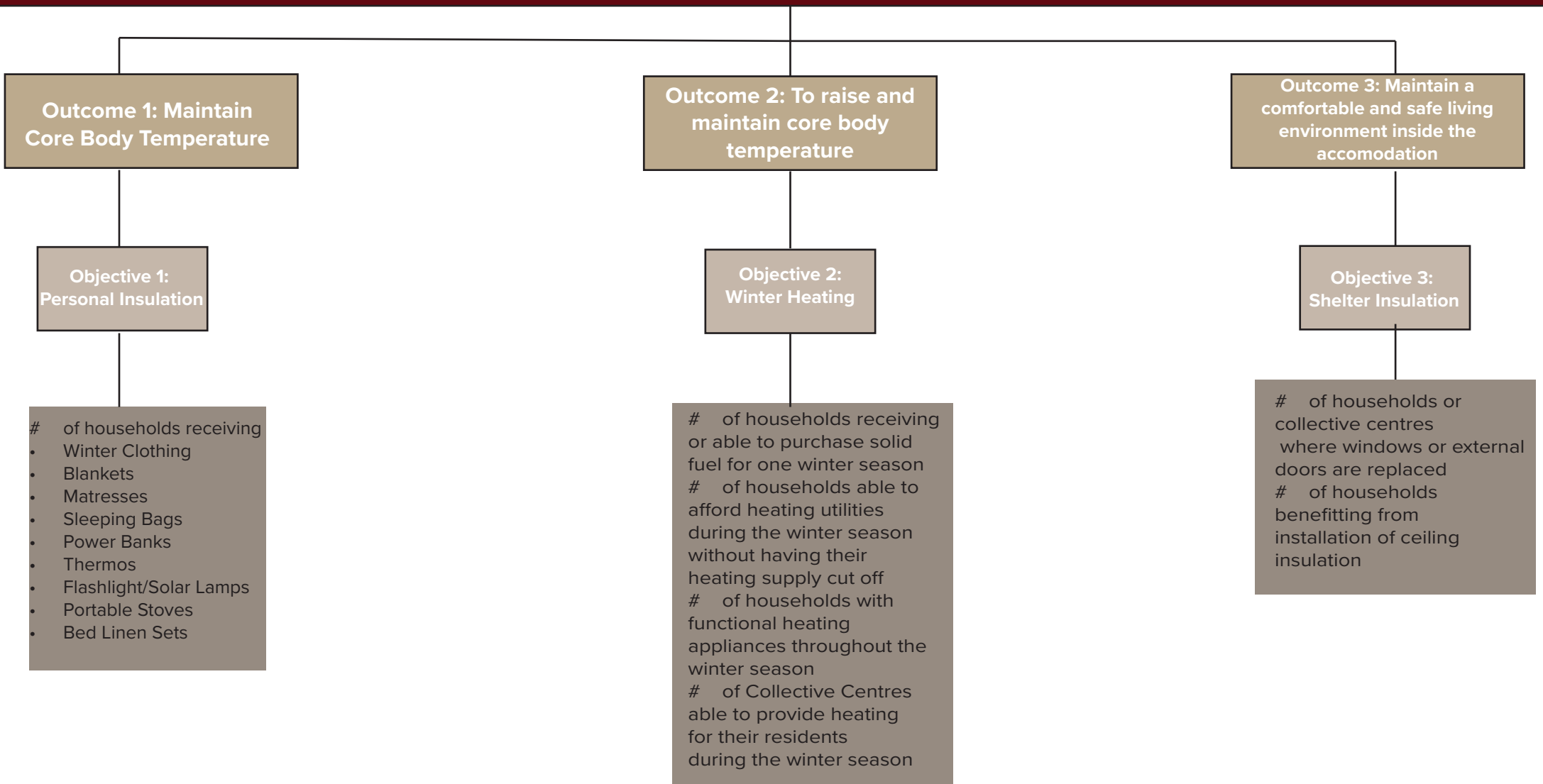


IMPACT: Thermal Comfort is improved



Inputs: Cash, In-kind Materials, Contracted Works with Suppliers, Monitoring of conditions, Protection Mainstreaming, Referrals to Other Clusters, Technical Assistance

Root causes of lack of thermal comfort: Living in war damaged or substandard accommodation, lack functional heating systems due to damage or decay, lack access to markets with sufficient quality and quantity of winter items or lack capacity to cover their own winter needs due to being in one of the prioritized groups for winter response: displaced families living in substandard housing or collective sites and non-displaced or returnee war affected people living in damaged houses and have one or more of the following vulnerabilities: Individuals with Health Conditions (e.g., disabilities, chronic illness), Older Persons (aged 60 and above), At-Risk Women and Girls (e.g., single female-headed households, pregnant women, girls at risk), Minority and Diverse Groups (e.g., Roma, Crimean Tatars, LGBTIQ+ individuals), Children and Families (e.g., children at risk, families with young children, foster families), Economically Vulnerable Individuals (e.g., those facing socio-economic hardship, unemployed families).
