Demolition response

Demolished structures: 227 (Jan-end May 2019) Of which **93 (41%)** are residential, which is **200%** more comparing to the same period of 2018. displaced **330** individuals, including **147** children

Donor-funded structures: 29 of which **7** is residential

64 households have received a shelter response in 2019; **3** are ongoing.

8,137 demolition orders distributed between years 2010 to 2017.

Upgrading and Rehabilitation of substandard shelters (Needs):

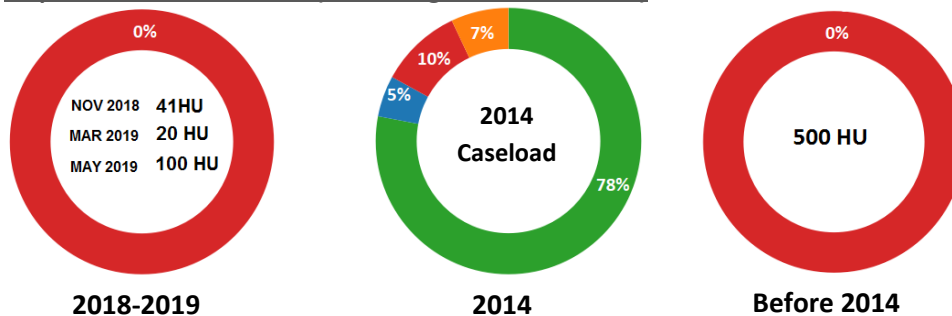
3,630 shelters in Area C, **950** Shelters in H2 area of Hebron and **350** shelters in East Jerusalem require rehabilitation or consolidation to ensure adequate protection and reduce risk of displacement

Gaza

IDP response

Over **1,750 families (about 10,000 individuals)** remain internally displaced (IDP) since the 2014 conflict including Nov 2018, March and May 2019 escalations. An **urgent gap in assistance** exists for around **1,100** IDP families requiring cash support.

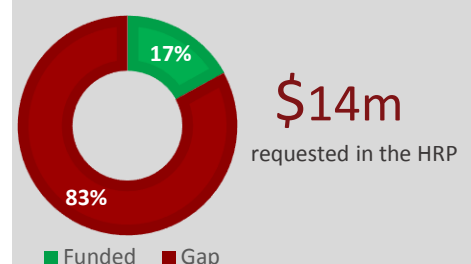

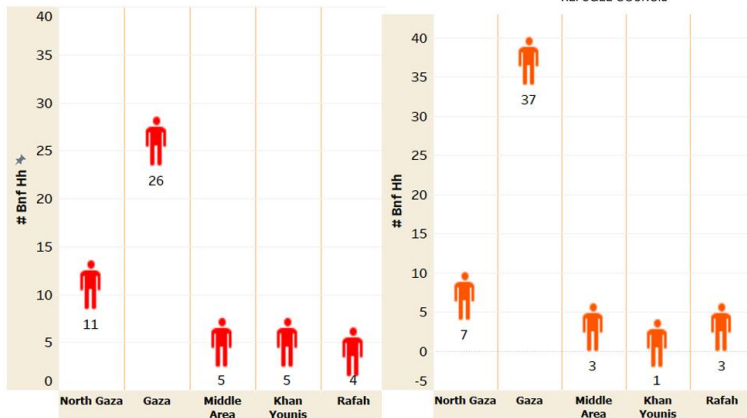

➤ **Vulnerable Group : evicted Families or at risk of eviction due to deteriorated socio-economic situation**

The civil servants salary cut and the continued economic deterioration in Gaza laid its shade on many vulnerable families creating legal issues between landlords and tenants, the matter that reflects the need for urgent shelter assistance to families currently lacking the rental affordability and facing the risk of eviction. Recent information received from MoPWH indicates that at least 2,000 - 4000 tenant families are currently under eviction risk due to their inability to pay rental fees. This is out of the approximately 21,000 households living in rented accommodations as reported by PCBS.

The figures might increase at any time if the situation continues or more deterioration in the economic conditions takes place.
