

**Overview**

The Shelter Cluster's conflict response in northern Mozambique (February 2026) continues to face significant gaps despite ongoing efforts. An estimated 904,000 people are in need, with 581,000 targeted and 456,000 prioritized, yet only 21,014 individuals (3.6%) have been reached as of March 2026. Against a funding requirement of USD 63 million, only USD 3.3 million (5.2%) has been secured, severely limiting the scale of interventions. Response activities are concentrated in Cabo Delgado and parts of Nampula, particularly in districts such as Memba and Metuge, with moderate coverage in Nangade and Muidumbe, while many areas remain underserved. A total of 4,958 households have been assisted, primarily through NFI distributions, alongside emergency shelter kits, shelter repairs, and construction training. Implementation is led mainly by Caritas (47%), IOM (27%), and NRC (26%). However, major gaps persist, especially in Nampula, driven by critical funding shortfalls and limited operational capacity, constraining the cluster's ability to scale up and meet urgent shelter needs.

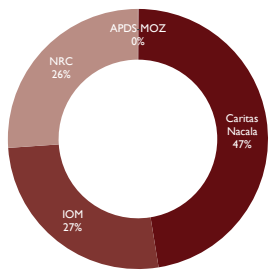

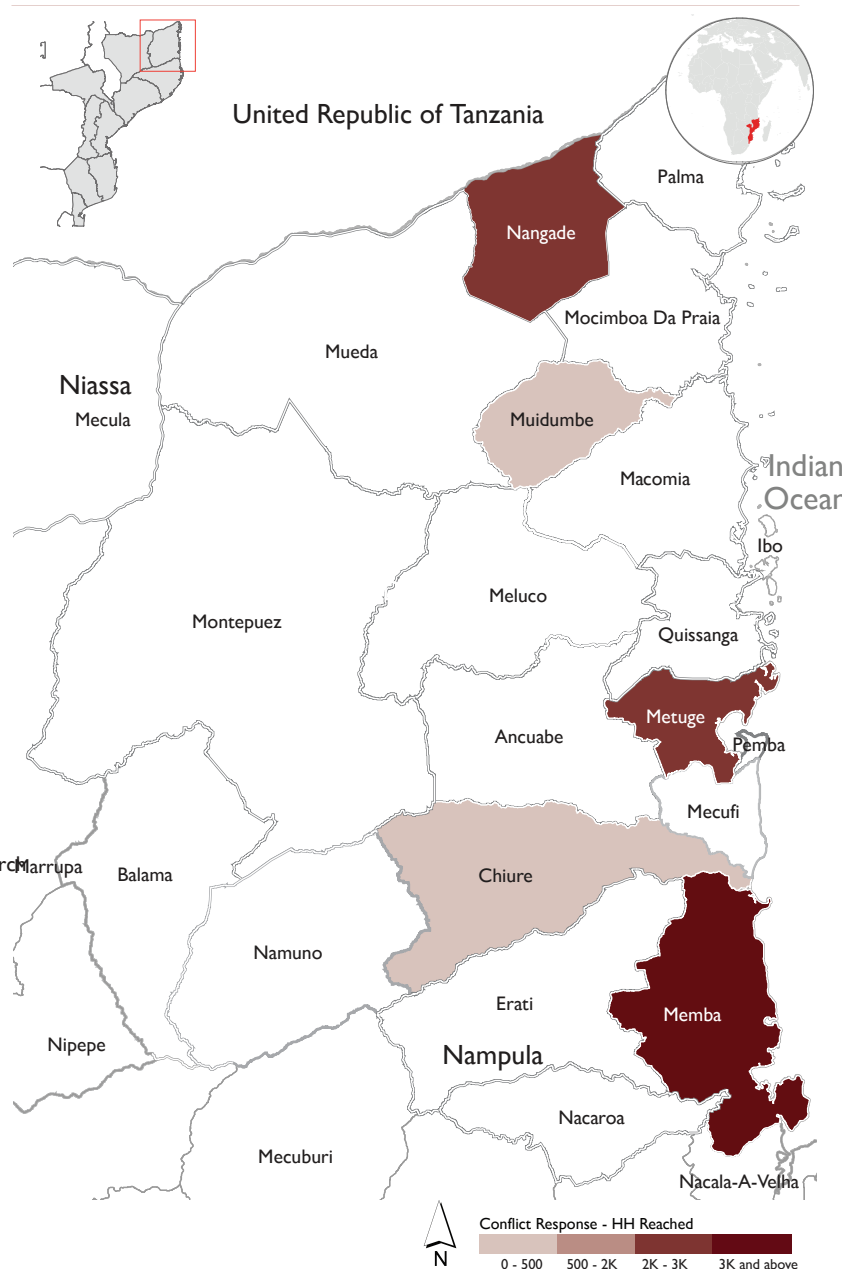

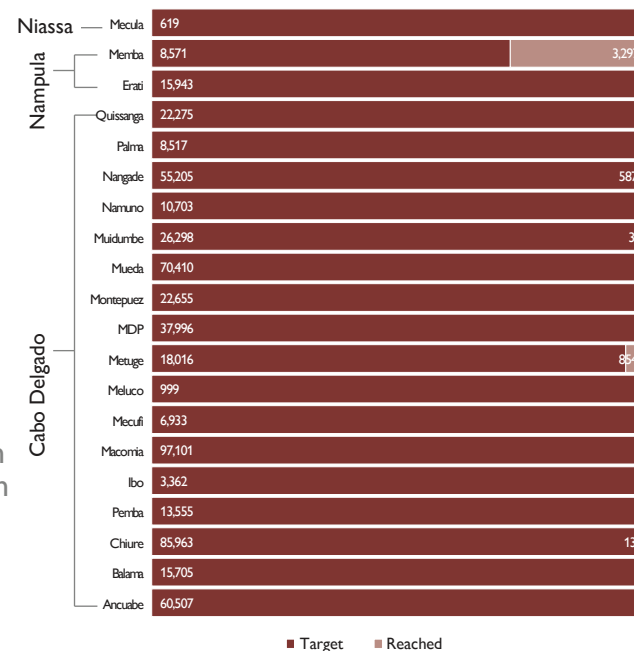
**% of Household reached by partners**
