

## Challenges

- i. Limited access to population affected by conflict due to insecurity.
- ii. Urgent need for durable solutions for stranded IDPs living in camps.
- iii. Lack of reliable and consistent data which can be used to identify accurately needs and gaps in the response.
- iv. Extremely lack of sufficient funds .
- v. Limited access to land and property ownership may hinder IDPs from having adequate shelter solutions.
- vi. Urgent need for training to cluster partners staff in shelter programs

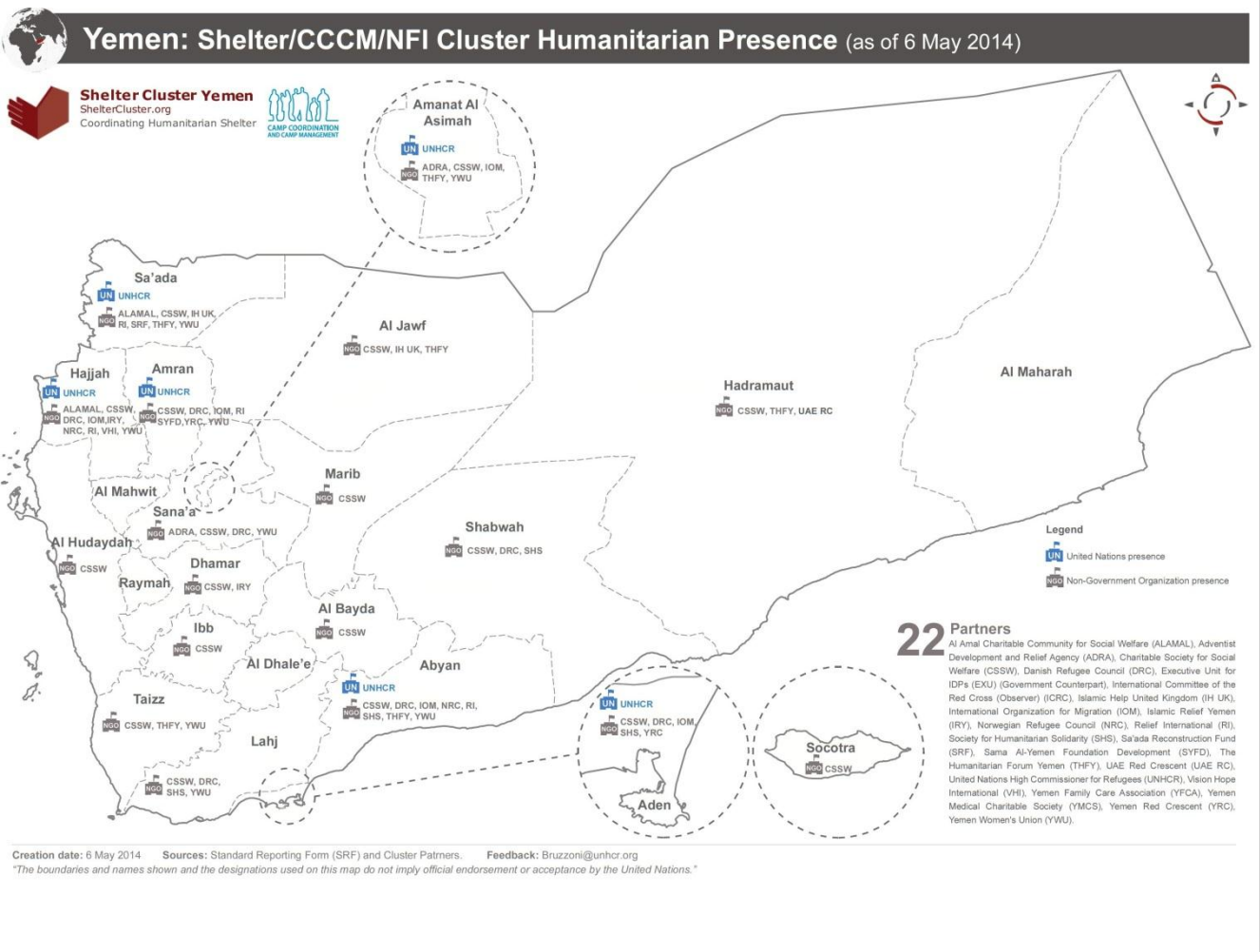
