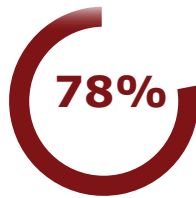
### Context

Since February 29, more than 15,000 people have had to flee the violence in the Port-au-Prince metropolitan area. Across the country, more than 362,000 people are currently displaced, many of whom have had to move several times to find refuge. Multiple displacements increase household vulnerability. The loss of goods and resources amplifies an already precarious economic situation. Each new location presents new adaptation challenges. Families must constantly adapt, raising stress and anxiety.

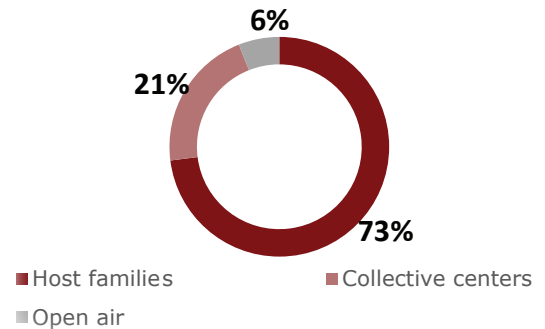

### Needs

- Non-food items such as: blankets, jerry cans, mats, kitchen kits;
- Rehabilitation of collective centers;
- Cash assistance to host families

### Response

Despite limited access, the partners were able to deliver assistance to the population, taking advantage of the opportunities for access.

- 68 households benefited from rent assistance;
- 5 sites benefited from the installation of solar street lamps;
- 10,179 people benefited from NFI;
- 104 households received transport assistance to reach a host family;
- 7 host families were assisted.

### Challenges

- Lack of partners with funding for shelter&BNA projects;
- Lack of security and access to IDP sites;
- Increased logistical costs, such as the price of truck rentals;
- Gang control of roads and demands for payment for passage, which complicates departures for the provinces.
