<p><b><u>Partner Updates</u></b></p> <p><b>NRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Rehabilitation works in 138 houses in Abu Salim municipality currently ongoing. Works in additional 31 houses will start by the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of February.</li> <li>- 2022 planned projects;           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rehabilitation of 178 houses in Benghazi, 128 houses in Tripoli and 230 in Tawergha</li> <li>• 10 community infrastructure projects (5 in Benghazi and 5 in Tripoli)</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><b>IOM</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Providing NFI's in 10 detention centres. Winter clothing, winter blankets, mattresses and HK provided to 2,054 individuals in January</li> </ul>		



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Provision of NFI kits (winter clothing, winter blankets, mattresses and HK) to migrants in urban settings. Reaching 1,602 individuals in January</li> <li>- NFI's (blankets, mattresses, kitchen sets, solar lamps, Family HK, tarps, jerry can) provided to 514 IDP's in Gasser ben Ghasheer and Al-Meraj.</li> </ul> <p><b>DRC</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- NFI's provided to 5 HH in Ain Zara IDP site</li> <li>- 27 returnee families in Ain Zara supported with shelter kits and NFI's</li> <li>- Assessment completed for 60 HH that were referred by the Ain Zara municipality. 48 HH identified and will receive NFI's</li> <li>- Technical assessment for rehabilitation works in Souq Al-Ahad IDP site will be conducted during the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of February</li> <li>- NFI's provided to 50HH of Muzruq IDP's living in Tripoli.</li> <li>- NFI's provided to 97 individuals in tow sites for migrants in Souq Al Juma'a</li> <li>- NFI's provided to 4 HH in Ateeb IDP site in Tarhouna (responding to the fire incident)</li> <li>- Plans to provide shelter kits and core relief items to 30-40 returnee HH in Abu Salim municipality</li> </ul> <p><b>CESVI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- 237 core NFI kits and 158 supplementary kits (winter blankets/mattresses) distributed in Misrata</li> <li>- Cash for rent activities are ongoing currently supporting 31 HH in Misrata</li> </ul> <p><b>CEFA</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Provision of food items, NFI kits, hygiene items and PPE to 111 HH for refugees, migrants and asylum seekers in Al Zawiya</li> <li>- Appeal from Al Zawiya municipality for 254 host families. CEFA proposed to the Municipality to provide one distribution for 80 households (each household will receive one family SNFI Kit, 1 family Hygiene Kit, 1 family PPE kit). Distribution is pending municipality approval. Additional support to cover the rest of the families might be needed from the sector partners</li> </ul>	<p>Regarding the appeal for assistance fort host community families in Al Zawiya, CEFA to inform the sector of additional needs that can't be covered</p>	
	<p><b><u>Outstanding requests</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Tawergha – UNHCR distributions stopped halfway due to issues related to government approvals/registration.</li> <li>- Hrawa – no assistance provided. All UNHCR distribution suspended</li> <li>- Traghen – completed by IOM</li> </ul>		



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Gharyan- appeal for migrants was addressed by IOM, IDP request for assistance was not addressed</li> <li>- Murzuq IDP’s in Tripoli appeal – assistance provided. UNHCR activities are suspended</li> <li>- Host community in Al Zawiya – CEFA is negotiating response modality and looking at what households can be assisted. Additional support from other sector partners might be needed to cover all needs.</li> </ul>		
	<p><b><u>Updates from the sector</u></b></p> <p><b>Dashboard and Activity Info</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Operational activities and 2021 achievements presented by the IMO</li> <li>- The dashboard for 2021 now shows all achievements that were reported by partners on Activity Info</li> <li>- Activity Info for 2022 is now open and available for partners to report</li> <li>- For January achievements, partners can report achievements until the end of February</li> <li>- A refresher session/training on Activity Info can be delivered by the sector if there a need. Partners can also reach bilaterally to Awat if they need support.</li> </ul> <p><b>CCPM Results</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- survey was sent to 45 people, 19 responses received including INGO’s UN and donors</li> <li>- Survey results presented. Showing overall improvement on the 7 key functions of a Cluster (set by the IASC)</li> <li>- 2021 SNFI sector work plan included 36 activities. 72% are completed and 28% are ongoing and carried forward to 2022</li> </ul> <p><b>Shelter solution for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Work on shelter solutions for refugees, migrants and asylum seekers continues. The sector is working with REACH and analysing data the systems and processes that govern how refugees and migrants engage with the rental market. Refer to the presentation for additional resources</li> <li>- Eviction task force meeting will be held tomorrow and will discuss eviction risks/threats for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers among other agenda points</li> </ul>	<p>Partners to reach out to the sector in case support with activity info/training is needed</p> <p>Kind reminder to report achievements on activity info for January</p>
