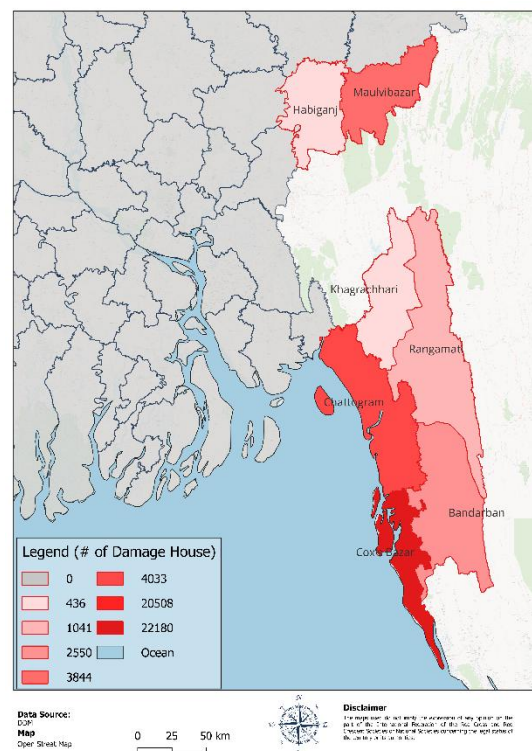


Shelter Cluster Response

Bangladesh Floods and Landslides 2026

The 2026 monsoon season in Bangladesh triggered severe flash floods and devastating landslides. The floods affected **seven districts**, with the Chattogram Division being the hardest hit region. Driven by torrential monsoon rainfall, active depressions in the Bay of Bengal and intense hill torrents, the crisis escalated rapidly from early July through August 2026. A total of **36,550 people sought refuge** in **1,722 evacuation shelters**. The floods and landslides resulted in **59 fatalities** and **injured 293 people**.



Key Impacts



8,592 houses damaged fully.



46,000 houses damaged partially.



Approximately **US\$37 million** is required to repair and reconstruct damaged houses.



4,523 KM Roads Damaged.



578 KM Embankment Damaged.



850 Bridge/Culverts Damaged.

Response



Govt. Allocated 4,200 bundles of CGI Sheets and **US \$ 105,000** for house repairing



7,750 households received **essential household items** including tarpaulins, mosquito nets, kitchen sets, and family kits.



House repair support has been provided to **1,371 households**.



A total of **US\$745,017** has been mobilized for **shelter support** to date.

- Shelter Repair Materials (CGI Sheets and Toolkits).
- Essential Household Items (EHIs) and Kitchen Sets.
- Integrated Shelter and Sanitation Support.
