

## ES/NFI Sector Monthly Coordination

### Meeting minutes

**Date:** 15 March 2017, 11.00 – 12.30 AM

Agenda Item	Discussion/action points
<b>Introduction and comments on previous meeting minutes</b>	Action points from last meeting: Partners requested the SHF timeline to be shared with them.
<b>Update on SHF funding under the first round allocation (including update on timeline).</b>	<p>There were some concerns and questions about SHF from partners. It was explained that some of the projects that were not selected did not pass the eligibility criteria as per the 2017 SHF allocation paper. Especially win relation to budget and locations.</p> <p>It was advised for future rounds of SHF funding that partners discussed their projects with the sector before uploading. In the advent of an emergency the Sector would support partners to request SHF Reserve funds. The sector would also provide support for bilateral funding sources such as RRF if the need was justified.</p> <p>The First Stage of SHF was completed with the submission of concepts notes. The Strategic Review Committee recommended 6 projects for funding. Between 21-22 March, recommended projects will receive notification to upload final proposals, which will be reviewed and comments posted on GMS for revision.</p>
<b>HRP 2017 presentation and proposed strategy</b>	<p>The Multi-year HRP strategy document is still in draft stage. The Task Team have formulated the strategic objectives, outcomes and outputs together with output indicators to be achieved over 2017, 2018, and 2019. The Sectors are developing their sector strategy (sector response plan) and indicators for the 2017 HRP in consultation with the government focal points under the National Mechanism. The Sector Coordinator will share drafts with all sector partners for comment. An important aspect of the multi-year strategy is exit plan/solution for protracted IDPS.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">***</p> <p><b><u>Action point:</u></b></p>

<p><b>Partner Updates</b></p>	<p><b>Partner updates from the field were as follows;</b></p> <p><b>SRCS:</b> distributed the following ES/NFIs from their own stock in March: 325 NFI kits in Mahara and 37 NFI kits in Buram to Sudanese returnees.</p> <p><b>AOSCD:</b> completed the construction of 20 transitional shelters in Tabafitto, South Darfur, and shared an assessment report following a joint mission to Kass and Shattaya.</p> <p><b>AORD:</b> constructed 125 transitional shelters for IDPs in Kurmuk and Bulong, and 75 emergency shelters in Samsour village, Blue Nile state. An additional 250 shelters are under construction. Some 404 ES/NFI Kits were distributed in Bulong, 400 in Dindro, 289 in Samsour and 407 in Wad Abouk. These were provided by the NFI CP.</p> <p><b>NCA :</b> reported on a needs assessment in eastern Jabal Marra, where 2,750 households were found to be newly displaced. The Assessment report will be shared with the sector.</p> <p><b>GFO:</b> GFO signed a camp coordination agreement with HAC and OCHA for Kalma camp.. GFO will be the focal point for coordination of activities and needs in the camp, with an active referral and reporting system covering different sectors.</p> <p><b>SANAD Charity Organization</b> distributed 2,000 blankets for children in boarding schools in North Kordofan</p> <p><b>TGH:</b> reported additional returns in Um Dukhon, Muraddaf and Abu Karadees. TGH will distribute NFIs to the most vulnerable people of survivors of natural disaster in Muraddaf.</p> <p><b>UPO :</b> UPO submitted an NFI request for 1400 protracted households for the most vulnerable in East Darfur. UPO is currently conducting awareness sessions in East Darfur targeting 300 IDPs.</p>
<p><b>Refugee Response Updates</b></p>	<p><b>SRCS:</b> distributed the following ES/NFIs from UNHCR’s Refugee pipeline. In March 454 HHs in Al Radoum, SD received ES/NFI packages; 256 households in Kharasana, WKS were provided with blankets and jerry cans.</p> <p>In January and February, some 1,007 HHs received ES/NFIs, whilst 322 HHs received shelter construction materials in Kario camp, East Darfur; Additionally, SRCS has requested a ES/NFI packages for 1500 households from UNHCR’s refugee pipeline.</p> <p><b>SANAD Charity Organization</b> is planning activities in East Darfur in coordination with RCF in April</p>
