### Overview

The Shelter & Non-Food Items (SNFI) Sector estimates that 5.14 million people across Syria will face heightened vulnerability during the 2025-2026 winter season due to inadequate shelter conditions, limited access to heating fuel, and insufficient essential NFIs. The sector aims to reach 2.02 million individuals with prioritized winter assistance. However, the current funding outlook remains critically low — leaving millions at risk of exposure to freezing temperatures, preventable illnesses, and negative coping mechanisms.

If urgent funding is not mobilized, thousands of vulnerable households — particularly in high-altitude, snow-prone, and recently displaced areas — may face life-threatening conditions this winter.

### Urgent Needs

To address the escalating humanitarian risks this winter, the Shelter/NFI Sector urgently requires support for the following life-saving interventions:

- Heating Fuel and Stoves:** Essential to mitigate severe cold exposure and health risks in addition to ensure safe, adequate heating for households residing in damaged, substandard, or uninsulated shelters.
- Winter Clothing Kits:** Essential to protect children, the elderly, and persons with disabilities from extreme cold.
- Comprehensive Winterization Kits:** Including thermal blankets, mattresses, plastic sheeting, and carpets to enhance warmth and insulation.
- Cash for Winter Assistance:** Standardized transfer value of USD 230 per household, enabling access to winter essentials through local markets.
- Fuel Alternatives and Insulation Support:** Promoting biomass and pistachio shells as sustainable heating options while reinforcing shelter protection.

### Situation Overview and Funding Update

As winter approaches, the vulnerable populations in Syria face severe challenges that threaten their survival and well-being. This advocacy note outlines the critical need for immediate and comprehensive winterization assistance to protect lives and alleviate suffering among displaced and host communities.

An estimated USD 112 million is needed to provide essential winter assistance to 2.1 million individuals and respond to winter-related emergencies.

### Call to Action


We urgently appeal to donors and the international community to:
