

Overview

As of December 2025, the Mozambique Shelter Cluster has reached 159,580 individuals (47% of the target) affected by conflict across Cabo Delgado. Out of the 800K people identified in need, 333.9K were targeted for shelter assistance. However, only USD 6.2 million, just 24.9% of the required USD 24.8 million, has been secured, significantly limiting the scope of the humanitarian response. A total of 35,257 households have been reached through conflict response, with the majority supported by partners such as NRC (25%), IOM (22%), and Save the children (21%).

The districts with the highest number of households reached include Chiure (13,745), Mueda (11,431), and Muidumbe (4,631).

Cluster activities to date have included the distribution of 300 emergency shelters, 2,483 NFI kits, and training and technical support for 9,780 households on safe shelter construction.

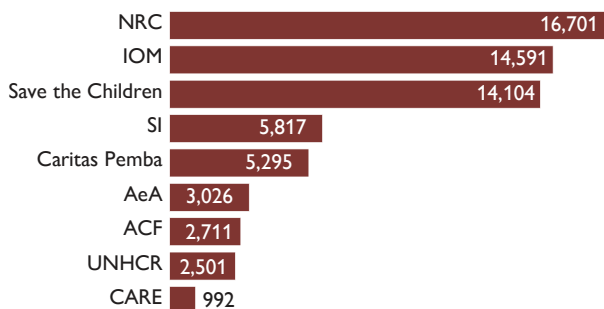

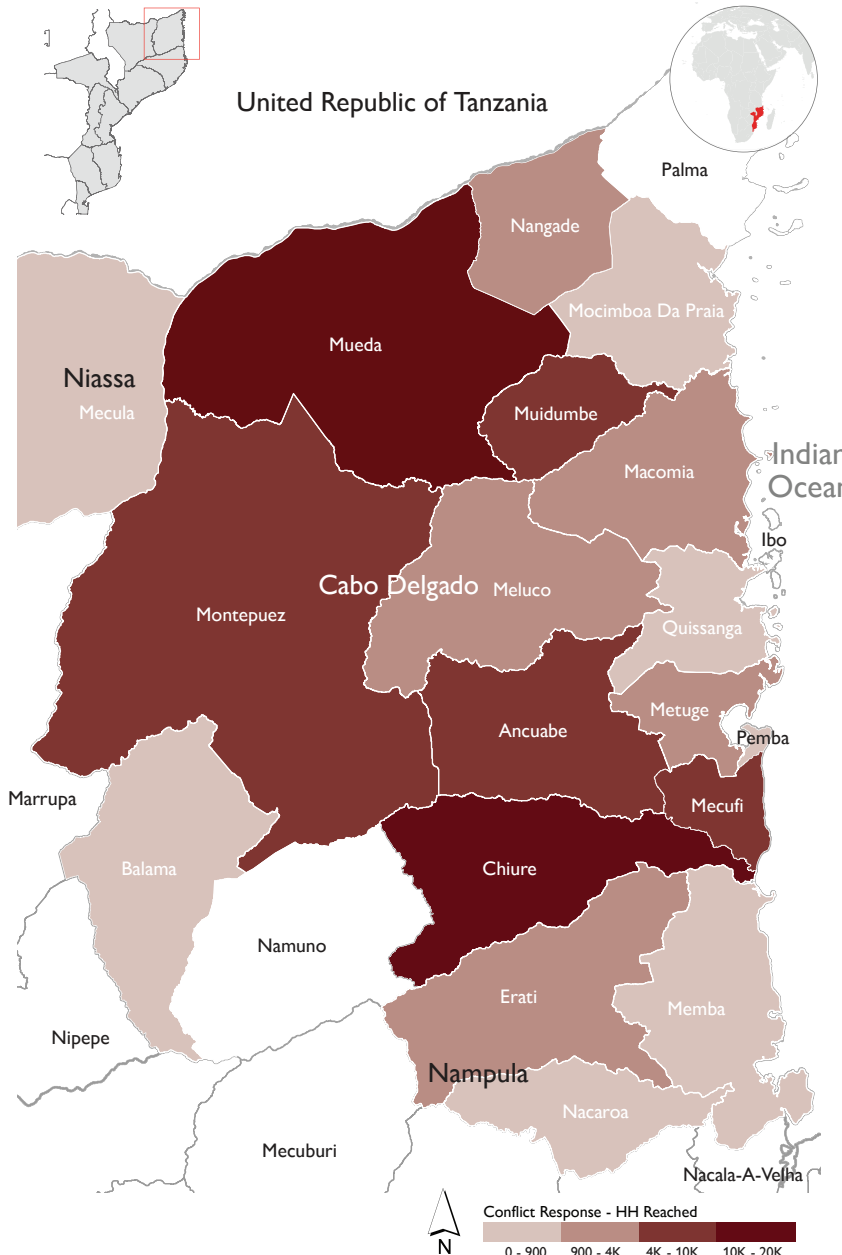

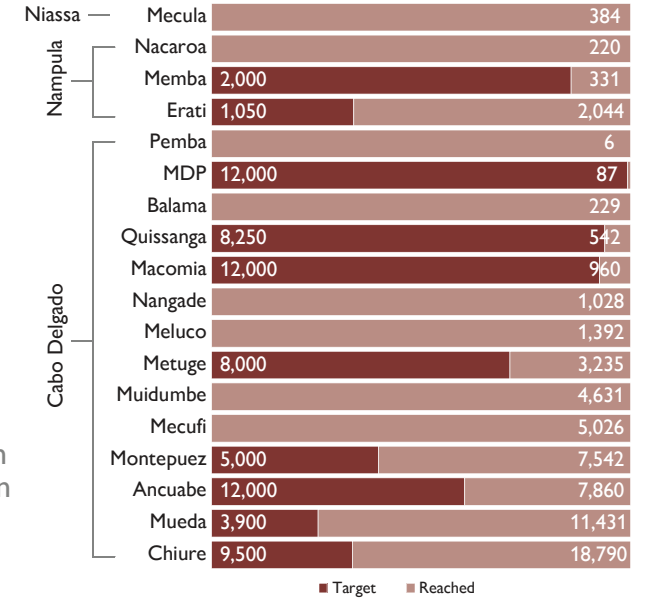
Household reached by partners

Disclaimer

Shelter Cluster partners reached 159,580 people in HNRP districts, with an additional 89,278 reached in non-prioritized districts due to conflict-related displacement. Charts and maps reflect total cluster reach (HNRP and non-HNRP), while progress against HNRP targets is reported separately. Reduced funding and competing needs have limited assistance mainly to emergency shelter and essential household items. The Cluster continues to advocate for increased support, particularly in return areas and relocation sites.

Overview

Between January and April 2025, Mozambique faced critical shelter needs following multiple cyclones that struck the central and northern provinces. According to the Flash Appeal, an estimated 403,000 people were in need of shelter support, with the Shelter Cluster targeting 315,000 individuals for assistance. As of April, 250,299 people (55%) had been reached.

The worst-affected provinces included Cabo Delgado, Nampula, and Zambezia. Districts such as Metuge (16,890 damaged shelters), Mecufi (15,200), and Chinde (12,216) recorded the highest destruction levels. However, many areas remain critically underserved. For example, Monapo had over 53,000 damaged shelters, but only 1,155 households were reached.

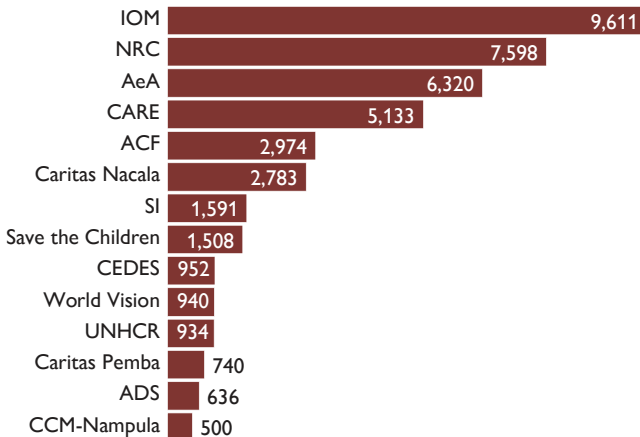

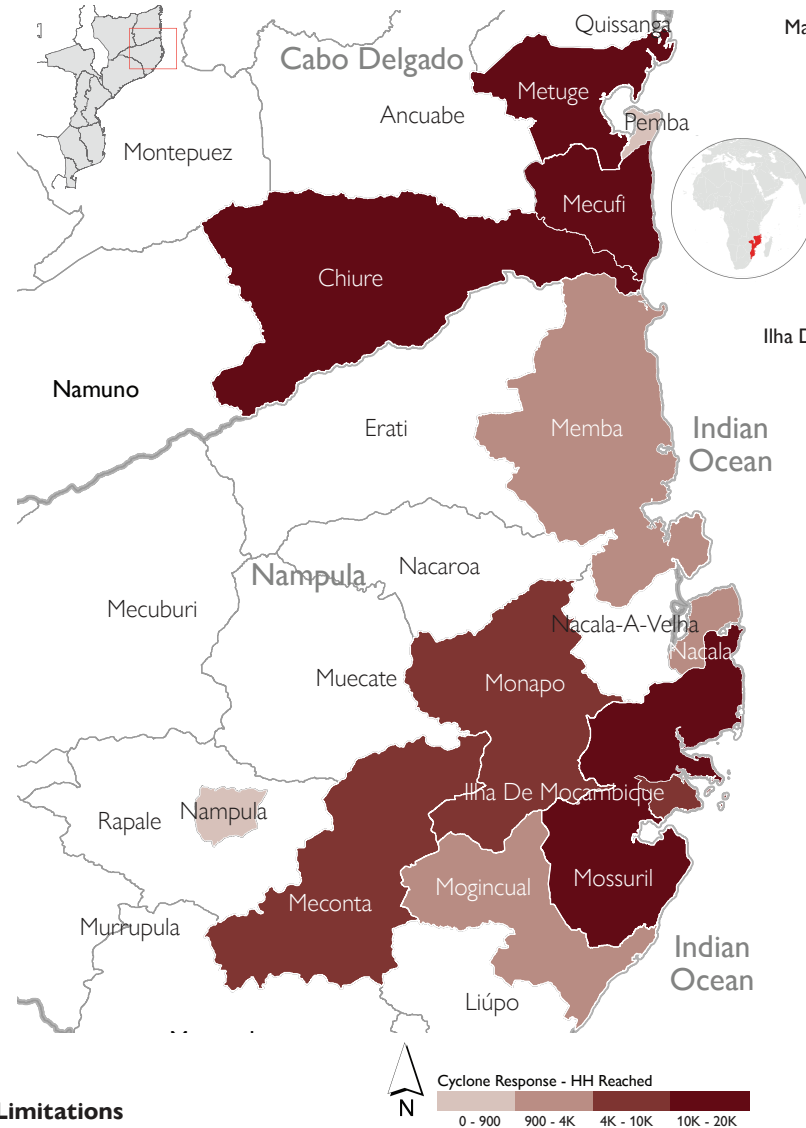

Household reached by partners



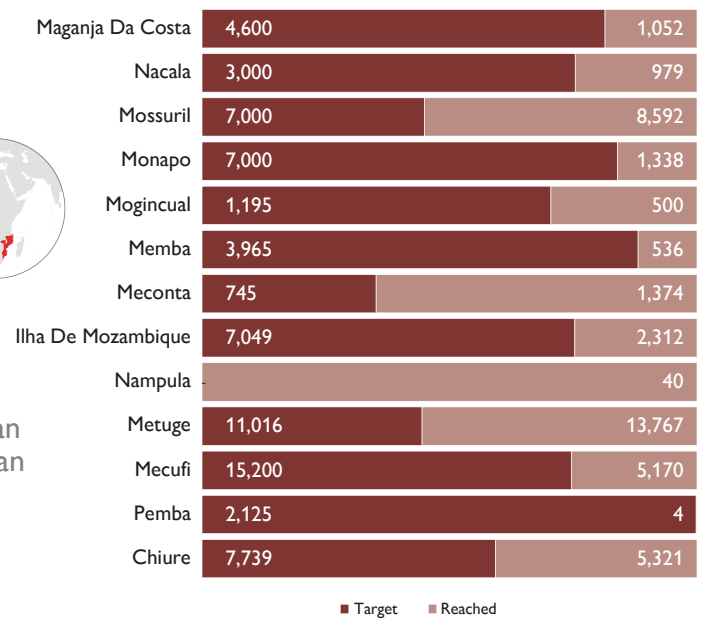
Cyclone Response Overview Map



Limitations

The Shelter Cluster confronts the ongoing challenge of limited funding, impeding its capacity to expand operations and meet the urgent shelter needs of crisis-affected populations. This financial constraint hinders the cluster's ability to scale its response to the level required for comprehensive impact.
