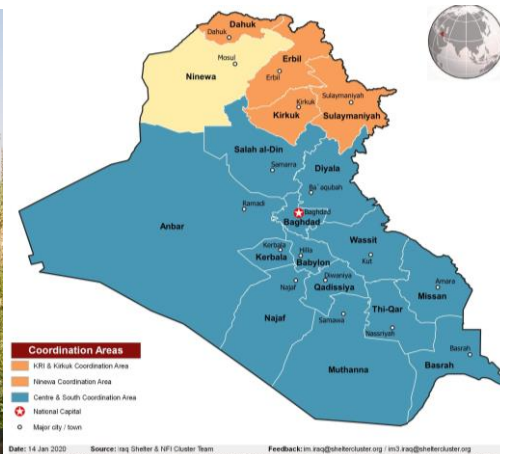


Shelter needs in new returnee area in Latifyah district in Baghdad – July, 2021

NEEDS ANALYSIS

As per the IOM-led DTM report, **1.19 million IDPs** and **4.94 million Returnees** have been identified across the country, from Jan 2014 to Oct 2021.

The number of IDPs continues to decrease (from 2.6 million as of Dec 2017 to 1.19 million as of Oct. 2021); while the numbers of returnees has increased (from 3.2 million, end of Dec.2017 to 4.94 million, end of Oct.2021).

- **15%** of those IDPs are **in camps**, while **76%** are currently **in private settings** (in rented accommodation or with host families); **9%** remain **in critical shelter** arrangements (unfinished/abandoned building; school/religious buildings and informal settlements).
- **95%** of the returnees are in their **habitual residence**, **1%** in **private settings** while **4%** live in **critical shelter arrangement** such as informal settlements, unfinished and abandoned buildings, schools, religious structures.

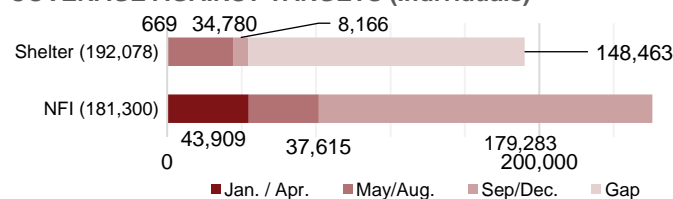
CURRENT CLUSTER INTERVENTIONS (1st Jan. – 30th Nov. 2021)

- Out of the overall SNFI Cluster target of 373,377 individuals, **260,807 (136%)** have been assisted with **NFI kits**; **43,615 (23%)** have benefited from **shelter interventions**:
 - **159,279** people living in camps and informal settlements have been reached with NFI kits; **282 people** have been provided with emergency shelter interventions.
 - **91,258 people** living out of camps have been reached with NFI kits; **29,868 people** have been provided with emergency shelter interventions.
 - **10,270 returnees** have been reached with NFI kits; **13,465 people** were assisted with critical shelter upgrades, Sealing-off Kits or rental subsidies.

GAPS / Constraints and Key Critical Issues

- Partners' presence: some partners in the central and south area stopped their activities due to a lack of funding which affects the delivery of assistance to people in need.
- Shelter Cluster has reopened the Shelter Upgrades in camp file and started collaboration with the Government authorities in Dohuk.
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- Access constraints: Partners have reported number of checkpoints requiring additional approvals from military commanders and to report their activities to authorities through unauthorized channels. Coordination with OCHA in country is ongoing to resolve those
- Funding limitation continues to greatly hamper partners' response /implementation of identified activities.

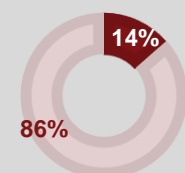

3.1: Vulnerable IDPs in camps, out-of-camp IDPs and returnees in acute need are supported to achieve a secure and safe physical living environment to live in safety and dignity at both family and community level, where minimum standards for camp/settlement structures and services are attained or maintained.

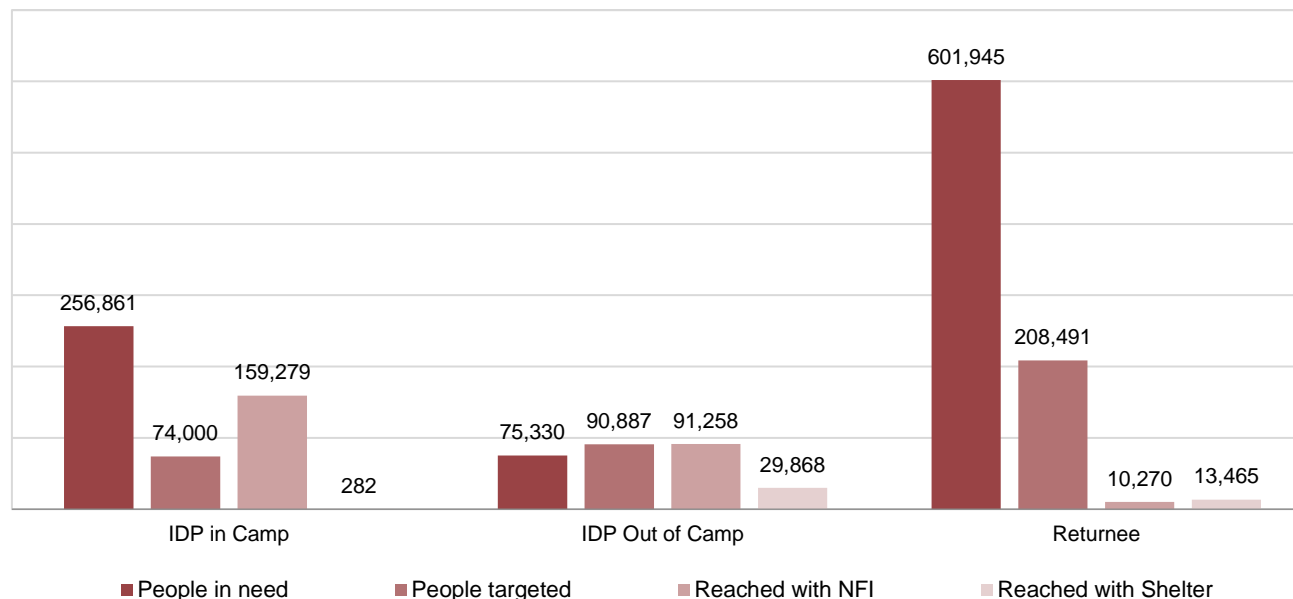
