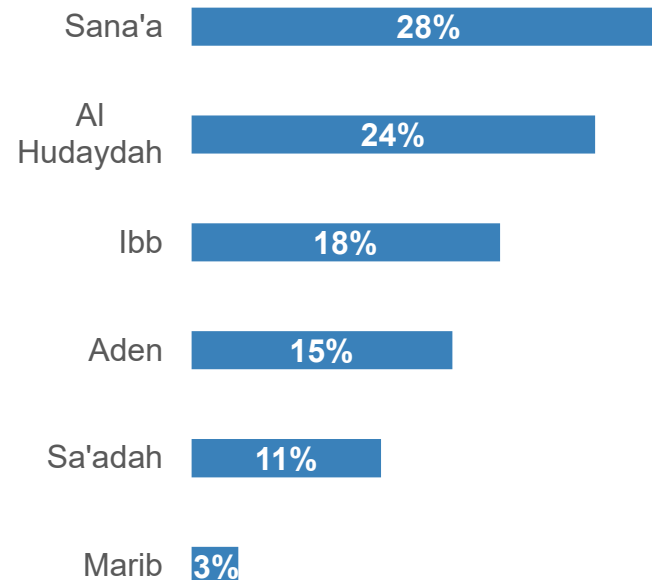

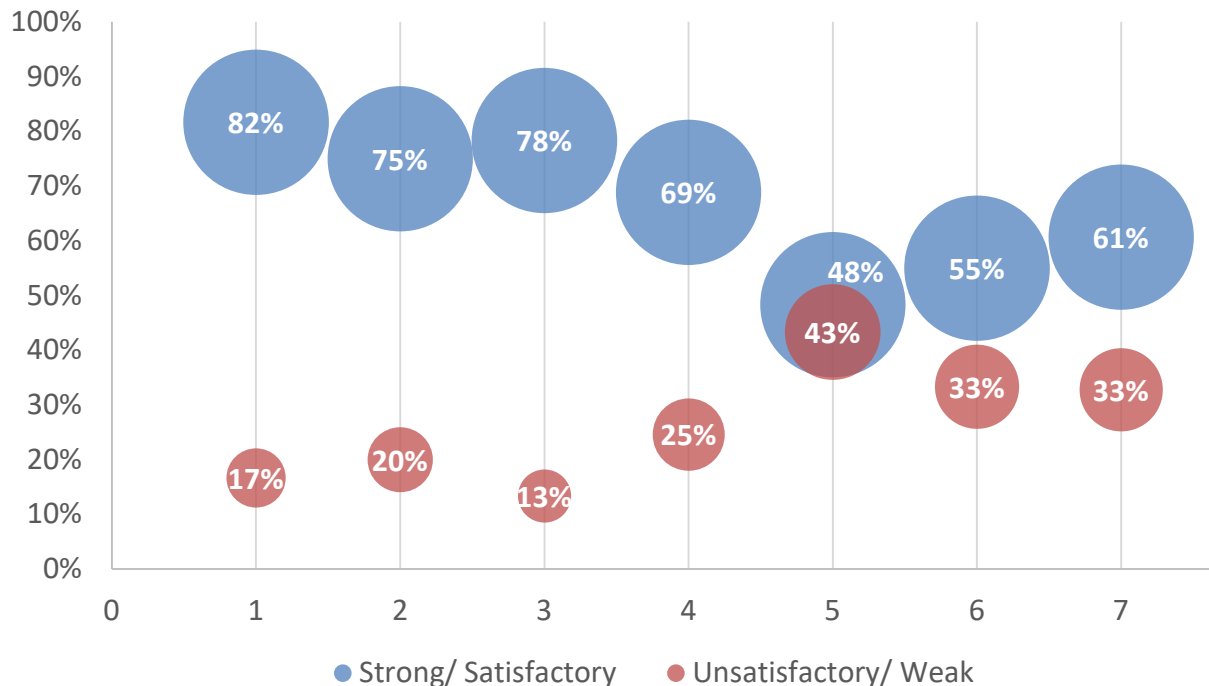

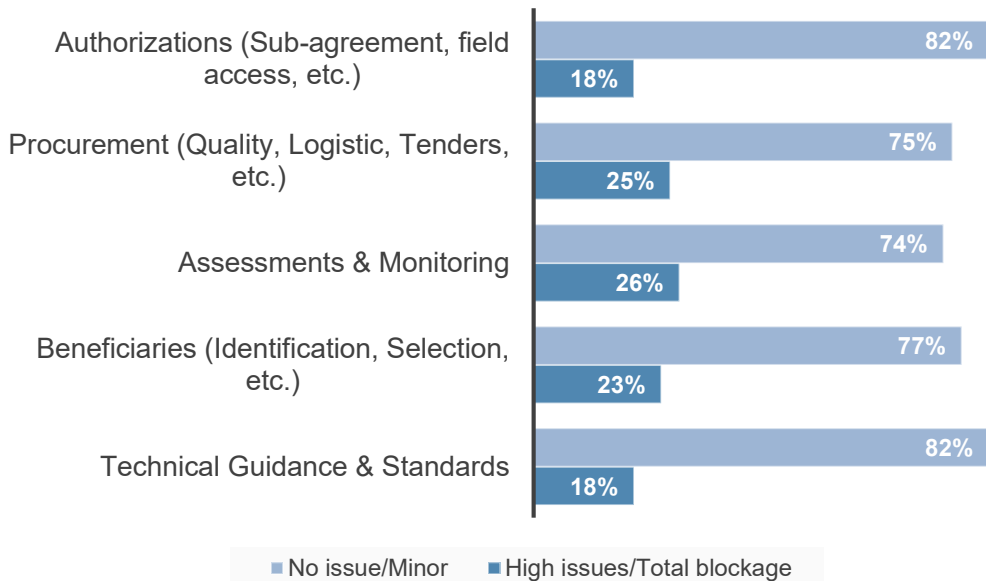

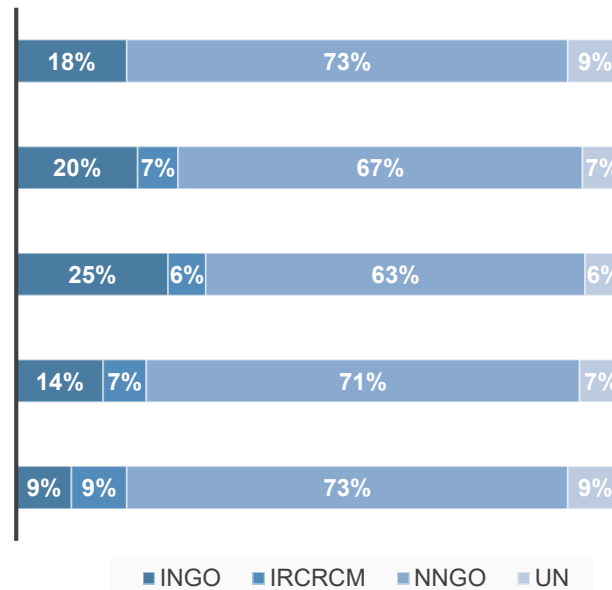

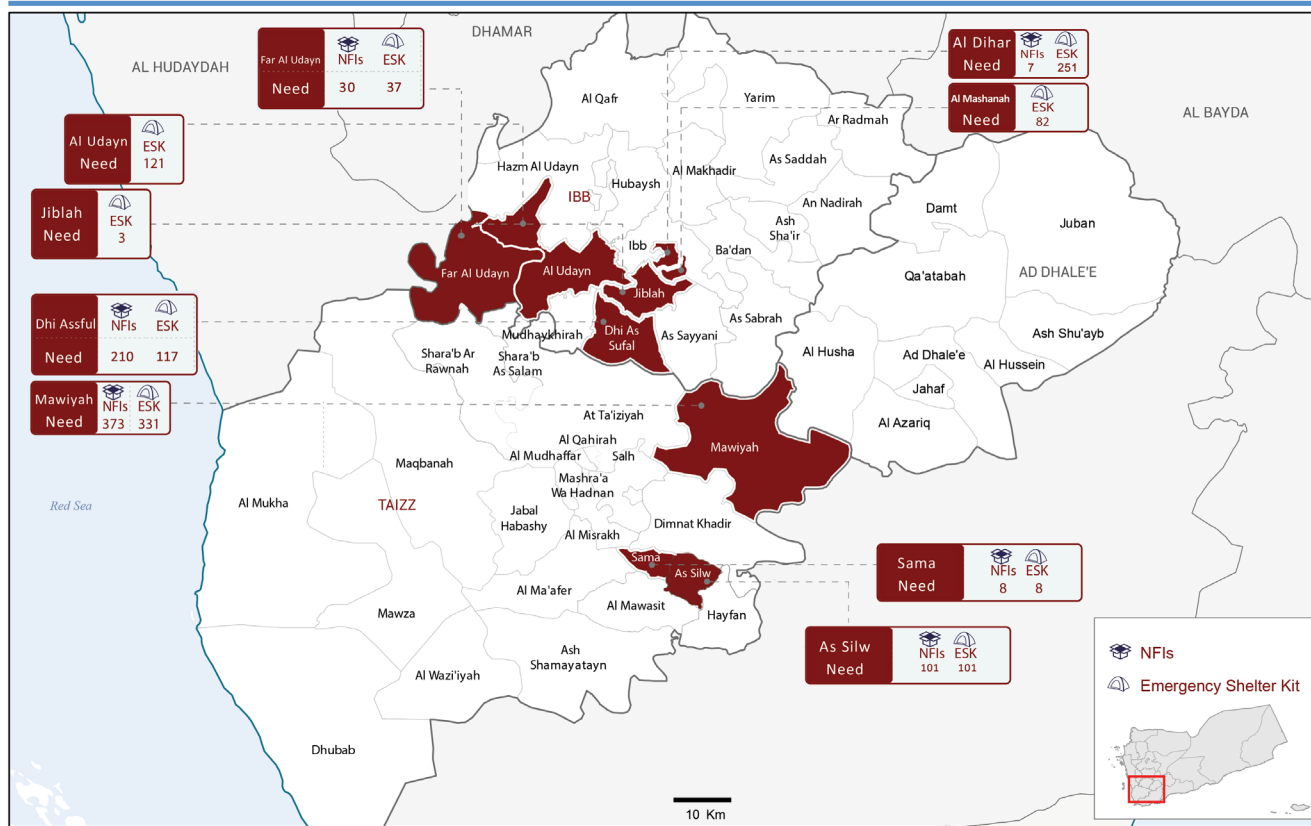

## Top 3 News/Challenges

1. Ongoing provision of Transitional Shelters for thousands of families in Aden, Lahj and Red Sea Coast by Shelter cluster partners including UNHCR, ACTED and IOM.
2. Ksrelief center has plans to distribute more winterization support. This includes 1400 kits in Turbah-Taizz and 600 Kits in Al Dhalee.
3. Supporting Marib Hub logistically from Aden hub for the new displacement movement of hundreds of families who are in need of Shelter/NFIs Assistance.

## Needs

1. Prepositioning of Shelter/NFIs stock in some areas falling under Aden Hub to respond to flooding situations.
2. Needs to respond to Shelter/NFIs unmet needs in WC for almost 1200 HHs

## Updates/Challenges

1. The relocation of IDPs from Al Turbah Schools to the new IDP site in Ash Shamaytayn district has been successful
2. The most IDPs who living in the IDP sites in Taiz covered by winter support and the remaining in the coordination process.

## Immediate priorities

1. There are some of shelter needs for the IDPs in the new site in Ash Shamaytayn district.
2. There is a great need for rental subsidies for the IDPs in Taiz city, and there are no partners who have the capacity to cover this gap.

## Updates/Challenges :

- In Al-Jawf southern border with Marib Governorate and Sa'ada northern with KSA, armed clashes continued which expected new flee IDPs to the safe areas like Al Hazam and Sa'ada districts.
- No partner is working in the shelter & NFI sector in Sa'ada hub except UNHCR.
- Lack of partners and lack of contingency stock indicates limits to IDPs' response.
- In Al Ghile district, there are around 800 partially and totally damaged houses which prevent families to return to their place of origin.
- IDPs and SCMCHA requested to change the ESK to tents or local construct materials, due to the harsh weather.

## Immediate priorities:

- More funding and more eligible partners required to contribute to meeting Shelter/NFIs needs and or gap-filling.
- Any partner who has the capacity to work in shelter maintenance is highly recommended.

## Top 3 News/Challenges

1. Increase in the urgent cases under threatened of eviction or affected by fire in Abs and many of districts in Al Hudaydah .
2. Escalating ongoing conflict in Al Hudaydah governorate resulting in more newly displaced households in Al Doriheimi district.
3. New waves of heavy rain were expected to hit many of Al Hudayadh and Hajjah districts such as Abs and Aslam in Hajjah, Al Qanawis and Az Zuhrah in Al Hudaydah

## Main Needs

1. Urgent response for households under threatened of eviction or affected by fire.
2. Accelerate replenishment S/NFIs stocks to face any new waves of displacement or floods in Al Hudaydah and Hajjah.

## Success story: flood response in Kushar district, Sept 2020 district

Mr. Muhammad is a handicapped, 70 years old , head of the family, who was displaced with his family from Haradh district to live in open area that exposed to torrential flood and fluctuations in weather within Kusher district in Hajjah governorate, the family consists of three individuals, two of them are disabled and the third are suffering from a mental illness. In coordination with the Shelter Cluster and by support the contingency stock (YHF), IOM and DRC, AOBWC has responded for this family by providing NFIs and EESKs to contribute in family safe life.



## Updates/Challenges :

1. The fund limitation in Sana'a hub of 2021 will effect the response of the people in concern.
2. Limited partner's availability and capacity/resources in Albydah Gov which causes lack of information and response in Al Bayda governments.
3. The low level of principled technical monitoring and . reporting of UNHCR IPs.
4. Rellocation of Soaq Alil site to Kharef site. Regarding to the services everything almost ready TS have been prepared transportation fee is available. The only issue is that SCMCHA has one condition to approve the relocation which include the IDPs to the food assistant of WFP programme.

## Immediate priorities:

1. For flood preparedness partners should have maintenance kits to be provided that include tools for maintaining the Affected shelter along with the plastic sheet...etc.
2. Distribute winterization kits for the people in need before the end of the winter season.
3. Partners should prepare the sandbags assistance in regards to flood mitigation impact.

## Success Story

We were living in Almalla neighborhood Sa'ada city with my family, our source of living was a small store in Sa'ada market. My house and other three houses were ruined by airstrike from aliens. This painful incident affected me a lot and my family. My children became afraid of anything. One of my children hearing has been very light because of the missile explosion. My mother passed away a month later. Norwegian Refugee Council has constructed to us a transitional shelter after we were living in poor shelter.



## Updates/Challenges :

The recent conflict resulted in 1517 families' as reported by Ex.U displaced movement between Feb 6 to Feb 21. Further, IDPs who live among host community are forced to move to IDPs sites due to lack of response to those IDPs who live out side collective sites.

Main challenges are as follow:

1. Lack of partners with SNFI projects.
2. Lack of coordination between LNGO's and Shelter cluster
3. Absence of cash for rent projects.
4. Absence of integrated response.
5. Lack of partners who target IDPs among host community.

## Immediate priorities:

- Partners are recommended to wide their area of interventions and maximize their stock.
- Partners are recommended to include targeting IDPs who live with in the host community in there upcoming plans.
- Other clusters are recommended to have integrated response plan.
- Advocate partners and donors to have continue SNFI projects.

## Success Story

IDPs are the most affected group of the conflicts. They been forced to leave their homes livelihoods and properties. There large group of IDPs who live outside IDPs hosting sites, this group suffers from lack of response to them we recommend to targeted them with NFIs and rental project.
