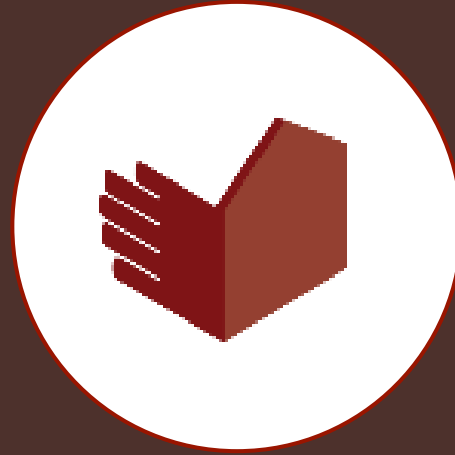

### **Joint Rapid Need Assessment**

The Joint Rapid Needs Assessment Taskforce was established in July 2020 in response to requests from key humanitarian stakeholders working on the Libyan response to fill information gaps relating to the identification of basic needs following a crisis. The JRNA task force (PS and SNFI represented the Sectors) has developed:

- JRNA SOP
- JRNA questionnaire.

### **Activity Info**

From August 2020 partners are requested to report on Activity info – Kobo platform  
July 2020 data 4 W should be reported on Activity Info at the possible extend

Deadlines:

- The 5<sup>th</sup> of the month for partners
- The 15<sup>th</sup> for sectors review
- The 16<sup>th</sup> the system is locked for processing

## **ISCG**

Focus on HNO/HRP process (next slide)

Mapping the sector capacity for HNO/HRP process

Sirt preparedness – endorsed and circulated the last live document

The de-confliction document and guidance will be circulated by OCHA to inform partners and sectors on exceptions for access to continue humanitarian operations given changing curfew measures.

The Centre of Competence on Humanitarian Negotiation (CCHN) offered a tailored workshop by the end of October for frontline negotiations and open for partners.

### HNO Narrative report key questions

- changes in the context since the last HNO
- underlying factors driving people's needs
- impacts of the crisis in terms of people's ability to cover their essential needs or access essential goods and services
- coping strategies of people to mitigate, resist and /or recover
- key changes in humanitarian needs (scale or type of needs) in the last 12 months
- People in Need (PiN) for the sector, severity analysis of needs by geographic location and population groups, age and gender.
- How will humanitarian sectoral needs change over the next 12 months and assumptions
- Identify monitoring data, indicators and other information the sector will regularly collect and analyze and share for joint inter-sectoral monitoring.



NOTE: The Shelter/NFI Sector had requested a total of \$7 million in the 2020 HRP. Sector partners have not received funding at all, as of June 2020, according to the Financial Tracking Service (FTS). This means that there is a funding gap of 100%.

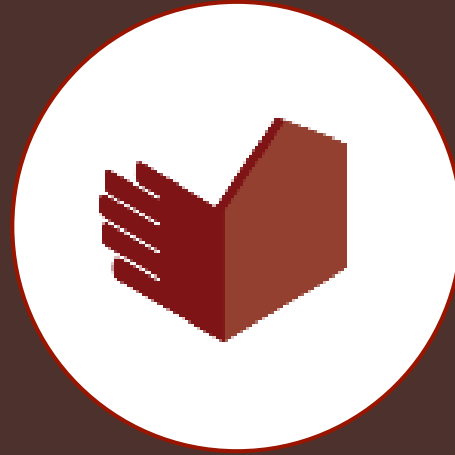
