<p>General Updates on situation and Shelter/NFI response and gabs in EI Geneina</p>	<p>Situational Overview: after the incident of 22nd of April at Krenik locality followed by big displacement, the Shelter/NFI sector response and gabs updates as follow:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The there's a multi sectoral and multi agencies assessment plus these distribution missions was happened on the 30th of April and it continues a 4th of May. the ESNFI sector, basically responded during and that incidence. at the beginning SORR has distributed 1000 NFI. Then from the first of May, again the NRC has distributed 1000 NFI for those affected population. So, both these 2000s at the very beginning of those responses. After that SORR has also distributed 3000 NFI kits all that from UNHCR stock. Number of HHs affected in Krenik, Abuja, Umdiwen, Umtajok and Murayat is 26.986. and number of shelters completely burned is 16.811 HHs, and shelters partially burned is 4.175 HHs. After the incident they was a response mission and also assessment at that time to identify the needs and gabs. from the 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Updates on stock availability and the access in the next meeting.

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	<p>ESNFI sector NRC, TGH were participated, and UNICEF also join. So recently OCHA has also published a report during that time from 17th of May to 19th of May.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Also, another assessment from the ESNFI sector conducted, because at the beginning it was difficult to know what the real affected population and what was the gap and what kind of response could be possible, during that time of assessment people tried to accumulate all those information from HAC, even from OCHA and also from our own assessment. Basically, ESNFI sector tried to assess the number of shelters, which is totally burned, and which is also partially burned • At Krenik, Abuja and Umdiwen, the affected household, is 20,986 that includes houses are partially burned and the totally burned houses also. At Murayat and Umtajok. Basically, these are the locality surrounding of Kreinik locality the affected household is 6000, this information we received from OCHA that includes totally burned and partially burned shelters. But still people do not have the proper access to access those localities and to do proper kind of assessment and verification. Also, from 17 May to 26th of May IOM has distributed 1300 NFI and 1500 ESK at Kreinik. 500 ESK have been distributed from SHF fund and UPO distributed 800 ESK. from Shelter/NFI sector side for NFI's up to now 7100 household reached and from the emergency shelter kit actually like 2000 household reached. So, this is the response up to now. The total gap remains for 12,000 household in Krenik, Abuja and Umdiwen and those surrounding villages.
