Update of ongoing response, information collection, Information management

MOUD updated the NEOC lead/co-lead meeting summary

A short presentation has shared about-

- Situation overview, response action taken by member agencies, NFIs distribution plan and progress, stock available in country context, Coordination mechanism(engagement of National and provincial cluster coordination team, cluster needs, gaps and capacity has presented and discussed
- Minimum standard of relief items, Coordinated reliefs, One door system, IRA , Detail Assessment, further assistance (transitional sheltering), communication, reporting , Information management (4W/5W matrix) has discussed
- way forward, roles sharing and tentative time of Next cluster meeting

Points from floor discussions:

Distribution of NFIs - Cabinet has decided to follow one door policy for distribution.

Understanding of one door policy for distribution is varies initially. Collection of all relief materials in one place will brings unusual resource losses. Effective coordination with DDMC, Local Government should maintain by sharing the distribution plans, items with standard specification and the coverage would be a effective way to maintain coordination in one door policy for distribution system.

In a full package of Shelter NFIs standard should be-

Tarpulin-2 , Blanket-2,Mattress-2, Nylon Rope- 4 coils (40m) (*For fully displaced HHs*)

- ✚ **Humanitarian assistance-** *Relief and Response action taken to be shared by agencies*
 - Save the children network is in place, Karnali province shelter cluster coordination focal, distribution is affected in DDMC allocated areas
 - Big tents are also required in local level
 - APF has family tents in stock, which can be transported to jajarkot in case of need
 - Distribution plan of humanitarian agencies can be communicated later
 - UNICEF highlighted about the varieties of assessment IRA, MIRA, CSDA and joint coordinated assessment. Camp setting may require in ground zero collapsed case. Host community, temporary settlement and displaced population needs integrated WASH facilities. Initial data says 10,000 – 15,000 toilets partially damaged. 5000- 10000 E-toilets are the capacity, 2000-3000 WASH capacities
 - One door policy does not mean to collect all the relief materials in once place. It means all the humanitarian agency will facilitate the coordinated relief distribution and avoid duplication.
 - World vision International nepal has initially 300 shelter kits distribution plan and stock information will updates
 - NHSRP-CRS is working in securing some fund for support modalities. Information management support will provided to Shelter cluster in this response.
 - 50,000 NPR is the value of Transitional shelter support cost under NDRRMA guideline. 60,000 disaster affected HHs in Nepal need to bring in reconstruction, which are left behind yet. Detail assessment to be prioritized once IRA report received.
 - Coordination units needs to be established at the provincial level
 - Government needs technical experts for further work to support recovery and reconstruction
 - In both of district weak infrastructure around the corridor of Bheri river
 - International appeal is less likely. Reconstruction, which is the most likely, institutionalize to lead. DUDBC has 35 district's reconstruction experiences.
 - Still being discussed without proper assessment there are chances of the available resources could be misused
 - Resource constraint is one of the challenges that caused delayed in detailed assessment planned by DUDBC
 - This earthquake could be one of the possibility for strict implementation of building codes
 - APF has mobilized three containers of DOME Tent and information will be shared.
 - Plan international Nepal mobilized 500 shelter kits from Bardibas
 - 5 vehicles mobilized for airlifting the relief items
 - UNDP will use drone for the possible assessment in future
 - CGI sheets or UPVC, which one is suitable and feasible for construction still a concerned?

- CCCM cluster is focusing in site management, site identification, and management of displaced population. DTM (Disaster tracking matrix) tool to be rolled out (frequent)
- FPIU will be mobilize for joint assessment if coordinated in national level.

In general, houses cracked pattern are in three clear categories in

- Fully damaged/collapsed- Not possible to live
 - Fully cracked- Not possible to use
 - Cracked but liveable
- Detail assessment formats are in general for engineered buildings rather than adobe construction
 - Preliminary stage so fluctuation of data may occurs

 **Way forward:**

- Stock updates and distribution plan will share by agencies
- CRS will support shelter cluster in Information Management
- NHSRP has already positioned one IM in karnali province
- Sudurpaschim IM and technical coordinator can also be used for data collection, processing (4W and 5W) matrix. Distribution data will share to the MOUD/DUDBC
- Provincial cluster lead MOPID along with FPIU surkhet should be in coordination structure
- Map of the disaster affected district's local level with ward details need to prepare and shared

 **Key highlights of the meeting:**

- Strength of Shelter cluster coordination - Biggest resources of shelter cluster is team coordination be created to fulfill any coordinated function required.
- Provincial shelter coordination team (save the children focal) will fully supported by national shelter cluster in required time. Technical working groups may formed as per need.
- Stock updates and distribution plan will share by agencies
- CRS will support shelter cluster in Information Management
- 5W matrix for distribution and other relief engagement will maintain and filled by all agencies.

Next meeting:

When compiled version of relief distribution and response data will gathered and ready for minister level sharing. Decision will be made for next meeting as the information collected and in if required in between.
