Discussion/inputs on the proposed RCG Camp Futures Technical Working Group

Shelter Cluster members

The participants, especially UNHCR, DRC, and LWF led the discussion on the proposed RCG Camps Future document for shelter inputs by the cluster members.

In the meeting, hard copies of the draft Camps future paper from DRC and the comments from the National Shelter-CCCM-NFI Clusters Coordinator were shared and read by the cluster member participants.

It was informed that the paper was mainly developed by DRC and IRC to forecast future of IDP camps in RS and serious health related issues at least for duration of 6 months in perspective of sectors: Shelter, CCCM-NFI, Health, WASH and Food security, Education and Development as well.

However, members consist this proposal should be long term consideration and not be in short dead line and due to its natures and factors in existing and recent.

The members also point out improvement in technical perspective as to meet needs of increased population in camp and host communities, prevention of fire and vector health related issue and ventilation. The initial estimate of improving current shelter design would cost over 10 million of USD and more areas requirement of 4 times of existing camps area.

The big challenges remain are such as Protection-GBV, Livelihood and segregation of communities.

The IDP camps for possible potential of return-relocation would be Pauktaw, Myebon, Rathedaung, Kyaukphyu, Kyauktaw and Ramree.

The durable solutions for the IDP/camps is a tall order and strong advocacy will be needed for all stakeholders such as Gov't, UN/INGOs as well as international community and donor organizations.

Agenda 3	Brief agency updates on shelter activities (LH repair and reconstruction) in the IDP camps
UNHCR	UNHCR share reconstruction of total 75 long houses in 3 camps with time frame of from Dec 2016 to Mar 2017 as follow; Sittwe: OTG-S, Reconstruction of total of 19 long houses with 2 contractors. Pauktaw: NC-2 & STM NC-2: Reconstruction of total of 45 long houses with 2 contractors. STM: Reconstruction of 11 long houses with 1 contractor.
DRC	DRC share shelter repair activity as follow; Pauktaw: in KNP, resuming of repair for 25 long houses of SLF group. Sittwe: in STMG, ongoing of 40 long houses repairing.
LWF	LWF share shelter repair and reconstruction as follow; Sittwe: Shelter repair 100% completed in KDK, BSRA and 150 rooms repairing is nearly completed. Pauktaw: in NC-2: LWF has reconstruction of 20 long houses completed and plan to reconstruct 8 more. In ANYI: Reconstruction of 20 long houses completed 8 and all would be completed in end of December.
MAUK	MAUK shared as follow; Sittwe: in OTG-N, reconstruction of 2 long houses 100% completed. In STMG, repair of 3 long houses on-going.
RSG	UNHCR shared RGS's reconstruction of 30 long houses found nearly 100% completed in STMG.
