1	<p>Updates from Partners</p> <p>CEFA Setting up new project aimed at improving living conditions of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees in Tripoli and Zawiya through the provision of food kits, hygiene kits and NFI kits to 350 Beneficiaries as well as supporting access to healthcare and wash</p> <p>DRC Finished last project 2 months ago. new SDC was planned to start beginning of the year, there are some delays on signing the agreement and the project has not started yet. No activities currently ongoing</p> <p>NRC</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Plans to rehabilitate 120 houses in urban settings in Benghazi (of which 65 are done in partnership with UNHCR). 30 houses identified with rehabilitation works expected to start end of June. Assessments sand production of technical documents is completed - In partnership with UNHCR, infrastructure works in Sidi Faraj and Garyounis IDP settlements and 30 shelter units in AL Hilis settlement will be rehabilitated in June. Assessments sand production of technical documents is completed 		



	<p>- In Tripoli NRC, has plans to rehabilitate 300 houses Abu Salim, Gaser Ben Ghashir and Ain Zara and provide infrastructure solutions in 4-7 sites with the aim of promoting access to essential services such as water and health.</p> <p>IOM</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Providing NFI's to newly rescued migrants in detention centers in the west - Regular hygiene kits provision in detention centers in the east is ongoing - Provision of NFI's for new arrivals in AL Kufra - IDPs; responding to a request from social affairs in Benghazi to provide NFI's - Conducting assessments in Abu Najem, Kufra, Murzuq, Wadi Diba. So far has received findings from 2 locations. Provision of NFI's will commence after Eid. <p>UNHCR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Provided a full package of CRI's to 91 new arrivals in AL kufra yesterday - Provision of CRI's in weshka and abu grain and Murzuq - Beneficiaries in Muzruq identified for the provision of CRI's. Distribution planned early next week - Planned to hygiene kits distribution in the 8 Tawergah IDP settlements in Benghazi - Planned HK distribution for IDP's from Tarhouna in the east - Plans to do HK distribution in all IDP settlements in the Tripoli - Assessments completed in Bawabet Al Gebs and Al Dawa AL Islameyah center for the provision of CRI's - Plans to provide hygiene kits to IDP's from Tawergha and Sirt in Sebha and Jufra. Same group that have already received CRI's and winterization kits. <p>INTERSOS</p> <p>Provided NFI's to 340 HH in Sebha, the cases were identified though INTERSOS case management unit and referrals form local organizations. The NFI's included; home sets, children sets, hygiene kits and kits for people with special needs.</p> <p>PUI</p> <p>Currently rehabilitating 5 health facilities in Bengahzi and Al Kufra</p>	<p>UNHCR to share an outline of the targeted areas with estimate numbers/type of assistance</p>

	Updates from the SAG & TWIG <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Update from the SAG; vulnerability score card is done and will be presented tool- Richard is working on the standard global strategy document- Costing methodology exercise planned in May-June- Work on developing shelter solutions for migrants, refugees and asylum seekers guidance notes and SoP's ongoing		
	Updates on the Naval academy eviction <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Eviction deadline was moved from the 20th to the 11th of May. Reports from IMC, NRC and the protection sector confirm that the vast majority of the HH's in the academy has already left. No clear information on the destination of the evicted HH's or the numbers who returned to Tawergha.- The assessment planned earlier this month by the eviction task force was not implemented due to limited capacity/participation of partners as well as security issues and tensions in the academy- NRC is planning to do a follow up assessment with a sample of the HH's that were evicted- Appeal for assistance was received from the Tawergha local council, through OCHA, for the provision of NFI's, construction materials, temporary shelters and support to basic infrastructure in the city. The appeal expects around 1,000 HH to move back to Tawergha, still there are no clear information regarding the source and reliability of these figures.	Partners with capacity to respond in Tawergha or planning to conduct any assessments are kindly requested to share their plans with the sector
