

# Ukraine S/NFI Cluster Meeting

### 1 Response Update

- The IMO presented the 5Ws reporting results as of the 19th of August. Emphasis was made on the need of better regular weekly reporting by partners to reflect response achievements and gaps.
- It was also noted that OCHA will be introducing a new tool to be used nation-wide to show the stock of NFIs in regard of winterization and asked partners provide their winterization targets, activities and figures on stock and pipeline.

### 2 Winterization Planning Update

- The IMO presented the Winterization Response commitments by partners. As of the 19th of August, partners have committed to provide SNFI support to 992,827 individuals
- An ongoing request for information persists from oblast authorities to SNFI partners to report on winter targets per oblast, as such the cluster is requesting partners to provide a segregation per oblast for their winter targets.
- The Shelter Cluster Team will be following up closely with partners on winterization targets, and on reporting activities in the 5W's.
- A series of meeting were held with the Deputy Prime Minister (Ms Vereshchuk), where the shelter cluster presented winterization updates. Continued request to expand outreach and detailed winter planning and implementation updates has been requested.
- The Shelter Cluster will take part in the Cash Working Group Meeting to discuss on cash for utilities and planned cash activities under winter response.
- The Shelter Custer Winterization Guideline are currently being finalized and will be translated.
- The Representative from the Ministry of Reintegration of Temporarily Occupied Territories (MTOT) suggested that the majority of the 500,000 new IDPs can be accommodated in educational establishments as 50-60 % of them will teach on-line. These facilities are to be equipped to be adequate for living conditions.
- MTOT representative also presented an estimated case load of 20,000 elderly, immobile and / or people with disabilities among the new IDPs and voiced the need for special accommodation, accompaniment / support for such persons and asked if Cluster can help provide such assistance.
- MTOT representative also added that with approaching winter, the following heating needs were identified in Kharkivska, Dnipropetrovvska, Zaporizka, Khersonska oblasts: 1-1.2 million m3 of firewood and around 170,000 burzhuika stoves. The MTOT representative also announced a request that will be coming from the authorities to the Cluster to see if assistance can be provided following the request.

- Pavlo Kozyriev suggested to CF “Vidbuduiemo razom” and other partners who voiced concerns on winterization in southeast part of Ukraine to reach out and refer to him personally on matters related to IDPs.

### 3 Update from the Logistics Cluster

- The subnational logistics cluster coordinator presented on the current capacity and operation of the Logistics Cluster. Namely the storage service is as follows: Odesa – 10,000 m2. Dnipro – 5,000 m2 (incl. 33 m2 / 88m3 temperature-controlled reefer container). Kyiv – 2000 m2. Kropyvnytskyi – 1000m2.
- In addition, what was also emphasized is that the warehouses are being reorganized as part of preparation for winterization and the fleet capacity will be increased from 10 to 25 trucks to be used for inter-agency convoys among other things. He also invited partners to participate in Cluster meetings to better inform the Cluster response.
- A question was raised on whether it was feasible for the logistics cluster to help partners deliver solid fuel as part of winterization activities. It was reminded that the Cluster is a provider of last resort, but this can also be discussed separately.
- The subnational logistics cluster coordinator reminded that the needs in transportation services of solid fuel from the west to the east of Ukraine were already voiced and urged the stakeholders and namely SC Coordinator to give feedback by Tuesday.

### 4 Update from Sub-National Hubs

- Following a meeting with oblast authorities the subnational coordinator in Vinnytsia, presented updates. The authorities expect anywhere from 10,000 to 30,000 new IDPs. Current capacity in the region is 2285 beds. The authorities identified 91 facilities and they believe that after light humanitarian interventions in these it would be possible to double the overall capacity.
- Action point: to have discussion in sub-national cluster meeting on assessment of the above-mentioned facilities.
- The subnational coordinator in Dnipro updated on developments in the east. After meeting with Kharkiv authorities it was agreed upon information sharing by local authorities towards the SNFI Cluster in order to see the gaps in response.

### 5 Presentation from Youth Council, City of Kharkiv

- The presentation was around the activities, which the volunteer group are currently implementing in Kharkiv. These include upgrading basements, distribution of food, NFIs and medicine.

- Olha (URCS) express interest in coordination with Cluster Partners regarding Winterization activities.
