

## Overview

The Shelter and NFIs Cluster, led by UNHCR, coordinates the efforts of 145 total member organizations of which 47 are active. The Cluster addresses the coordination of emergency Shelter and NFI needs and promotes household and community resilience. The Cluster supports people in need within displaced, hosting and non-displaced populations by ensuring that the different modalities of interventions (in-kind, non-conditional/conditional cash or voucher) abide by the do-not-harm principle.

## Shelter/NFI Situation

The Shelter/NFI situation remains very difficult in June even if the number of new IDPs has decreased compare to May. HNAP reported 34,553 new IDPs in Dana sub-district, 10,769 in Salqin and 9,617 in Idleb. The partners keep reporting that most of IDPs need NFI. Many organisations have already used their NFI stocks and need top up to keep responding to the needs. The organisations providing shelter assistance informed the cluster about the difficulties to get authorization from land owners to stay on their land. Almost 17.000 IDPs moved to abandoned buildings. 30 SNFI cluster partners have reported SNFI activities (completed and planned) to respond to the ongoing emergency since the beginning of May. 21 partners have requested 17,115 kits NFI from the contingency stock and are responding to the needs. 12,982 kits have already been released. The Contingency Stock has been replenished (THF funding) with 7,500 NFI kits. The cluster members reported recently that they have the capacity to respond to NFI needs for 259.000 individuals (including 18.000 NFI kits in the pipeline).

## Main Cluster Activities

- Analysis of the Contingency Stock challenges in order to improve the timeliness of the response.
- Winterisation After Action Review Workshop: The SNFI cluster, UN agencies, NGOs, INGOs and donors actively contributed to the analysis of the last winter response and prepared recommendations for next year.
- WoS SNFI Cluster Workshop
- HLP Working Group meeting. The HLP WG and the SNFI Cluster decided to organise HLP meetings only for organisations implementing shelter programmes.

## Main Gap

Around two third of new IDPs choose not to go to camps. HNAP estimates that 6% moved to abandoned buildings. Several organization are willing to implement new shelter repair or upgrade project but cannot because of lack of funding.

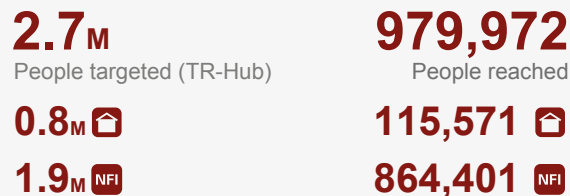

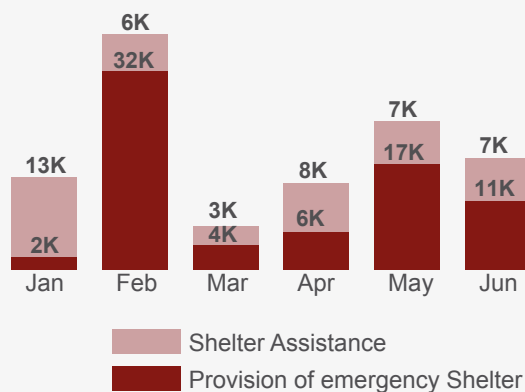
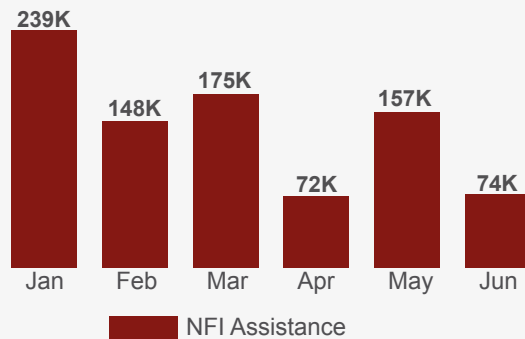

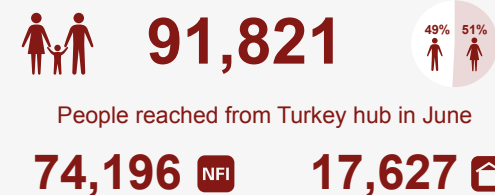
### Turkey Hub - Cumulative (Jan - Jun)



### Total individuals reached per month



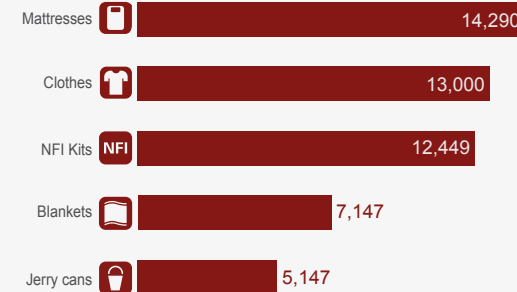

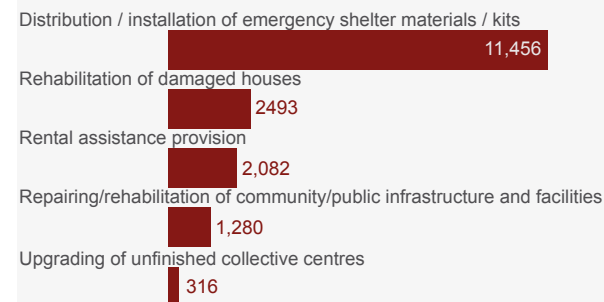

### Shelter: Beneficiaries reached by Sub-Activity



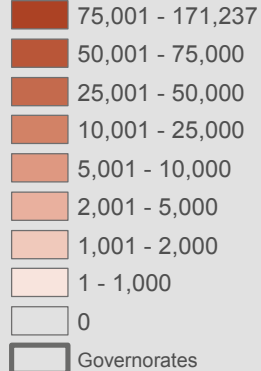

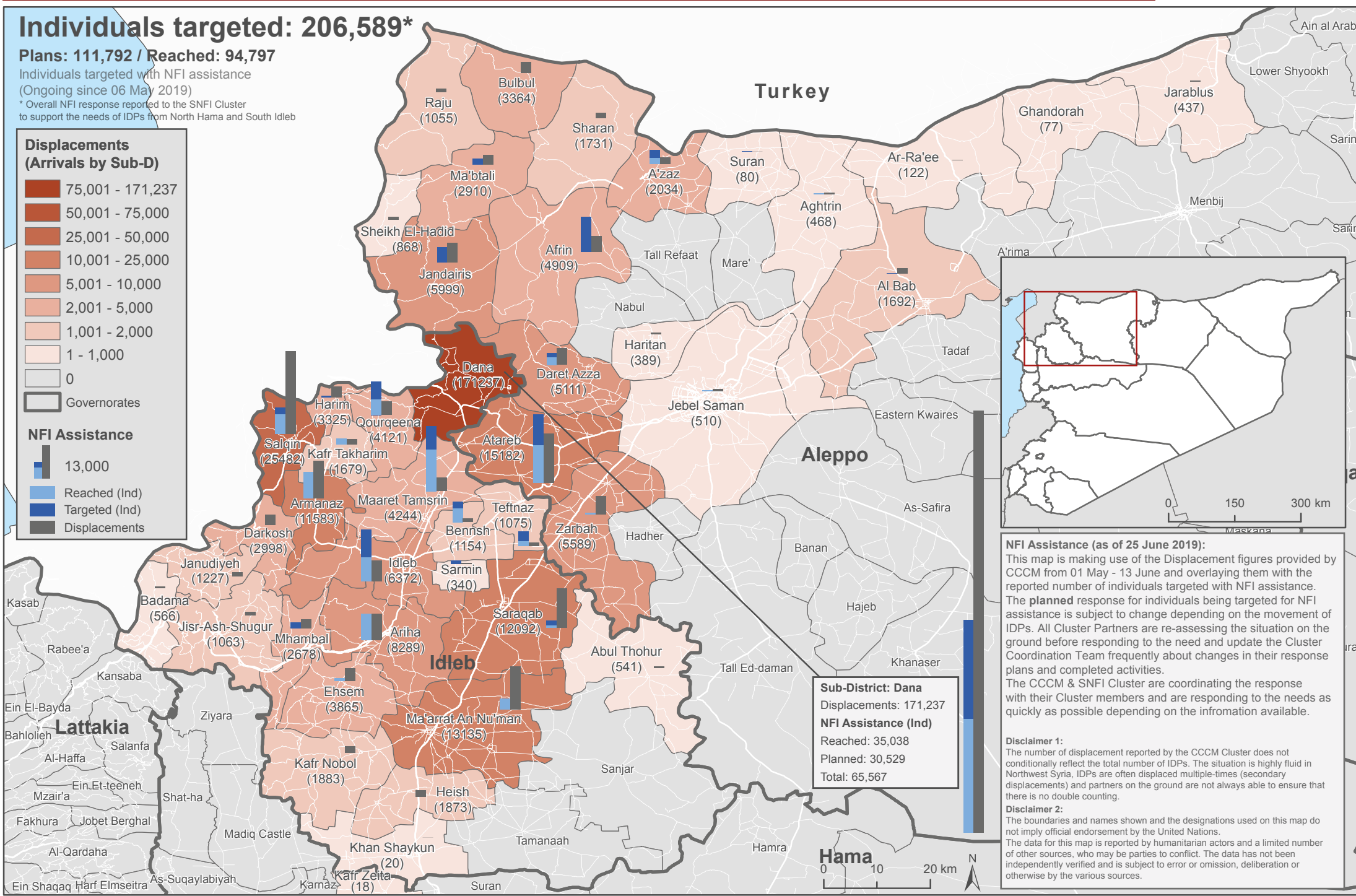
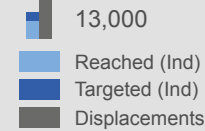
