



KEY DATES

Since the beginning of 2018, 18 subnational cluster meetings have been held, eight each in Sloviansk and Severodonetsk (covering northern Donetsk and northern Luhansk oblasts) and two in Mariinka (covering the southern Donetsk oblast). In the same period the Cluster held also two national-level co-ordination meetings in Kiev, and two technical workshop. At subnational level, the Cluster held also numerous bilateral meetings with all the major shelter actors.

2018-19 WINTERIZATION - The Shelter-NFI Cluster has published the final version of the recommendations for the winterization response. The document is intended to be a practical tool and provides indications on priority areas and type of assistance, including operational details like the recommended quantities per type of solid fuel for heating and amounts of winterization cash grants. The document is the result of a workshop held in July and attended by seven of the main national and international organisations active in the winterization response.

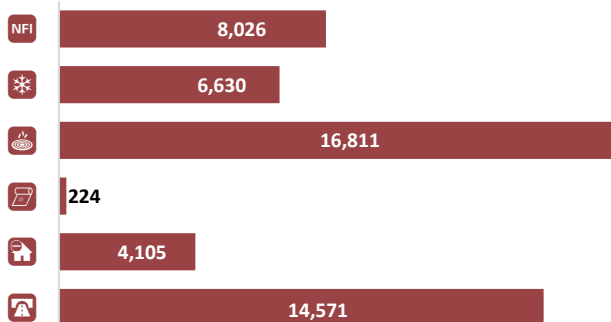
TECHNICAL NOTE - The HLP TWG (House, Land and Property technical working group) has finalised the document that provides guidance on how to approach cases of families in need of shelter assistance who - for different reasons - are not able to provide the legal documentation related to the tenure of the premises in which they live. The issue has been central for the activity of shelter agencies, and has often resulted in the exclusion of otherwise-eligible families from humanitarian house repair programmes.

DAMAGE ASSESSMENT - NRC has published the results of a damage assessment carried out in communities along the contact line in government-controlled areas of Luhansk oblast. The address-level assessment of residual damages to inhabited residential premises is based on a house-to-house verification of data provided by local authorities at the lowest administrative level. 1,289 HHs are reported as still in need of humanitarian shelter assistance in the three raions along the contact line: Popasna, Novoaydar and Stanitsya-Luhanska.

NEWLY DAMAGED HOUSES - In the first six months of the year, 665 inhabited houses have been reported damaged in events related to the conflict. 563 (85%) are located in Donetsk oblast and 102 (15%) in Luhansk oblast. The majority of the damages (445 houses, 67% of the total) occurred in NGCA, with GCA suffering at a lesser extent (220 houses, 33% of the total). July and September, with 29 and 31 new damages, are among the least affected months of this year, and the III quarter saw 1/3 of the damages recorded in the II quarter. The 665 (verified) new damages of the first three quarters of 2018 are roughly 1/6 of the (estimated) 3.810 damages in the correspondent period of 2017.
