

Overview

The Shelter and NFIs Cluster, led by UNHCR, coordinates the efforts of 145 total member organizations of which 40 are active. The Cluster addresses the coordination of emergency Shelter and NFI needs and promotes household and community resilience. The Cluster supports people in need within displaced, hosting and non-displaced populations by ensuring that the different modalities of interventions (in-kind, non-conditional/conditional cash or voucher) abide by the do-not-harm principle.

Shelter/NFI Situation

The CCCM Cluster's IDP Tracking reported an estimate of 491,679 people to have been newly displaced in May, June and July 2019. Dana and Salqin sub-districts have been extremely affected by the displacement and only a few organisations have the capacity to provide SNFI assistance in Salqin due to access issues. The SNFI Cluster members reported having reached almost 395,353 individuals with NFI, 46,540 individuals with emergency shelters (mainly tents) and 19,699 individuals with shelter repair/rehabilitation between May and July. Many organisations had to rely on the Contingency stock as they have distributed most of the stock in May and June. Therefore, SNFI and CCCM Clusters have greatly increased the provision of shelter and NFI through the contingency stock they manage in collaboration with IOM. Between May and July, 5,200 tents and 16,329 NFI kits were released reaching 123,974 individuals. This is more than what was released during the preceding two years.

Main Cluster Activities

- Publication of the Arabic version of the Shelter Rehabilitation Guidelines (English version already available)
- NWS and WoS Shelter/NFI assessment (data collection)
- Shelter Rehabilitation Workshop to analyse challenges and share good practices
- First joint SNFI/Cash Working Group meetings to strengthen the cash/voucher response and harmonise the different response modalities.
- Preparation of the SCHF Reserve Allocation
- Selection of a new Strategic Advisory Group
- SAG meeting and validation of the SNFI Cluster Action Plan (Attachment)

Main Gap

Cluster members are looking for additional funding to continue providing Shelter and NFI assistance as the emergency continues. Emergency shelter remains the number one priority to address the needs for new IDPs.

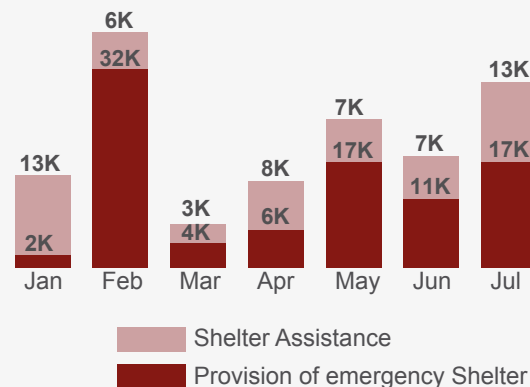
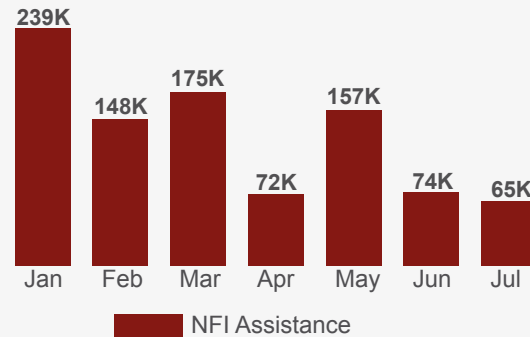

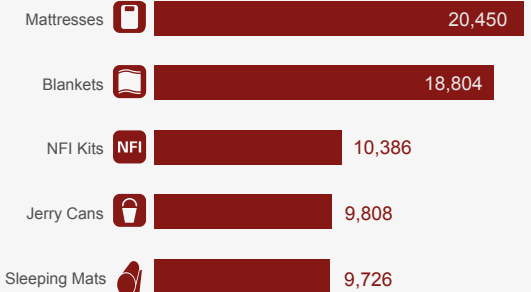
