

Summary Note – Disaster Risk Reduction Planning in NE Nigeria

During the second half of 2025, UNDRR and the Global Shelter Cluster collaborated with the NE Nigeria CCCM/Shelter-NFI Sector on integrating disaster risk reduction (DRR) onto the management of IDP sites in the Northeast Nigeria states of Borno, Adamawa, and Yobe (the “BAY” states). A three-day workshop on DRR planning, held from 24 to 26 June 2025, in Maiduguri, Nigeria, was preceded by a scoping of stakeholders involved in humanitarian assistance and DRR in Nigeria and specifically in the BAY states. The workshop was followed by a webinar in September 2025 to review and validate the resulting hazard risk management plans.
