



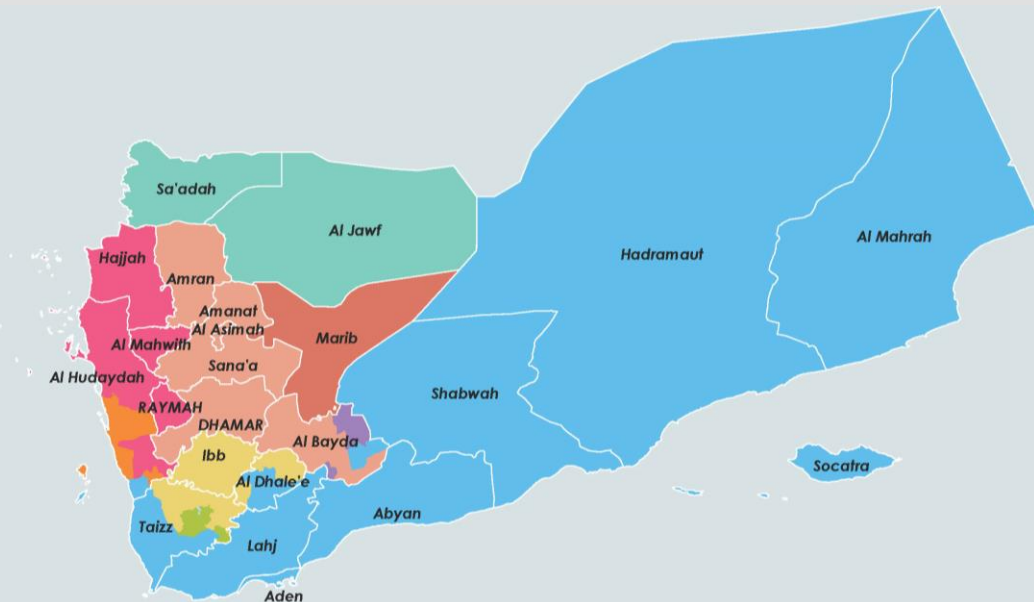

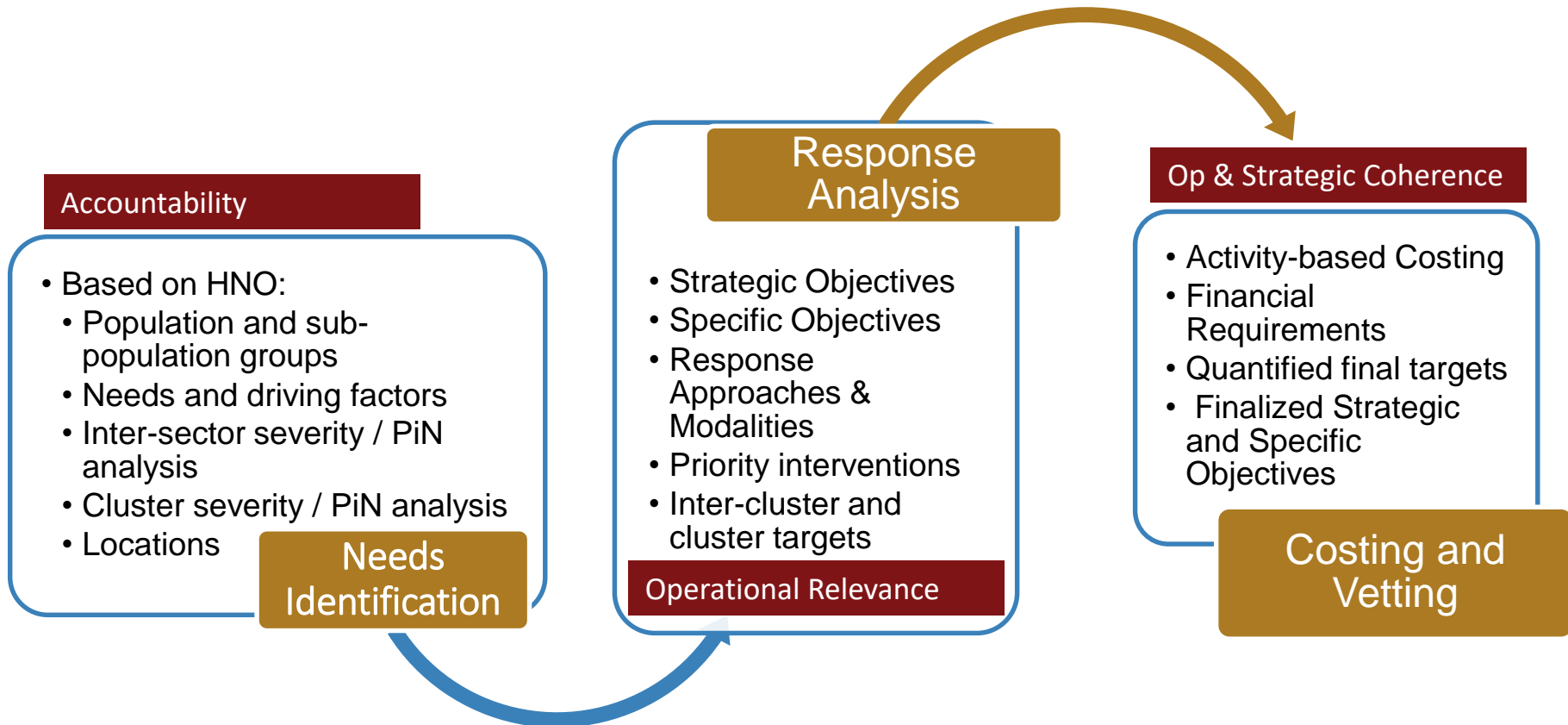

Project line

First line response, support and access to most vulnerable IDPs and host community through immediate provision of shelter NFIs/Cash for rent/ activities in Almafer –Dhubab Districts

Rental activity

- ✓ 200 HHs from IDPs in Almaafer ,100 HHs from IDPs in Dhubab district ,that are under threaten expulsion were targeted and selected within the vulnerability criteria after registration and verification processes.
- ✓ The total number of individuals is **1468**.
- ✓ Two rental cycles were delivered out of a total of 6 cycles.
- ✓ The distribution process was carried out by a mobile teller, and Corona precautionary measures were taken

NFIs activity

- ✓ 500 families were targeted in Al-Maafer district and 100 families from Dhubab district. The representation of the displaced was 80% and 20% of the host community
- ✓ The total number of individuals is **3446**.
- ✓ The beneficiaries were selected within the criteria for vulnerability.
- ✓ The materials were distributed within 7 days, divided into the areas closest to the beneficiaries, while taking precautionary measures from Corona.

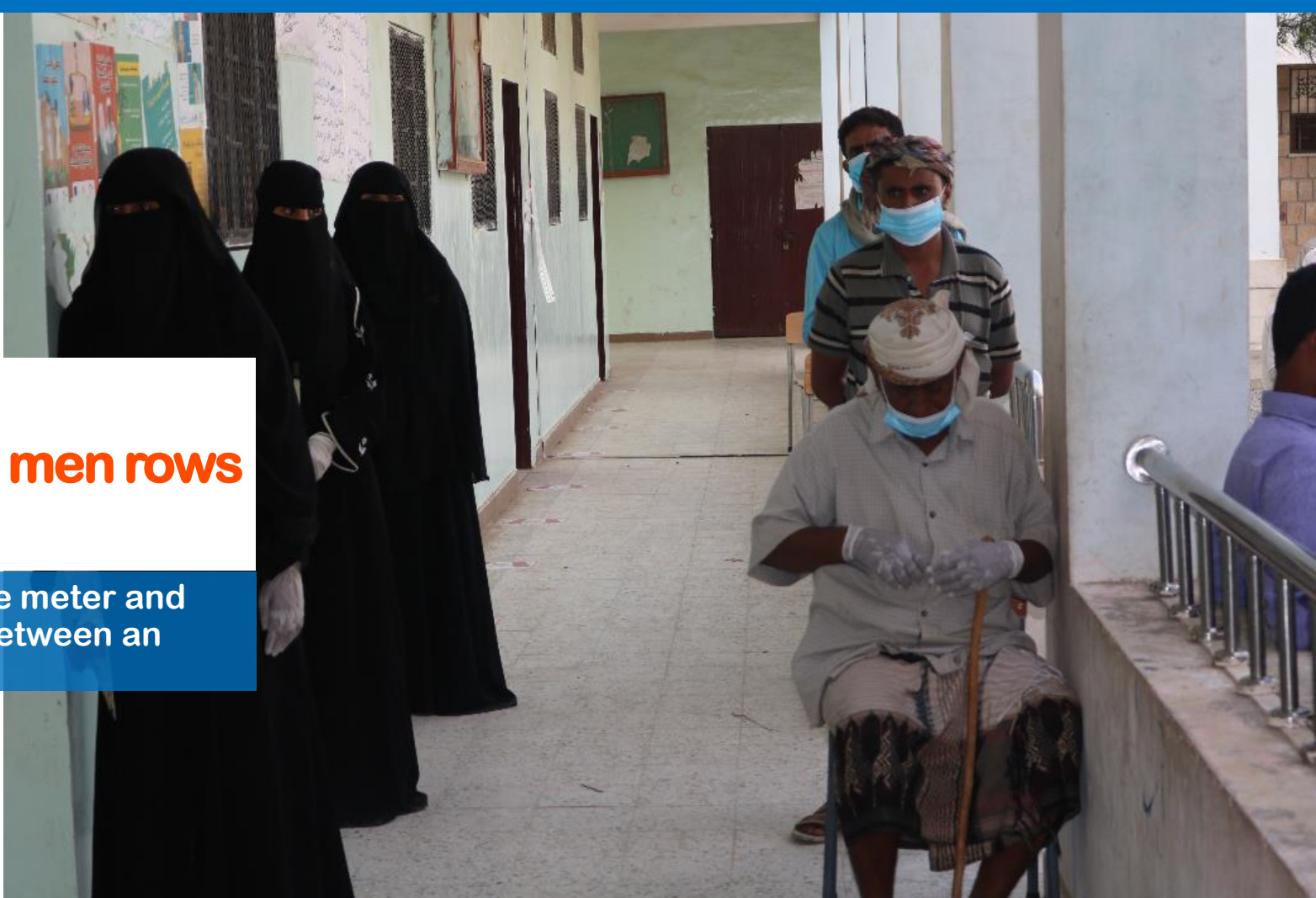

- Outcome of the Safe and Efficient cooking practices survey/ prototypes!
- Carry a survey/assessment for Safe and Efficient cooking practices – in all governorates

Top 3 News/Challenges

1. Ongoing provision of Transitional Shelters for thousands of families in Aden, Lahj and Red Sea Coast by Shelter cluster partners including UNHCR, ACTED and IOM.
2. Ongoing distribution of Winterization support by some Shelter cluster partner in Al Turbah and Al Dhalee' by UNHCR, ACTED and Ksrelief center.
3. Escalation of conflict in many frontlines including Al Hudaydah, Al Dhalee, Abyan and Marib leading to new displacement movement of hundreds of families who are in need of Shelter/NFIs Assistance.

Needs

1. Urgent needs for winterization support in many areas through excluded from shelter cluster recommendation. This includes Lahj, Al Dhalee and Turbah Taizz.

Updates/Challenges

1. The relocation process of IDPs in Al Turbah schools in the final stage and there are many shelter support needs.

Immediate priorities

1- There are more than 1,400 families in the IDP sites in Ash Shamaytayn & Al Ma'afar in acute need to NFIs.

2- There are more than 1,100 families in the IDP sites in Ash Shamaytayn & Al Ma'afar in acute need to winterization support.

Updates/Challenges :

1. The absence of operational presence of Shelter Cluster partners funded by YHF in 41 districts.
2. The increasing rate of eviction threats reduces the chances of implementation TESK. projects

Urgent needs:

1. To advocate for changing the criteria\ SOP of contingency stock, which is managed by OCHA and RCT, in order to suit the need of each Hub.
2. We must adopt an expiration date for assessment reports and approve on phone verification if it expires.

Updates/Challenges :

- snowfall affected Majz district in Saada governorate in the middle of Jan2021. Around 1172 families got affected by snowfall based on the primary information.
- Absence of funded partners to cover the urgent winterization needs. assistance this year.
- The flood-affected families in Al Jawf have not received any kind of assistance, due to the delay of transportation of CRIs from the warehouses in Saada to Al Jawf.

Immediate priorities:

- More funding and more eligible partners required to contribute to meeting Shelter/NFIs needs and or gap-filling.
- Available of any partner has the capacity to cover the need of winterization.

Success Story

- In this old torn tent, Tawfeeq and his seven children have been experiencing severe challenges with an overwhelming need for life basic needs. The family displaced from Hajja governorate to settle in Mafrak Altalh area in Sa'adah district where they have neither shelter nor source of income.” We have been settling here since July, we have no safe shelter, no furniture and no clean water” he stated. In this fence, the family is exposed to various health issues due to the harsh weather conditions with total lack of health care. “My children have been suffering from flue and cough having no health care as we are out of money and can't buy medicine” Tawfeeq says. UNHCR provided the family with an emergency cash of 100,000 YER to rent a house and referred to the IDPs CC for other services.

Updates/Challenges :

The ongoing conflict and flooding resulted in more than 25000 families' displaced movement between Jan 20 to Jan 21. Further, IDPs who live among host community are forced to move to IDPs sites due to lack of response to those IDPs who live out side collective sites.

Main challenges are as follow:

1. Lack of partners with SNFI projects.
2. Absence of cash for rent projects.
3. Absence of integrated response.
4. Lack of partners who target IDPs among host community.

Immediate priorities:

- Partners are recommended to wide their area of interventions and maximize their stock.
- Partners are recommended to include targeting IDPs who live with in the host community in there upcoming plans.
- Other clusters are recommended to have integrated response plan.
- Advocate partners and donors to have continue SNFI projects.

Success Story



Updates/Challenges :

1. Limited partner's availability and capacity/resources in Albydah Gov which make lack of information and response in Al Bayda governments.
2. Partners should update their activity, plans and response for the shelter assistance using version 4 of ActivityInfo platform forms (v4.activityinfo.org).
3. HLP issues in Khamer IDPs site which lead to miss coordination with other partners to deliver the assistance to the IDPs in the site.
4. There is misunderstanding from the partners in updating the shelter cluster and CCCM cluster with their implementation process.

Immediate priorities:

1. For flood preparedness partners should have maintenance kits to be provided that include tools for maintaining the Affected shelter along with the plastic sheet...etc.
2. distribute winterization kits for the people in need.
3. Fire extinguishers\fire materials prevention are required in the IDPs site

Top 3 News/Challenges

1. Huge NFIs/ESKs and TESKs needs for IDPs in hosting sites in Abs districts .
2. Urgent response for newly displaced households in Al Dorihemi and Al Tuhaitia within Al Hudaydah. .
3. IDPs in rented houses under threatened of eviction in Hajjah city and Abs.

Main Needs

1. Give priority for TESKs and TS shelter solutions to response for IDPs in hosting sites in many districts such as Abs ans Az Zuhrah.
2. Support local NGOs to access hard to reach districts such as Mustaba and Bakil Al Mair.
3. Assist IDPs in rented houses in Abs and Hajjah city by cash for rent at least for 9 rounds to avoid any potential evictions.
4. Accelerate replenishment S/NFIs stocks to face any new waves of displacement in Al Hudaydah and Hajjah.

Success story: Dec 2020, Al Jabin district.

Mahdi Ahmed is an old man with his wife and 8 children belong to Al Mohamashain groups, they are living in unstable shelter under plastic sheet in Al Jabin district within Raymah governorate. Due to flood waves that hit Raymah during July and August , they become in free space without any basic services or non food materials beside two children suffering from malnutrition. By support of ICRC and Contingency stock project in coordination with Shelter cluster, YRC targeted family by ESKs and NFIs to contribute in protect family from any risks that can accrued.
