

Overview

As of April 2026, the Shelter and NFI response in northern Mozambique continues to face significant humanitarian pressure amid limited funding and access constraints. An estimated 904,000 people are in need of assistance, with 581,000 targeted for support; however, only 40,064 individuals (7%) had been reached. The response remains heavily underfunded, with only USD 20.1 million received against a requirement of USD 63 million, representing 31.9% funding coverage.

Response activities were largely concentrated in emergency assistance, particularly NFI kit distributions, while more durable shelter interventions remained limited. Caritas Nacala, NRC, and IOM were the leading implementing partners in terms of household reach. Geographically, the highest response coverage was recorded in districts such as Meluco, Metuge, and Memba, while major gaps persist in high-need districts including Macomia, Chiure, Mueda, and Ancuabe. Overall, humanitarian needs continue to exceed current operational capacity, highlighting the urgent need for additional funding, expanded access, and scaled-up shelter support.

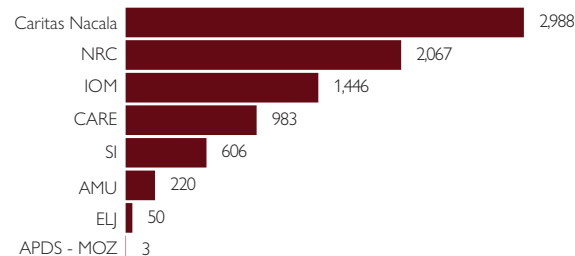

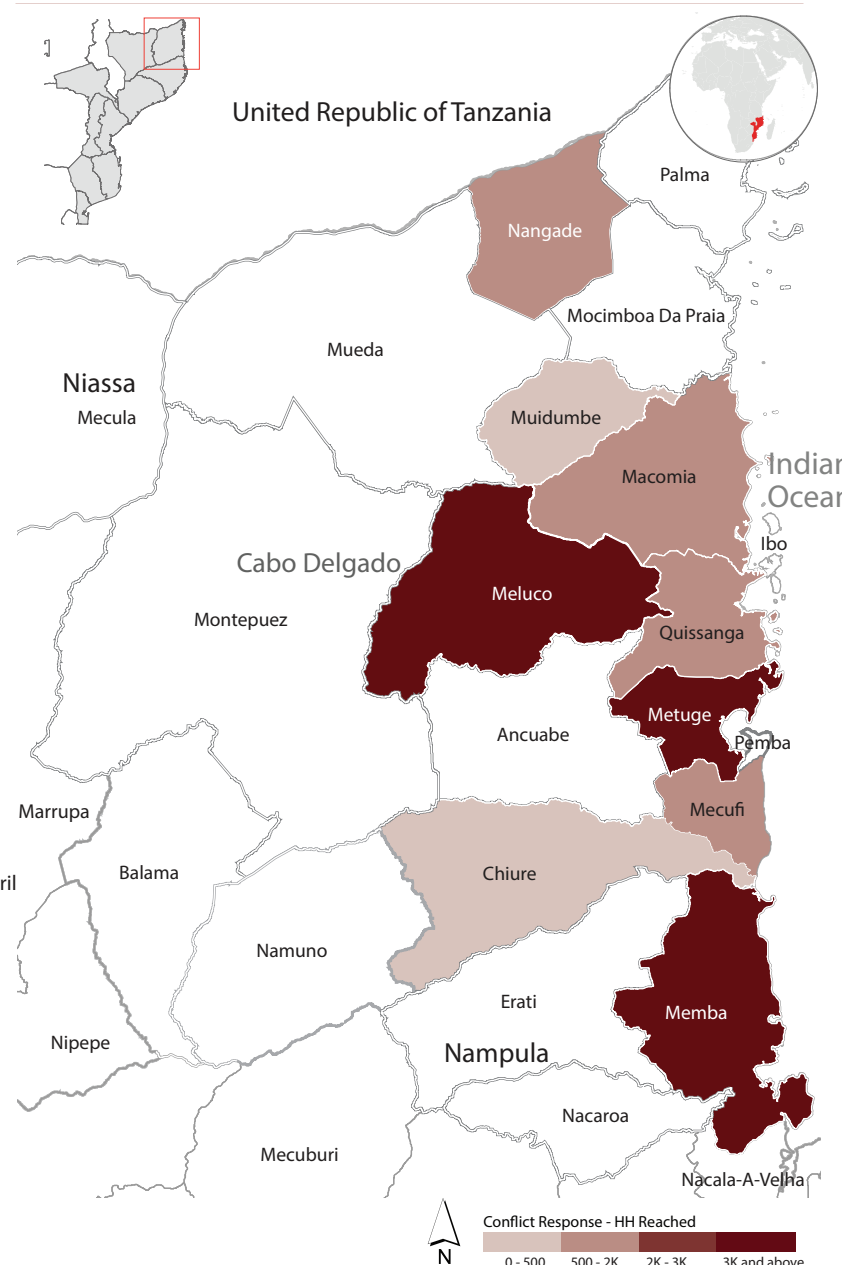

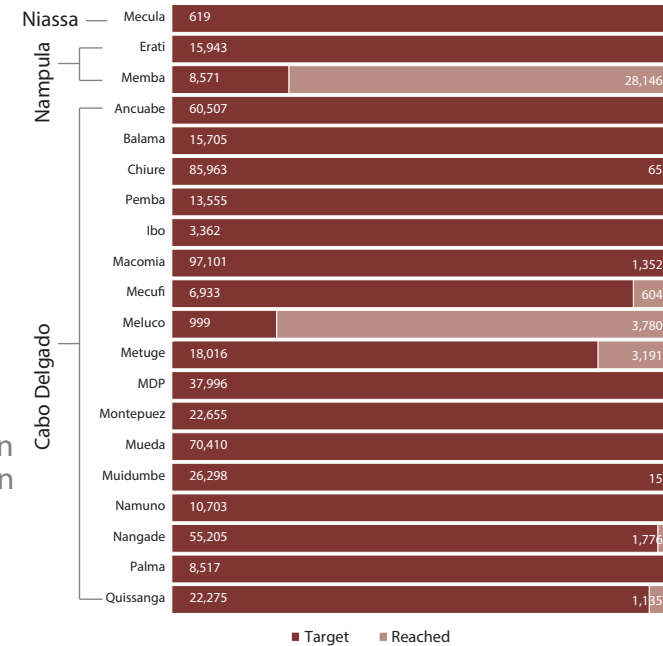
% of Household reached by partners
