1. Review of the last cluster meeting APs

2. The MSNA in oPt will aim to achieve the following objectives:

1. Directly **inform the 2022 Humanitarian Needs Overview (HNO) and Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP)** in oPt through the provision of comprehensive, multi-sectoral household data;
2. Provide a detailed inter-sectoral analysis of the magnitude and severity of humanitarian needs among crisis-affected populations in oPt, to **support the calculation of sectoral and inter-sectoral People in Need and severity figures.**
3. **Identify vulnerable population groups and geographic areas with the most acute needs**, to inform assistance targeting and response planning efforts; and
4. **Inform development assistance planning and relevant SDG (Sustainable Development Goals) targets** by providing analysis findings on vulnerability, risk and resilience profiles.

2. Multi-Sectorial Needs Assessment update (MSNA) at oPt level

- The 2021 MSNA is a nationwide, household-level assessment conducted by REACH
- Conducted across the entirety of the oPt (e.g. the West Bank, including East Jerusalem, and Gaza Strip).
- All survey data will be collected by PCBS
- All clusters provided their inputs for the questions and indicators
- Next steps: training of the enumerators, data collection and analysis by 8 August

3. Update about Gaza needs, responses and gaps.

Shelter Cluster Flash Appeal (3months):

Cluster requirements (19 Mil, people targeted (54,500)

- **Sector Objectives**
- Supporting access to adequate temporary shelter solutions to displaced persons through the provision of cash programmed assistance, alongside support to host families.
- Undertaking urgent repair of uninhabitable homes to reduce the displacement caseload, relieve pressure on the growing need for homes and reduce risks for host and hosted families.
- Undertaking selective repair for partially damaged homes and adaptation interventions for the most vulnerable groups, including female head-of-household, elderly, and PWDs.
- Provision of essential NFIs.

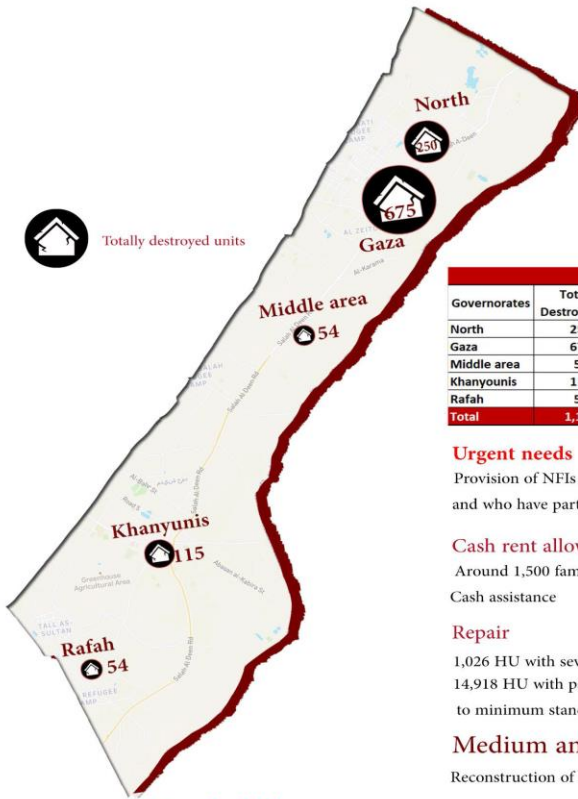
• **Priority Activities**

- Cash rental allowances of US\$200-250 per family per month for a reasonable period of time, and a one-off cash reintegration package of \$500 per family, to over 2,000 displaced families, with totally destroyed or uninhabitable housing units.
- Cash repair assistance for 960 families with uninhabitable housing units to immediately reduce the displacement caseload and relieve pressure on the growing need for homes in Gaza. The average cash support of is set at \$5,000 per family.
- Cash assistance to 4,150 host and hosted families to reduce overcrowding and improve the living conditions, including shared facilities, such as toilets and kitchen, as well as privacy through modifying apartment's internal partition.
- Cash assistance for 5,000 particularly vulnerable families (FHH, elderly, PWD) for light repair of partially damaged homes and adaptation.
- Cash assistance for 11,000 displaced persons in urban displacement to buy NFIs and dignity kits.
- In-kind distribution of NFIs to 5,000 displaced persons.
- Cash assistance for shelter to assist at least 90 vulnerable refugee HHs in the West Bank



Escalation of hostilities - Gaza May 2021

Between 10 and 20 May 2021, the Gaza Strip witnessed another significant hostility in which many buildings were destroyed and thousands of people were internally displaced. According to the information verified by Shelter Cluster based on figures from MoPWH, MoSD, UNRWA and other cluster partners at height of the conflict over 117000 individuals were fled their homes due to the intensive air strikes and the destruction of the houses including 77,000 were seeking safe places at UNRWA schools and the remaining were at host community and informal shelters. Additionally, the Israeli air strikes in Gaza left 1,148 destroyed housing units and 1,026 housing units have severely damaged and approximately 14,918 housing units with different levels of damage. **This dashboard summarizes the needs, responses and gaps in shelter**

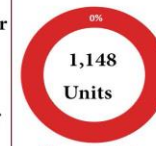
