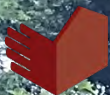

# Critical issues and response needs

## Critical issues



### Vulnerable informal settlements in high-risk areas

Vulnerability to disasters



### Limited availability of Temporary Shelters

People affected by disasters, people on the move with a focus on returnees, survivors of GBV and victims of human trafficking.



### Limited access to energy

Protection and intersectoral impacts especially in remote areas: impacts on food security, water systems, education activities



### Access to specific basic equipment & NFIs

For sleeping, protecting from insects, ventilating, lighting and refrigerating food, mitigating protection risks.



### Critical conditions in institutions

Infrastructure, access to energy and equipment of institutions that provide essential services to the population

## Response

### Risk preparedness and management

Safe construction, early warning systems, capacities of state institutions

### Management of Temporary Shelters

Strengthening State Capacities: Preparedness, rehabilitation and equipment

### Sustainable energy alternatives

Alternatives for energy generation and lighting

### Distributions of basic equipment & NFI

Mattresses, mosquito nets, fans and solar lamps, stoves, cooling alternatives.

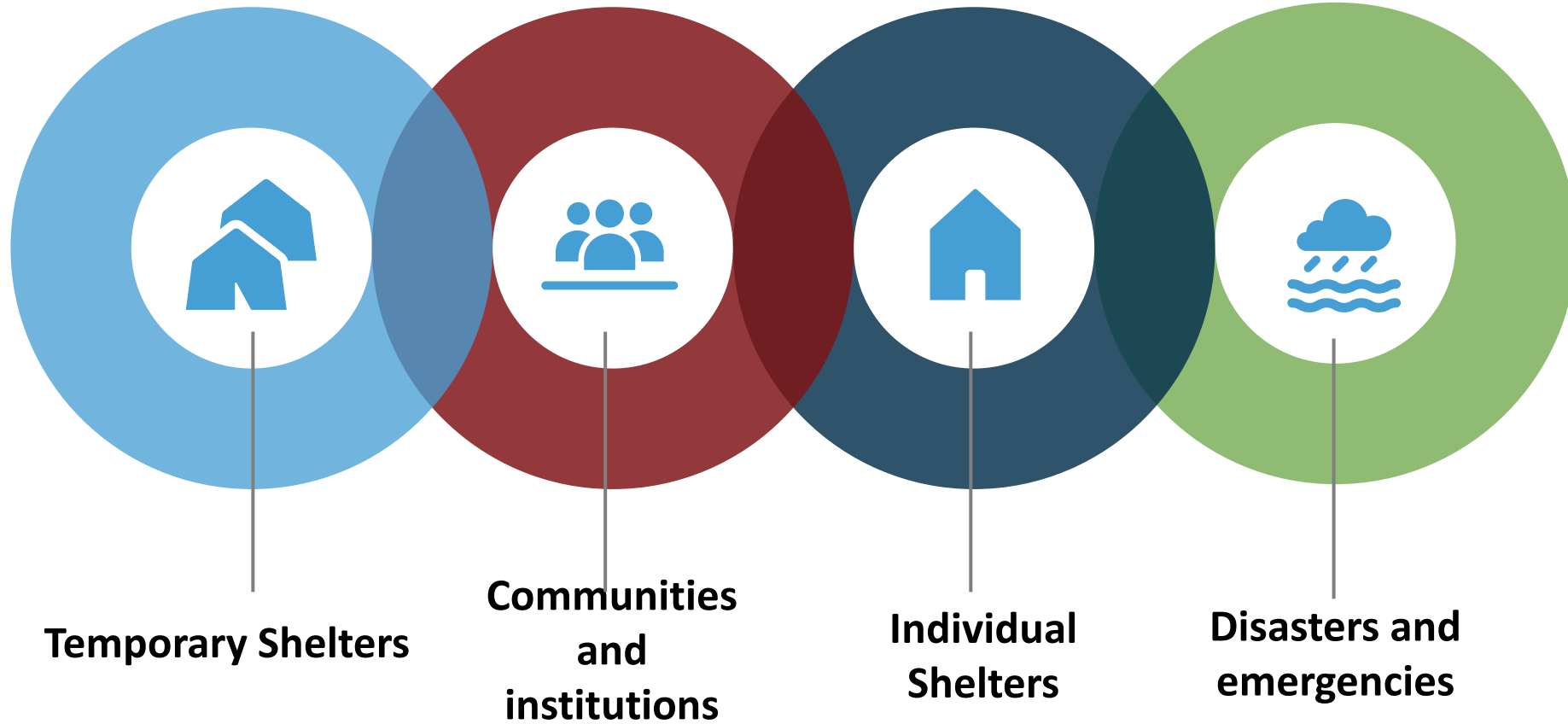
### Strengthening institutions

Focus on facilities providing critical health services, remote areas and school canteens.



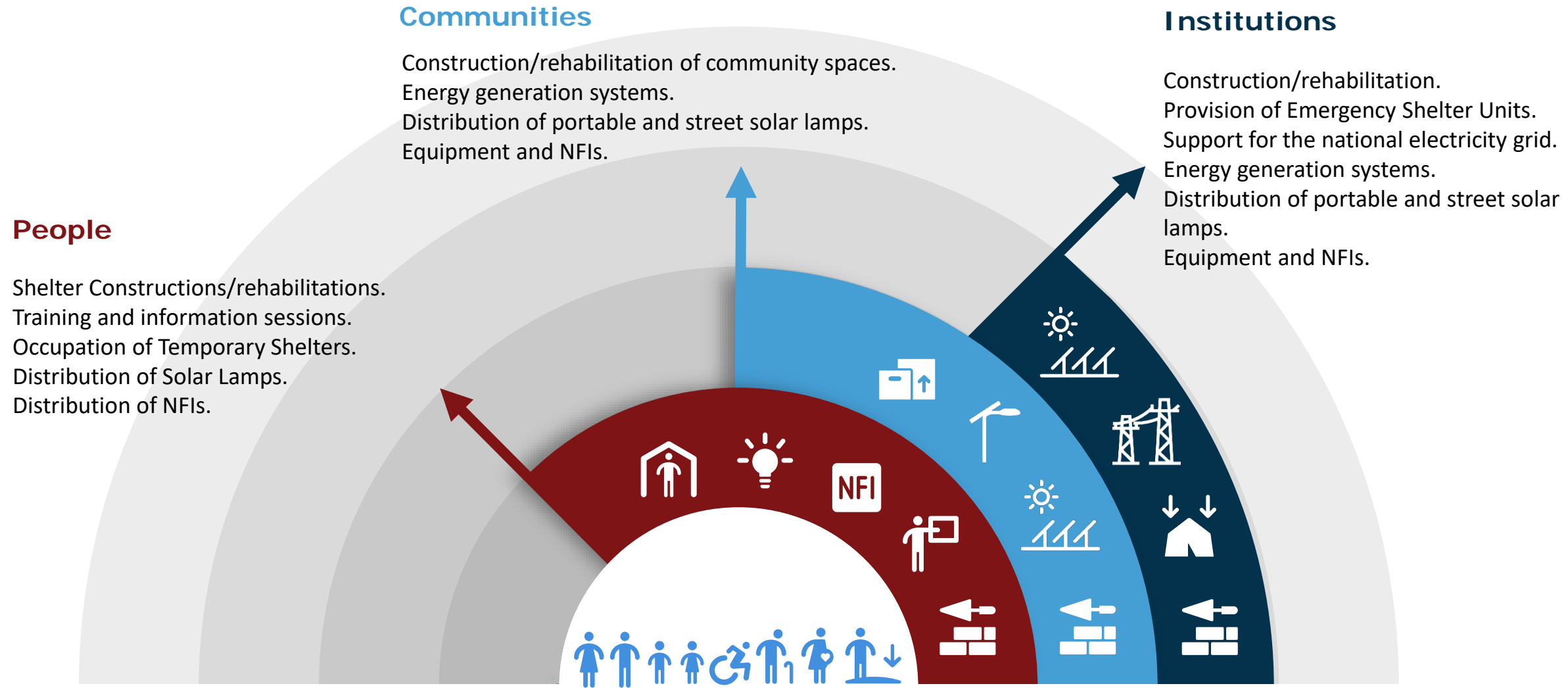

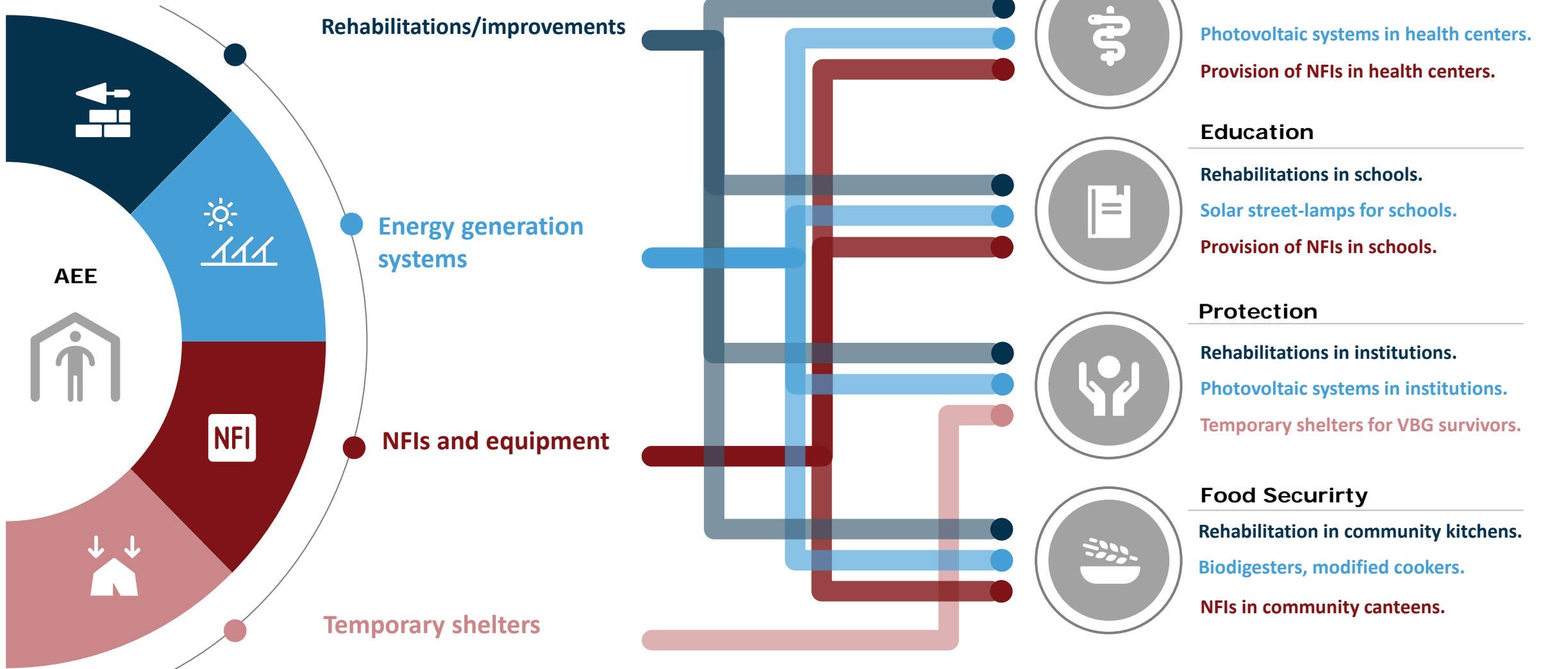

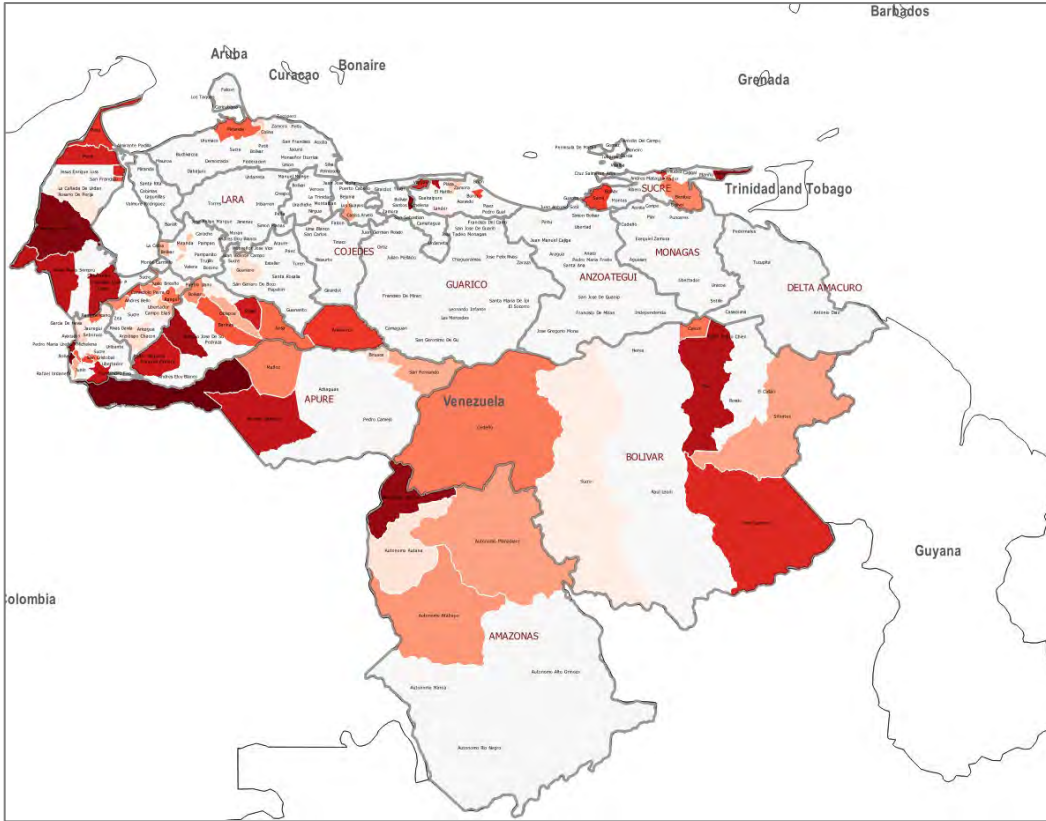

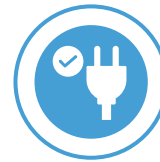

**POSSIBLE AREAS OF COLLABORATION**

# 1. Disaster Prevention and Risk Mitigation

Vulnerable populations in Shelters exposed to risks of natural and man-made hazards. Needs to strengthen National Risk Management and Early Warning Systems



## 2. Energy Needs in Remote Communities

Remote indigenous communities with **no access to the national electricity grid** and exposed to protection risks. Impacts on food security, lack of continuity of health services, education, water pumping and livelihoods.



### 3. Support in Collective Accommodation Spaces

Rehabilitation, access to basic services and management needs on Temporary Shelters for people affected by disasters associated with natural causes



## 4. Infrastructure in Spaces for Basic Services

Schools, Health Centers and Community Centers with damages in infrastructure, limited equipment, and lack of maintenance during the pandemic. The most vulnerable population have limited access to basic services.

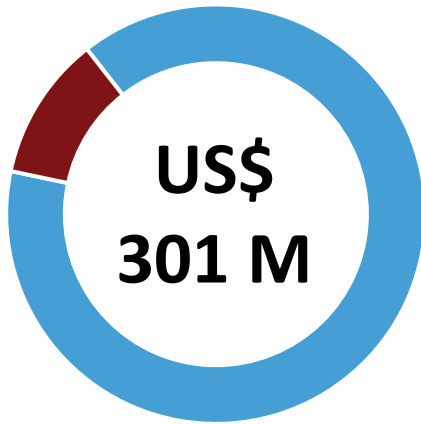

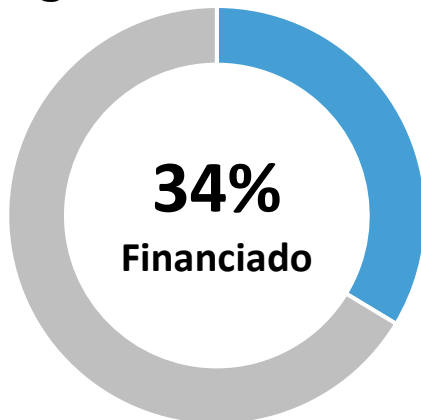

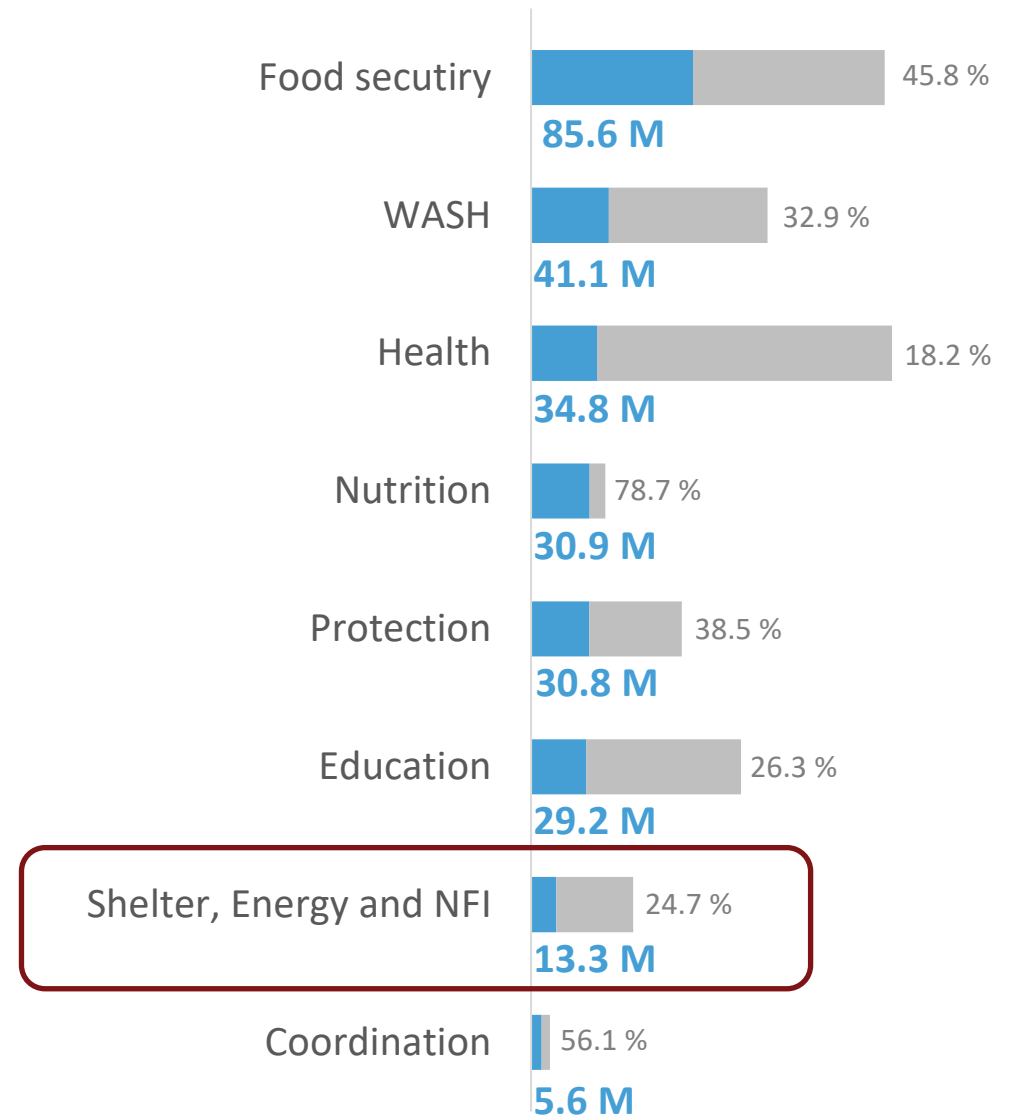

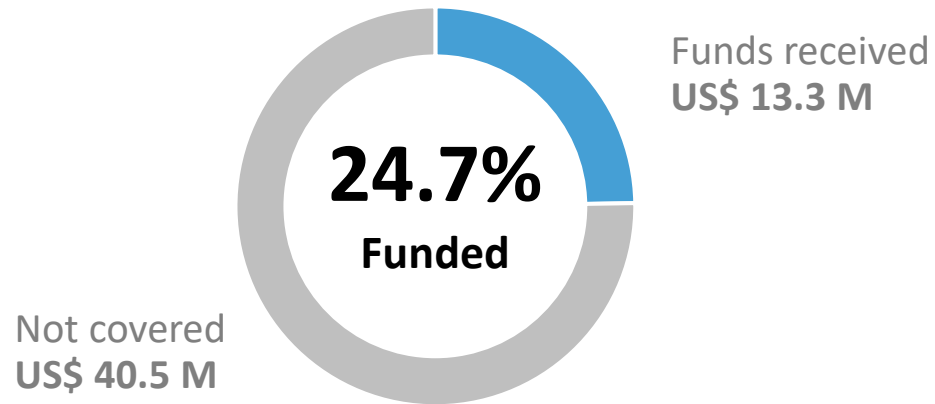

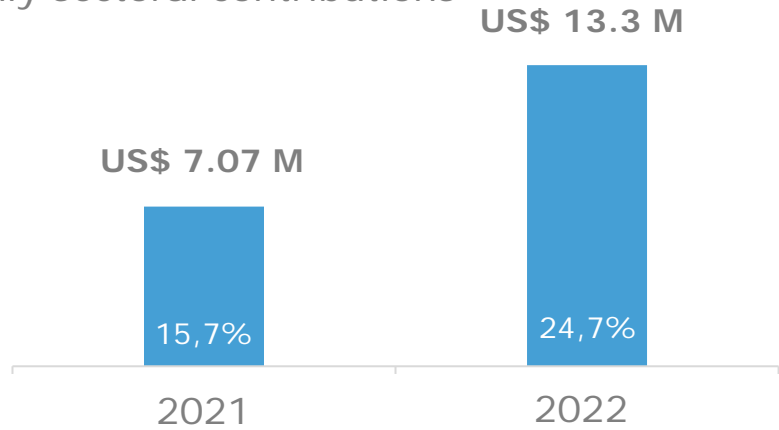

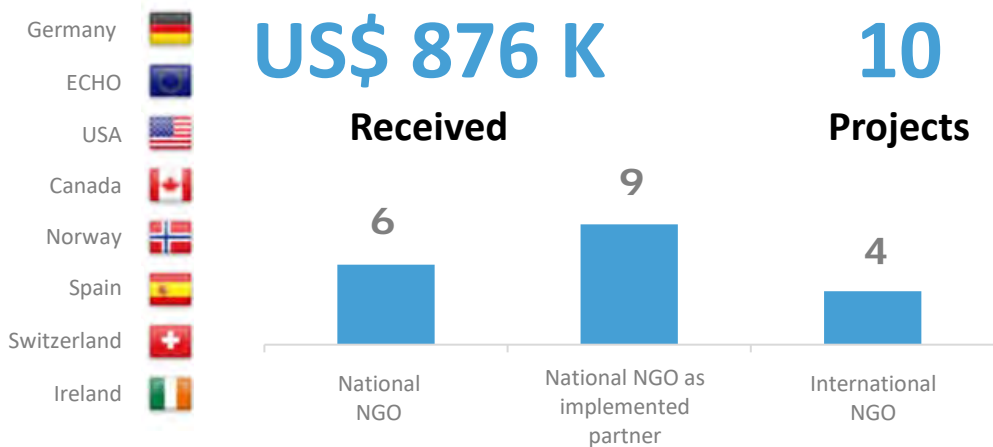
## Financing trend for the sector:

Only sectoral contributions



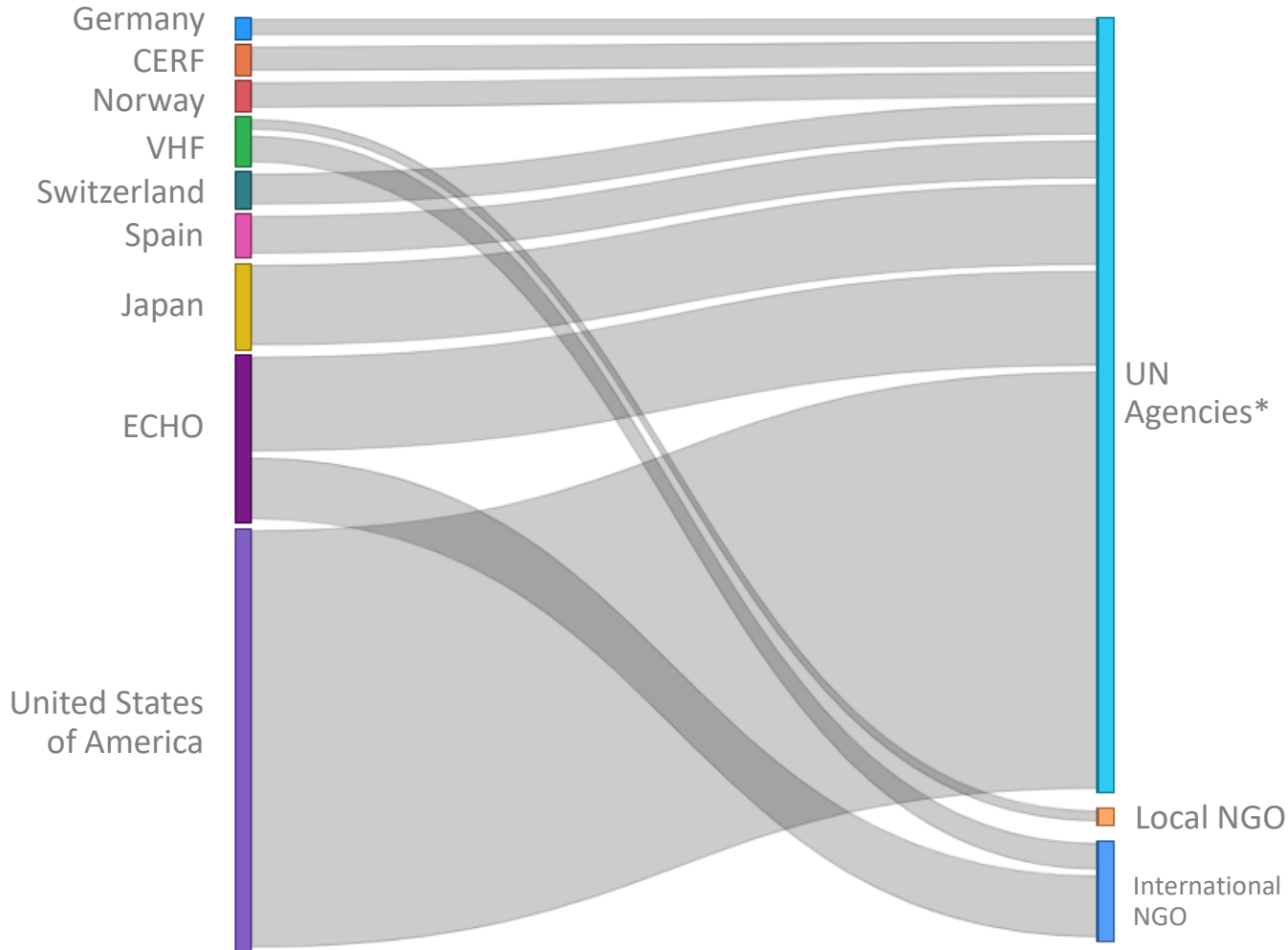
