

**Overview**

Despite funding constraints, the shelter and NFI response in Northern Mozambique has made important progress in reaching vulnerable populations. As of March 2026, 31,547 individuals have been assisted, reflecting steady implementation efforts under limited resources.

Operationally, partners have successfully established a strong presence in key districts, particularly in Memba, Metuge, and Mecufi, where assistance has been delivered at scale.

The response has been driven by effective partner engagement, with Caritas Nacala, IOM, and NRC leading implementation and collectively reaching the majority of assisted households.

In terms of assistance, the response has prioritized life-saving support through NFI distributions, reaching the largest number of households, alongside targeted shelter interventions such as repairs and privacy shelters.

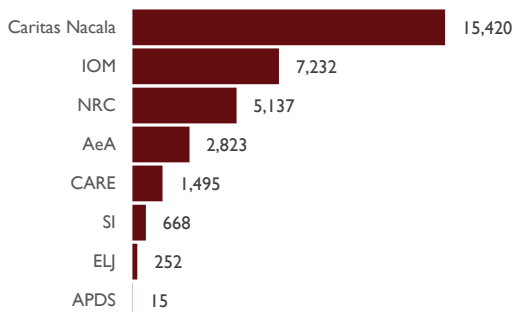

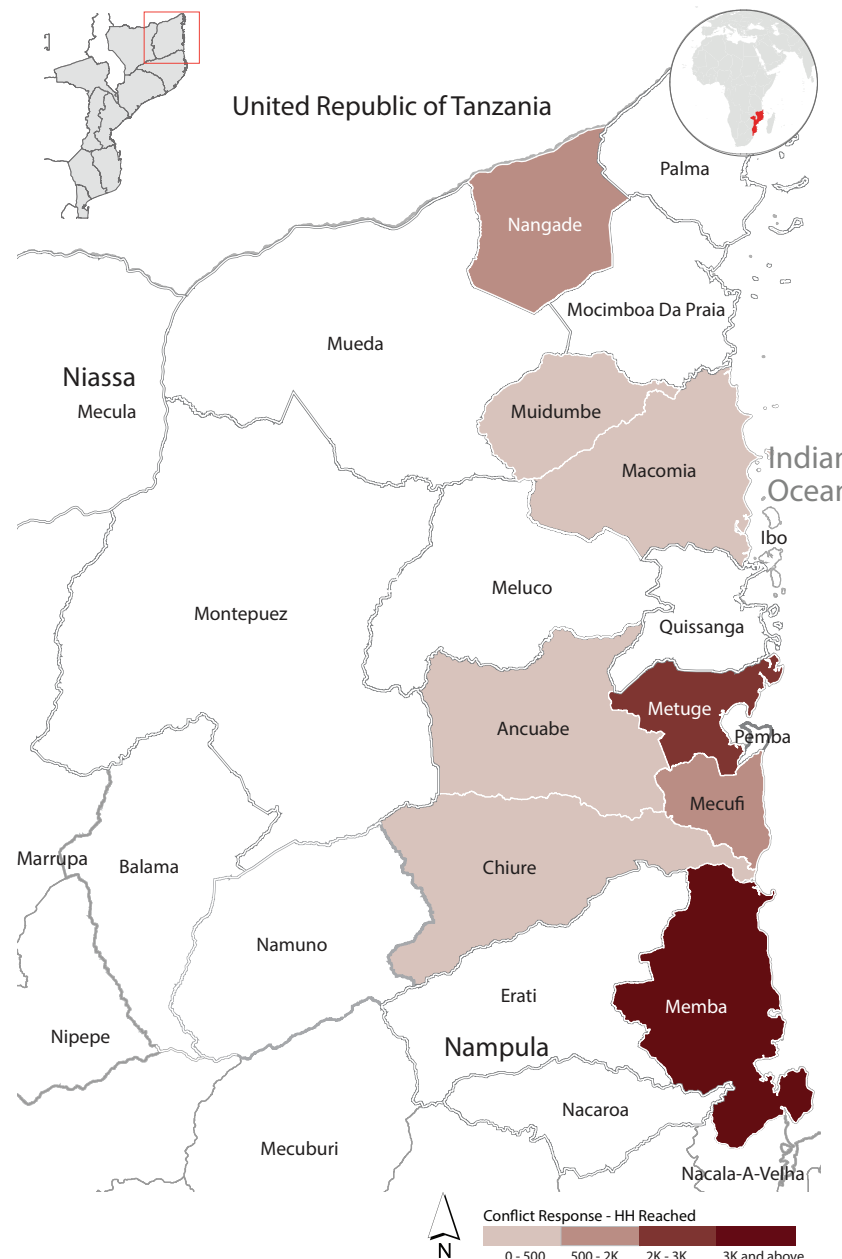

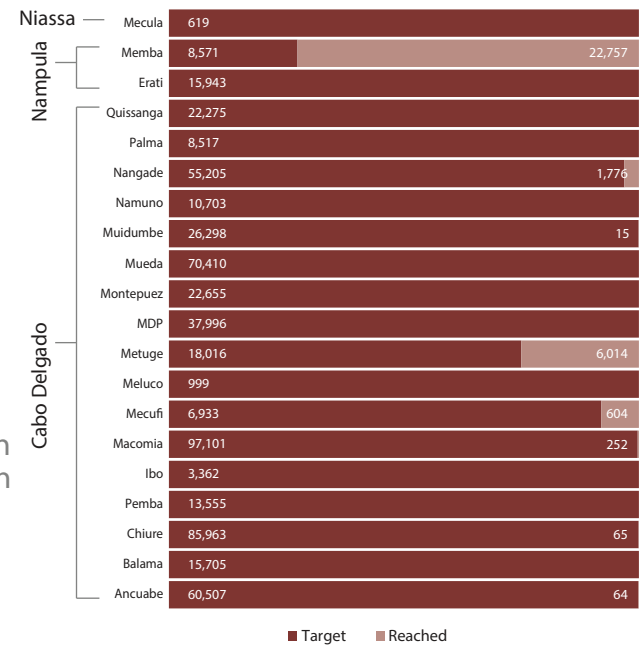
**Household reached by partners**

**Limitations**
