4. key elements of the WB mass demolition contingency plan.

- **Scenario Description:**
 - One or multiple mass demolition(s), confiscation(s) and/or forced evictions, resulting in the displacement of 50- 500 people (10-100 HHs), located in up to 5 different communities with a time frame of six weeks. Humanitarian access to one or more of the affected community(ies) will be restricted by Israeli forces.
- **Coordination**
 - This contingency plan will be implemented under the West Bank ICCG, with the establishment of ad hoc local coordination groups depending on the geographic location of mass demolitions. This ad-hoc group will be reporting to the ICCG-core group. However, all strategic decisions will be made by the ICCG.
 - ICCG Coordinator to send out email to ICCG core group, who will identify key partners to attend these meeting.
 - Coordination with governorate office / local authorities will be led by OCHA.
 - All advocacy initiatives will be coordinated through the AWG mechanism.

4. key elements of the WB mass demolition contingency plan.

- **Assessments**

- Initial post demolition assessment will be led by OCHA applying the SOPs for ICCG Response to Demolitions in the oPt.
- Technical assessment will be carried out by the relevant cluster(s) partners, including the risk assessment and analysis .

key elements of the WB mass demolition contingency plan.

- **Access**
- Humanitarian operational partners are required to communicate with the Access Coordination Unit (ACU) to coordinate the delivery of humanitarian aid into the community(ies) with access restrictions as imposed by the IL authorities.
- In case of restrictions of humanitarian aid, UN to support INGOS/NGOs in access and/or provision of services and aid.
- Community preferences identified earlier will include possible alternative locations for aid delivery in case of impeded humanitarian access to the community.
- In case of access restriction AWG will take the lead on advocacy.
