

Action Against Hunger Achievements in Shelters Sensitive Related Activities

COVID-19 Response & PWD Rehabilitation Works

COVID-19 Shelter related activities

During 2020, and in response to the pandemic, AAH has implemented several COVID-19 Shelter related activities:

- 1) More than 2100 household in 6 governorates benefited from the distribution of hygiene and sanitization kits at household level.
- 2) 14 COVID-19 isolation centres in WB refugee camps and MoH centres benefited from the distribution of bedding and dignity kits.
- 3) 13 elderly, PWD and GBV victims Care shelters benefited from the distribution of hygiene, disinfection and medical kits
- 4) 150 households in H2 area received hygiene and disinfection kits as a response to their special needs



Shelter Rehabilitation for PWD

- During 2020, AAH has implemented several projects under the OPT fund.
- These projects aim to improve access to adequate shelter spaces for the vulnerable families living in extreme conditions in Area-C as well as most vulnerable families and marginalized groups in Hebron-H2 restricted neighbourhoods
- AAH focuses on targeting families who have one or more family member(s) with a disability, through adapting shelter spaces, entrances and structure to be functional to accommodate the need of the person with the disability

Under this project, the intervention has targeted PWDs experiencing multi-dimensional vulnerabilities related to high security and protection risks and inadequate shelter spaces, putting them at high risk of displacement and danger.

Actions taken:

- 1) Upgrading the shelter status of the most vulnerable families in the Jordan Valley.
- 2) Adapting shelter spaces to be more functional and accessible for PWDs in the targeted communities, via adapting stairs, entrances, latrines, and shelter surroundings for PWDs' use

This project has targeted 7 communities in different governorates, with 8 PWDs shelter, and a total of 44 beneficiaries.



OPT-19/DDA-3482/SA2/SNFI/INGO/13963

AAH aims to upgrade the residential shelters of the targeted suffering from harsh weather conditions and man-made disasters resulting in protection risks and aiming to decrease the vulnerability of households including one or more family member(s) with a disability in H2 area. The activities include The adaptation / rehabilitation of 10 prioritized shelters in Hebron H2 area, targeting families who have one or more family member(s) with a disability, through adapting shelter spaces, entrances and structure to be functional to accommodate the need of the person with the disability. intervention's objective is to improve targeted families' access to more adequate and functional shelter spaces.

The number of HH benefited from this project was 10, with total of 67 beneficiaries.
