



Highlights

1. Since January 2018, more than 75.000 people were affected by natural events: mostly floods, landslides and intense winds, due to the rainy season. The main areas of affectation are Ngozi and Rutana, because of field destruction.
2. The most urgent needs detected during the multi-sector evaluations were: emergency shelters and rental support, non-food item (NFI) kits, WASH and food.
3. Long term needs detected: durable shelter solutions, seeds and agricultural support. A Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) strategy is highly recommended for the main flooded areas.

Sector strategy and objectives

1st phase: Completed in Bujumbura Mairie and Bujumbura Rural. No intervention in Makamba.

The emergency assistance has focused on the most vulnerable people affected by natural disasters, whose houses (owned or rental) were completely destroyed.

2nd phase: To be started

Need for continued support for those whose house was partially destroyed for its rehabilitation and in order to find durable solutions within 6 months for the ones receiving rental support, emergency tents, or staying with host families.

3rd phase: To be started

Disaster Risk Reduction activities and advocacy, for prevention and mitigation of the risk in areas prone to flooding in Burundi.

Context

On 27 April, IOM, the UN Migration Agency's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) team raised an alert response about flash floods in Bujumbura Rural region of Gatumba following heavy rainfall in the area. Gatumba region is prone to flooding mainly due to overflows from River Rusizi.

Data obtained by the DTM in April 2018 provides the total number of internally displaced persons (IDPs) present throughout Burundi's 18 provinces, the number of emergency related displacements occurring during the month and the reasons for displacement.

Challenges of the response

1. Limited response capacity and lack of specialized human resources.
2. Unable to respond in Makamba (0% reached) for the sector partners due to the distance from the capital and the issues listed in point 1.
3. Sector stock emptied. No capacity to respond to future emergencies.
4. Recurrent emergency. Every 6 months the Rusizi river and Tanganyika Lake overflow.
