**Key highlights**

**Context:**

- Heavy attacks in the North:** huge missile attacks on regional centers of borderline oblasts Sumy and Chernihiv, and to the central part of Ukraine – Smila city in Cherkasy oblast and Suprunivka in Poltava.
- Daily Strike in the South:** daily strikes occurring in Khersonska, Odeska, and Mykolaivska.
- Lessons learned from the East:** East Hub published a [story map](#) that gives a summary overview of all lessons learned for winterization from the four monitoring visits conducted in each oblast.
- Scaling down in the West:** partners close scale down NFI distributions in the West, except for meeting the needs of new arrivals.

**Summary:**

During the month of April, East Hub completed handover of Khersonska Oblast to South Hub through a monitoring mission of solid fuel distributions in the Oblast. A two-day training was conducted for all East Hub partners on Activity Info and SIDAR in Dnipro seeking to operationalize the use of these tools for field focused coordination. Shelter Cluster East Hub began to coordinate with North and South Hubs on its emergency coordination package, including SOP on emergency coordination, emergency response after shelling, and stock mapping (Shelter Cluster East Hub has also worked to compile a dashboard focused on operational planning of repair activities).

In North Hub, the level of shelling at the border line in Sumska oblast continues to be high. Additionally, there were several huge missile attacks during this month. The emergency needs have been covered by local partners with further coordination of early recovery phase. To develop preparedness and contingency plan, data collection about partners' capacity is in place (to reflect and coordinate emergency assistance provided in Chernihivska and Sumska oblasts, an online dashboard was developed). To improve coordination between eRestoration program implementation and humanitarian assistance, a meeting with local authorities at hromada level was organized to discuss key issues of data exchanging within SIDAR platform.

In South Hub, the partners of the South Hub have been actively addressing the daily strikes. Each oblast has relied on a single organization for the emergency response efforts, being supported by single organizations providing materials. Highlighting the necessity for additional partners to provide support considering the magnitude of these strikes, South Hub has implemented SOP adapted from those established by the East Hub, to facilitate coordination during emergencies.

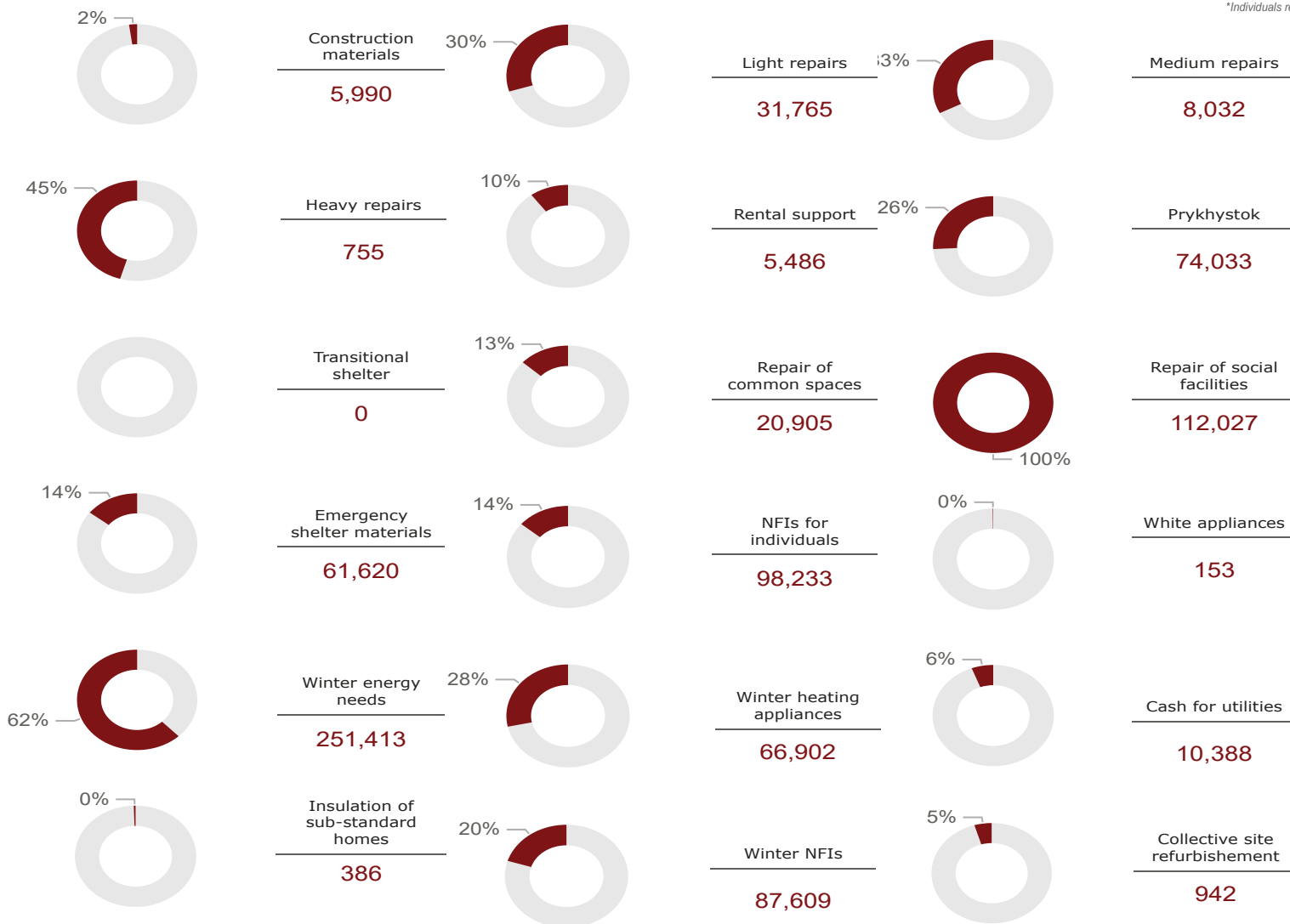


# 2024 Response Map



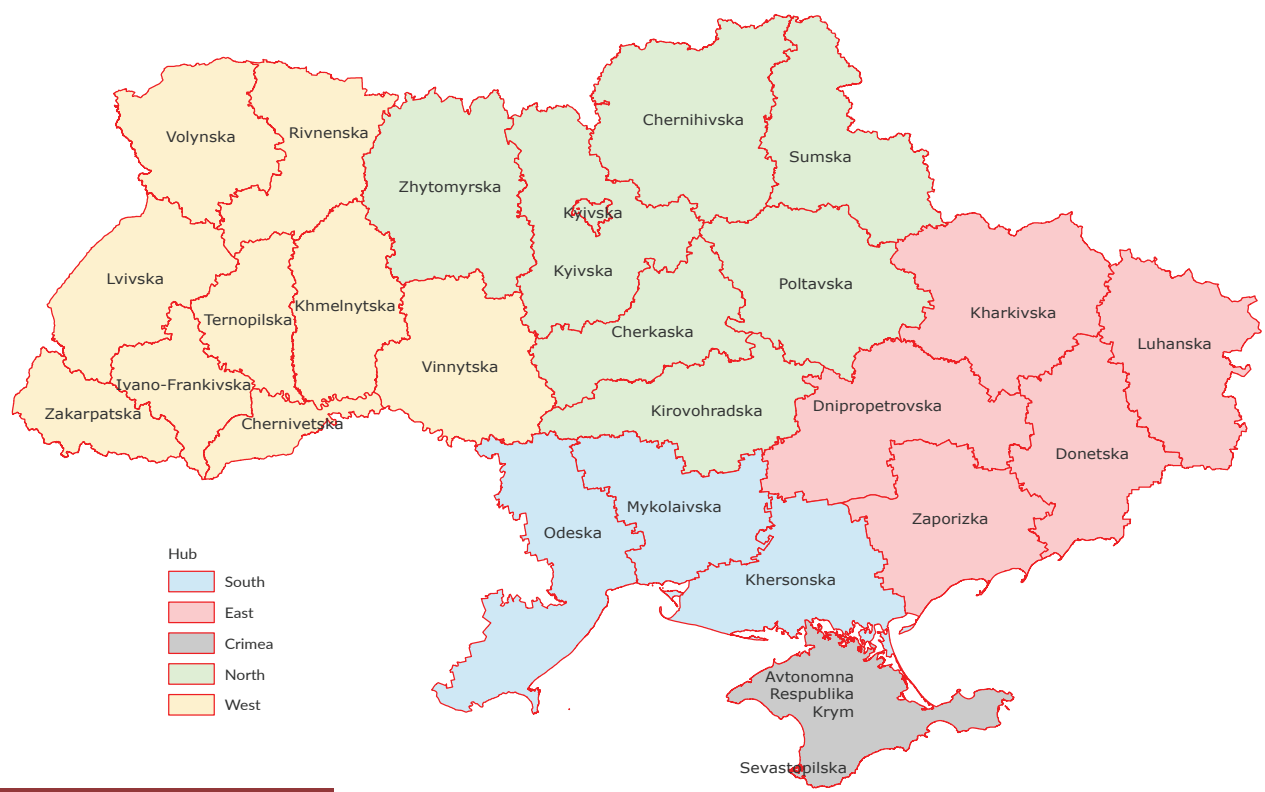

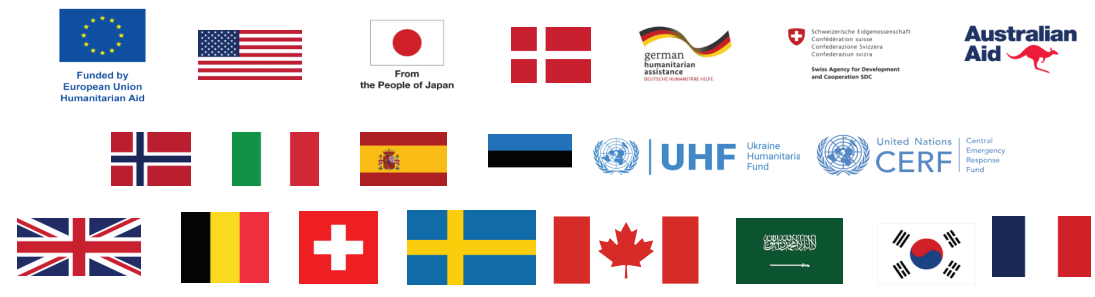




**2024 Cluster Coordination Hubs**
