1. Collective Centres

CCCM coordinated document on minimum standards for collective centres

- Minimum standards for collective centres have been finalised (see presentation).
- It was noted that the cluster should work on reaching national minimum standards which are higher than Sphere standards if people are going to stay for long.
- The minimum standards document is a living document and partners can share their comments and inputs.

CCCM assessments planning for collective centres

- Working Groups on specific topics (e.g GBV) have been established.
- Update on assessments from CCCM cluster
- CCCM is in the first phase of rapid assessments
- Mapping of master list of sites is ongoing
- CCM aims to have a proper site monitoring tool

TWiG Collective centres database update

- The W/G MOU has been revised. The draft version is shared on google drive.
- The TWiG meeting is held every Friday at 11am

2. Response update

- 278,330 persons assisted by the Shelter and NFI cluster partners since 25 of February
- 131,703 assisted people with NFI kits in collective centers
- 118,745 assisted people with NFI kits at household level
- 55,787 assisted people with shelter kits

- 7,148 received winterization support (approx.)
- 15,218K assisted persons/week as reported
- Reduced by 10k)
- On the reduced number of people reached, partners were asked if there are any challenges in the response or if this was due to low reporting.
- New Way noted that they are waiting for new funding while other partners stated that they are in the procurement process.

Partners operational presence: as of 13th May



- The 3W reporting schedule remains the same – every week due to the request from the government.

3. Partners updates

PIN Slovakia

PIN conducted a needs assessment in late April

Main Findings:

- Widespread tensions between IDPs and host community as a result of limited support for the host community
- Some centres have no gender divisions

Recommendations

- Start Cash programmes for host communities to cover utility costs

The environmental focal point-OCHA

- OCHA is reaching out to partners to identify what they are doing in terms of the environment and how to integrate environmental issues in humanitarian planning and response.
- OCHA is also offering technical support and guidance to clusters on environmental issues.
