1. Introduction

IOM stated that they are now the focal point and lead for the Ormoc shelter cluster meetings. Focal point roles will be overall coordination of the shelter specifically for the Western part of Leyte Island.

2. Updates from shelter cluster

- Richard Luff, Shelter Cluster Coordinator in Tacloban spoke mentioning that DSWD is reassessing the affected areas and figures seem to be in line with the DROMIC data.
- Data from the Reach assessment to be expected next week along with the MIRA assessment.

- He mentioned that the Shelter cluster strategy is publicly available on the sheltercluster.org

- Only 5 % of the requested 178 million shelter funding appeal has been secured which identifies a funding shortfall. This needs to be addressed.

- Land issues in the area regarding no build zones and informal settlers needs to be clarified. A working group on Land, House and Property has been established in Manila level.

3. Information Management

- Many agencies operating in western Leyte were still unclear on how to properly submit their data. David from Cluster in Tacloban informed that data can be submitted on the website sheltercluster.org.

- When asked what % of agencies were currently submitting data David estimated that 90% of INGOs and international organizations and roughly 20% of NNGO's are currently submitting their data to 3W. This highlights the need to reach out to local NGOs and encourage data submission.

- The 3W needs/gap discussion highlighted the need for emergency shelter kits outside of Ormoc city. 3W data also identified uneven coverage of emergency kits, with some areas still having received nothing.

- Partners were asked what some of constraints are in terms of covering areas where the gap exists. They hinted lack of assessment and information as main reasons.

- PASAR Foundation expressed its commitment to cover approximately 4000 families in Isabel Municipality. IOM also announced that they have approximately 8000 emergency shelter kits and is willing to partner with other agencies.

4. Technical working groups

- Main point conveyed was that techniques need to be improved for fixing plastic sheets in order to get the best use.

-The Emergency shelter working group will be phasing out and transitioning to recovery.

5. CCCM

- IOM announced that DTM Round 2 is ongoing for all ECs that were open in the Round 1. The result will be shared widely especially with other clusters to facilitate return of evacuees to their original residence.
