It is widely recognized that effective shelter and settlements programs must consider the livelihoods of people affected by humanitarian crises. Livestock are a crucial livelihoods asset for disaster and crisis-affected communities. The rapid assistance, protection and rebuilding of key livestock assets can accelerate and enhance the sustainability of recovery programs.

Based on the Livestock Emergency Guidelines and Standards (LEGS), the Shelter and Livestock Training will explain what the LEGS handbook is and how to use the tools within it. The training will consist of two parts: *1. Introduction to LEGS and shelter* and *2. Using LEGS tools in a case study*.

***The training will provide participants with basic knowledge to better integrate livestock related activities into shelter and settlement programming, strategies and coordination.***
