2. Harmonization of response modalities and assistance values across different incident types

- 1. Diverse Incident Types:** Shelter responses currently address multiple incident types, including demolitions, settler violence (SV), and military operations, each with distinct response approaches.
- 2. Existing SOPs:** Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) are developed per incident type, ensuring internal consistency within each category.
- 3. Gap in Cross-Incident Consistency:** While responses are consistent within individual incident types, there is limited harmonization across different incident categories.
- 4. Equity & Fairness Concern:** Variations in assistance modalities and values may lead to perceived or actual inequities between affected households facing different types of incidents.
- 5. Need for Review:** A comprehensive review of response frameworks across incident types is needed to ensure more balanced, fair, and principled assistance.
- 6. Illustrative Example:** Compensation or support provided for full house demolition may significantly differ from assistance for damage caused by settler violence, despite comparable impact on affected households.
- 7. Key Objective:** Ensure reasonable alignment in assistance levels based on needs and impact, rather than solely on incident classification.
