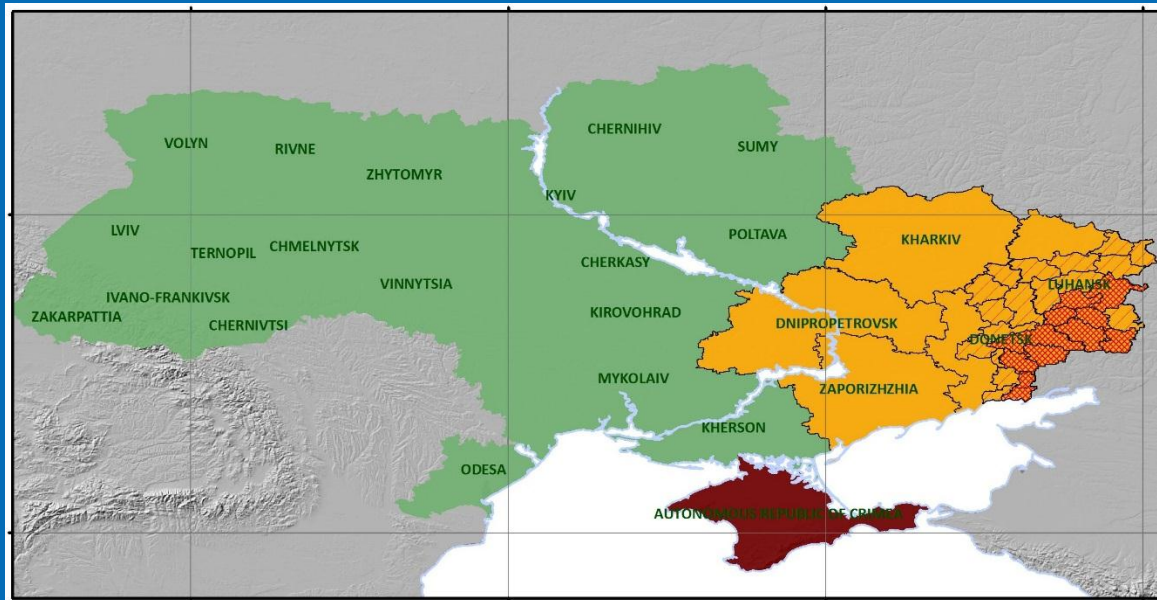

Achievements / Activities 2014

- Provision of clothes

 18,029 (reported) extra 22,000

- Other NFI

 107,708 indiv. (reported)

- Quick fix repairs for house in conflict area

 9,290 indiv (reported)

- Collective Centers repairs

 9,445 ind. with more 3,120





- Collective Center Management





 11,666 indiv.





- Cash assistances (winterization, social protection, etc.)

 32,318 indiv. - pending approval 31,000 more





Strategic Sectoral Objectives 2015

 1. Consolidating the assistance to IDP's stranded in the Displacement Area with preference for a monetization of help.

 2. In return area, direct physical support on house repairs and NFI delivering in order to stabilize the population who chose to return.

 3. Conflict Area: direct assistance with Acute Emergency kits (plastic sheeting /construction kits) and basic NFI kits according humanitarian access.

 4. Permanent shelter to be considered for small reconstruction and IDP's which could not return.

 5. Contingency plan and stockpile in case of protracted conflict with low-medium level of intensity leading to further instability.
