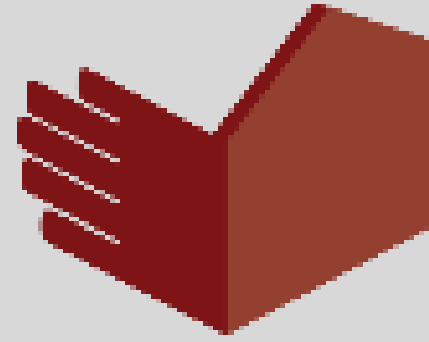

UNHCR

- During reporting period, UNHCR managed to reach 480 HH, 2,767 individuals mainly refugees, asylum seekers, migrants and IDP's.
- 13 individuals out of the 2,767 have been reached at a Ejdabya detention center in the East, 166 HH (1,057) individuals reached at CDC, Whereas 314 HH (1,655 individuals) were internally displaced persons targeted at Atibm Souq Alahad, Atib IDP camps & Alasaba city.
- During the month a total of Cris and HKs and 14,311 have been distributed at the CDC, DCs, IDP camps and in the urban settings.



2. PARTNER UPDATE

NRC- Shelter updates

Projects charged to UNHCR:

1. Tender evaluation is completed for the first package of work; rehabilitation and upgrade of 24 houses at Alsabrie, 2 camp infrastructure, and 30 shelter unit at Al Hilies, Benghazi. Contract signing is ongoing for camp infrastructures and shelter units in Al Hilies, however for the housing units in Al Sabrie we're negotiating the timeline and the price with the selected bidder in order to proceed with signing the contract. Expected starting date for the work is mid of next week.
2. Rehabilitation of 41 houses at Al Sabrie; technical assessment is completed, BoQs and scope of work are completed. All documents shared with UNHCR and approved – the tender will be advertised this week.
3. For infrastructure works in Tripoli, tender has been advertised, shelter team facilitated and joined site visits with contractors and the last day for submission of offers will be on Thursday 12 August

Projects charged to other donors:

1. Rehabilitation and upgrade of two health centers in Al Hadba and Mashroe Zerae- Tripoli; tender has been advertised, shelter team facilitated and joined site visits with contractors and the last day for submission of offers will be on Thursday 12 August
2. Rehabilitation of housing units - Benghazi: Registration and vulnerability assessment for HHs in Gamminess and Benena is ongoing, technical assessment is ongoing in parallel
3. Rehabilitation of housing units – Tripoli: working on registering potential beneficiaries through community focal points and local councils, vulnerability assessments started for HHs identified in Abu Salim (AL Khalatat area). Site visits are planned to be conducted next week to areas with potential HHs rehabilitation in Qasr bin Gasher.

2021 MSNAs Update

Quantitative data collection – Refugees and Migrants

- Final sample: 1554 respondents
 - 780 West and Central Africa
 - 577 MENA
 - 101 East Africa
 - 96 South East Asia

 - West: 965 interviews
 - East: 440 interviews
 - South: 149 interviews
-
- All data are indicative only
 - Recommended aggregation levels:
 1. Mantika level
 2. National level, per region of origin
 3. National level, per gender
 4. National level

- Dataset disseminated on August 10, results tables to be published on August 16

Quantitative data collection – Libyan population

- Final sample: 8871 household surveys
 - 2731 IDP households
 - 2173 Returnee households
 - 3967 Non-displaced households
- 45 Baladiyas covered
- Aljufra dropped from sample due to falsification issues
- All data is non-representative
- Weights attached to sample to correct for overrepresentation of certain displacement status groups or baladiyas → please make sure to use the weights when using the dataset.
- Dataset disseminated Aug 10. Results tables with weighted results will be distributed Monday 16

Qualitative data collection – Refugees and Migrants

General plan: Focus on accommodation, livelihoods, and access to services/assistance

Data collection on SNFI:

- **Levels of analysis**
 - Context level: Rental market, documentation
 - Neighbourhood level: Area segregation and implications
 - Individual level: Impact of inadequate housing, identification of vulnerable groups
- **Methodology:** KIs (various profiles) and FGDs with specific subgroups
- **Scope:** based on quantitative findings and interest by the sector

Timeline:

- Preliminary consultations ongoing
- Draft tools by end of August (expected)
- Data collection starting in mid-September

Qualitative data collection – Libyan population

Overall plan:

- Prong 1: Sectoral follow-ups based on quantitative data
 - Prong 2: Case studies to highlight specific issues

Data collection on SNFI:

- **Prong 1:** Potential sectoral follow-up, TBD next week
- **Prong 2:** Assessment on power network in Libya
 - Topics/research questions:
 - Access to power: multiple sources; connections; payment
 - Consistency of access
 - Impact on service provision
 - Relation to hot water access
 - Proposed methodology: KIIs with local representatives/stakeholders & FGDs with households with limited access (as per quantitative data)
 - Scope: flexible, based on interests

3. SNFI NEEDS OVERVIEW

Changes in context / situation over the last 12 months - direct impact on SNFI sector:

IDP, host and returnees

- **More returns, less IDPs**
- **More forced evictions**
- **Higher % of IDPs rental accommodation, but falling rental prices**
- **No compensation assistance from the Government despite formation of GNU, UXO contamination**
- **Damage to public infrastructure and housing main barrier for return**

Refugees, asylum seekers and migrants

- **More in detention**
- **Continued barriers to rental market**
- **Increased 'pressure' from local authorities**
- **Reduction in employment opportunities due to C-19**

- **11% increase in MEB**
 - **COVID-19**
 - **Devaluation of LYD**
- **Easing of liquidity crisis?**



3. SNFI NEEDS OVERVIEW

Impact on SNFI sector:

IDP, host and returnees

- **More in need of help to reconstruct**
- **More living in damaged, inadequate housing**
- **Secondary displacement from forced eviction**
- **Continued rental burden**
- **Less access to essential household items**

Refugees, asylum seekers and migrants

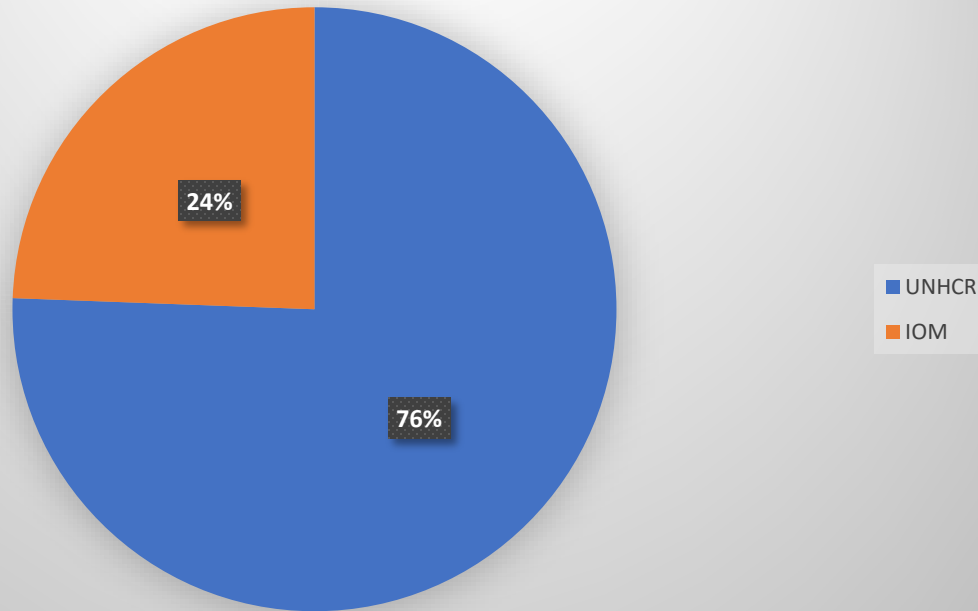
- **More 'stranded' in Libya**
- **High number in inadequate housing**
- **Impact of no formal or written tenancy agreements?**



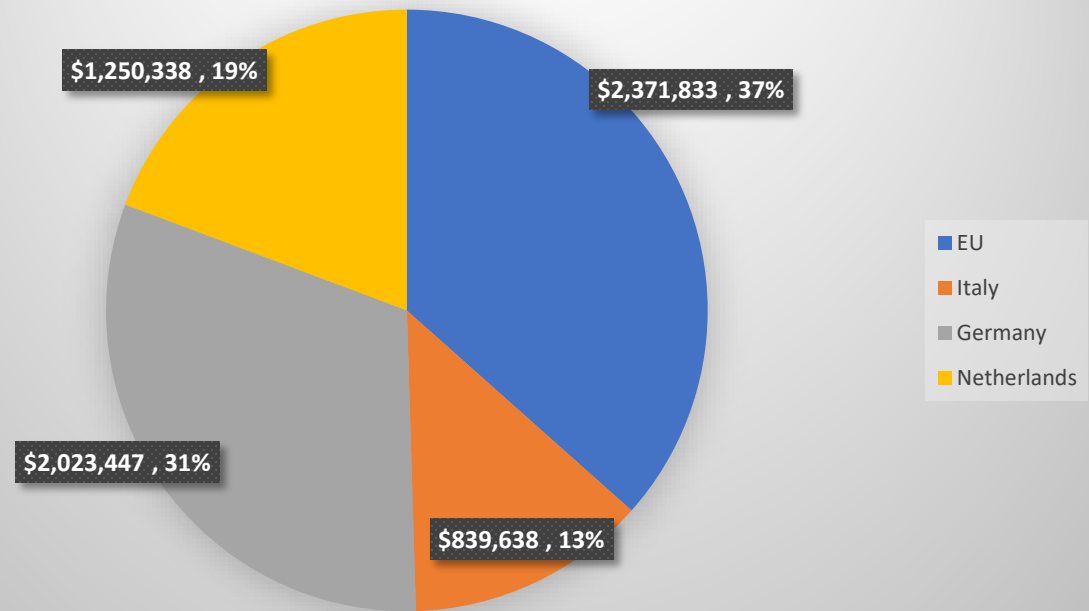
4. SECTOR UPDATE

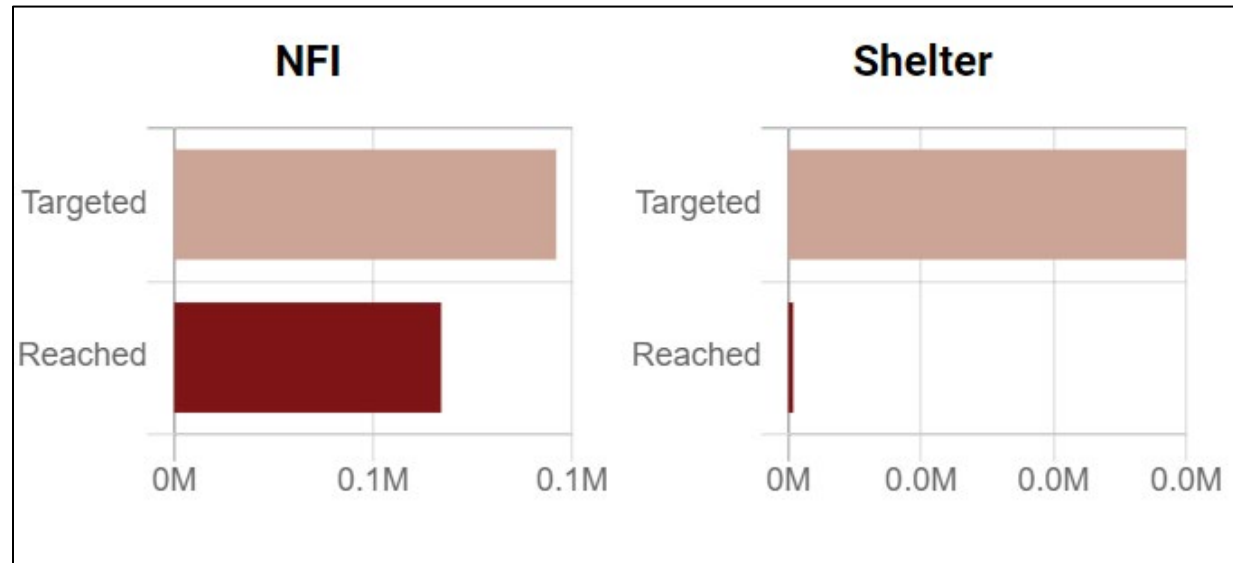
- 61% of its 2021 HRP portfolio is **Essential Household Items**

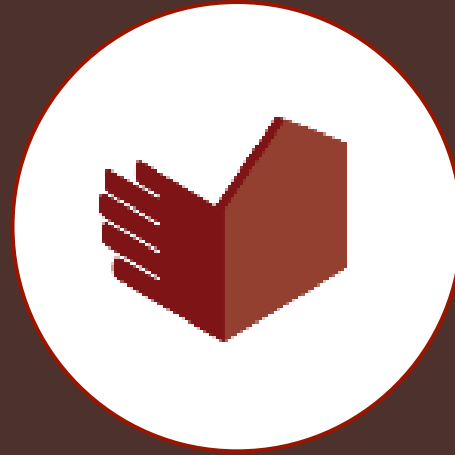
