

# SOUTH SUDAN



## KEY ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE FIRST SIX MONTHS

Since the beginning of the conflict, Shelter NFI cluster partners within the Crisis Response Plan have reached over half a million people.

**102 144** families in need have received Non-Food Items (mosquito nets, blankets, buckets...), and **23 294** families have received shelter assistance.

These achievements represent 50% of the Non-Food Items (NFI) target, and 25% of the shelter target in the Crisis Response Plan.

## CONTEXT

The large-scale violence that has struck in the Republic of South Sudan since 15 December 2013 has deepened needs of hundreds of thousands of people. The humanitarian situation continues to deteriorate :

**1 102 643** people are internally displaced by violence.

**≈ 75 000** of them are sheltered in UN bases.



## CONFLICT-DRIVEN DISPLACEMENT

In the last six months, violence and fear have driven nearly 1,5 million people away from their homes. This includes an estimated 1,1 million internally displaced and over 350 000 who have fled to neighboring countries. Even more people could be on the move, given aid agencies' relatively limited information about conditions in some of the country's more remote and insecure areas.



To date, only 46% of the 2014 Crisis Response Plan requirement has been committed. More funding is needed to ensure sufficient supply, transport and human resources to meet urgent NFI and emergency shelter needs into the second half of the year, as the rains begin in earnest.

## 2014 TARGETS :

- Families in need supported with NFI **200 000**
- Families in need supported with Emergency Shelter **90 000**
- Families in need supported with Transitional Shelter **500**
