



KEY DATES

In 2018, 19 subnational cluster meetings have been held, nine in Sloviansk, eight in Severodonetsk (covering northern Donetsk and northern Luhansk oblasts) and two in Mariinka (covering the southern Donetsk oblast). In the same period, the Cluster held also four national level co-ordination meetings in Kiev, and two technical workshops and numerous bilateral meetings with the major shelter actors at subnational level.

2018-19 WINTERIZATION - Of the eight main agencies engaged in the winterization response in government-controlled areas (GCA), six have completed their activities before the end of the year, assisting almost 11,000 families with coal, heaters, warm clothes, home insulation and cash grants. The other two will complete their activities in mid-February.

The timely delivery of this year's winterization assistance is the result of an increased awareness of the donor community and a more efficient preparation phase on the side of the implementing agencies.

DAMAGE ASSESSMENT - In 2019, NRC will undertake an assessment of the damage caused by the conflict to civilian housing along the contact line in Donetsk oblast (GCA).

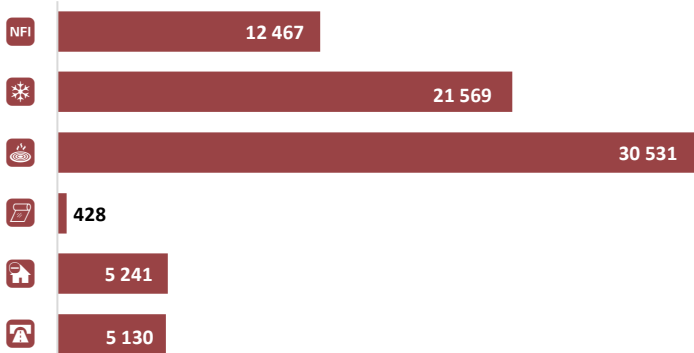
The output will be a verified address-level list of vulnerable households still in need of humanitarian assistance for the repair of their house. This new assessment will be the continuation of the one completed by NRC in 2018, which covered Luhansk oblast (GCA).

NEWLY DAMAGED HOUSES - The last quarter of 2018 confirmed the decreasing trend already observed in the previous quarter, with half the number of damages registered in the period October-December compared to the period July-September (73 vs 45). The majority of the damages occurred again in Donetsk oblast (52 houses affected (71% of the total), compared to 21 (29%), in the Luhansk oblast).

When considering the whole 2018, a total of 738 houses have suffered conflict-related damages: 615 (83%) in Donetsk oblast and 123 (17%) in Luhansk oblast. The last quarter registered the lowest number of damages (73, compared to 107 in Q1, 413 in Q2 and 145 in Q3).

December - when the New Year's ceasefire was adopted - resulted, together with January, the month with the lowest number of registered damages (21 houses); May and April (with 170 and 173) the months with the highest.
