<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● Ongoing activities:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>○ Assessing Identified location for intervention: Sidi Alsayah- IDPs site (37HH).</li><li>○ Conducting introductory meetings with targeted municipalities.</li></ul></li></ul> <p><b>NRC</b></p> <p><u>Projects charged to UNHCR:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Tender evaluation is ongoing for the first package of work; rehabilitation and upgrade of 24 houses at Alsabrie, 2 camp infrastructure, and 30 shelter unit at Al Hilies, Benghazi.</li><li>2. Rehabilitation of 41 houses at Al Sabrie; technical assessment is completed, BoQs and scope of work are completed. All documents shared with UNHCR for review.</li><li>3. For infrastructure works in Tripoli, technical assessment is completed, BoQs and scope of work are completed. All documents shared with UNHCR, and tender will be launched this week.</li></ol> <p><u>Projects charged to other donors:</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Rehabilitation and upgrade of two health centers in Al Hadba and Mashroe Zerae- Tripoli; technical assessment is completed, all technical documents and final package completed, tender will be launched this week.</li><li>2. Rehabilitation of housing units - Benghazi: Registration and vulnerability assessment for 102 HHs in Gamminess is completed, technical assessment is ongoing.</li><li>3. Rehabilitation of housing units – Tripoli: working on registering potential beneficiaries through community focal points and local councils, vulnerability assessments started for HHs identified in Abu Salim (AL Khalatat area).</li></ol> <p><b>UN-Habitat</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>● UN-Habitat has engaged two consultants working on an assessment on Libya’s Land Administration and Land Management. A wide variety of actors are asked to complete a questionnaire, along with key informant interviews.</li><li>● UN-Habitat Libya hosted a Roundtable on ‘Addressing Land Administration and Land Rights Challenges to Pave the Ground for Peace and Stability in Libya’ on the 29th and 30th June in Tunis. The roundtable brought together land and HLP experts and practitioners from different institutions and disciplines to exchange their experiences and discuss the priorities for action in the Libyan land / HLP sector.</li></ul> <p><b>UNHCR</b></p>		
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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• During June, UNHCR managed to reach 4,444 individuals mainly refugees, asylum seekers, migrants and IDP's.</li> <li>• 40 individuals (32 males / 7 females) out of the 4,444 have been reached at a detention center in the East (Alkufra), 892 reached at CDC, and 524 individuals at the TNB(Tripoli Naval Base). Whereas 2,985 were internally displaced persons targeted at Abugrain &amp; Weshka, Murzuq IDP families in Benghazi.</li> <li>• During the month a total of 9,738 NFIs, 3,098 HKs and 10,265 hand soap have been distributed at the CDC, TNB, DCs and IDP camps/urban settings.</li> </ul> <p><b>CESVI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• NFI distributions in the Misrata Urban Areas with the Ministry of Social Affairs</li> <li>• MoSA has requested assistance for <b>back-to-school kits distribution</b>, which cannot address with the current projects.</li> <li>• Cash for Rent activities ongoing</li> </ul> <p><b>IOM</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Distributed to 3,586 migrants in West and East DCs– NFI and HKs</li> <li>• Distributed to 4,025 IDPs in two locations – Derna (ongoing) and Al-Jufra – full NFI kits</li> </ul> <p><b>PUI</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ongoing rehabilitation of 5 health facilities – Benghazi and Al-Kufra</li> <li>• New assessments continuing – east and south</li> </ul> <p><b>REACH</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• MSNA data collection is almost completed for both main target groups</li> <li>• Ongoing discussions with sector on qualitative data collection</li> </ul> <p><b>UN-OCHA - East</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Highlighted the need for Derna for house rehabilitation and for Cash for Rent</li> </ul> <p><b>ABU- SALIM</b></p> <p>DRC, NRC and ICRC all working in Abu Salim – suggestion to hold join meeting to share plans, ideas and modalities.</p>	<p>Richard and Ahmed to highlight needs of Derna to partners</p> <p>Richard to organise meeting</p>
